



Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

We have been on quite a journey together through this Lenten season as we journey with Jesus on the way to the cross. We have been considering the crossroads that we face in life. Crossroads are choice points where we face various issues in life and must make a choice or a decision which will have ongoing consequences. We were blessed to consider these through the eyes of various Biblical people and the particular circumstances that they faced.

For instance, imagine having to be in Pilate's position. He didn't ask to be put in a position of having to determine what to do with Jesus. The Jewish authorities placed this situation in his lap. He was at a crossroads. He had to make choices and decisions. God has graciously preserved this account and many others for us to know and to learn from.

Our Holy Week worship will continue to follow this theme; At the Crossroads. Here is a synopsis:

Palm Sunday (April 5th) - Suffering

In this service we remember that when Jesus enters Jerusalem for the last time amid palm branches and praises, he knows the suffering that awaits him there, yet he does not turn back. In the observance of this remarkable day, we come to see as well that though we know suffering is part of being a follower of Christ, we must carry on for him. We will hear from the Apostle James to help prepare us in approaching our own crossroads of suffering.

Maundy Thursday (April 9th) - Forgiveness

In this service we remember that when Jesus institutes the Lord's Supper he grants forgiveness to his disciples through the bread and wine; informing them that in, with, and under the elements he offers his very body and blood sacrificed for them and us also. When we receive the Lord's Supper we receive that forgiveness and in turn are empowered to forgive others.

Good Friday (April 10th) - Death

In this service we are reminded that when Jesus is on the cross, he submits himself to the power of death and does not turn away from it. We, too, must face death when it comes. We are powerless to turn away from death but blessed in believing the victory won over it through God in the flesh, Jesus Christ, and the blessing of eternal life that is now in the possession of every believer.

Easter Sunrise (April 12th) - Life

In this service we recall that after the risen Jesus appears to Mary Magdalene, she responds by telling the disciples, "I have seen the Lord!" We who know that our Redeemer lives have the honor to also share that news with others.

I hope that you are able to attend the sunrise service (6:00 am) and one of the later of two services on Easter Sunday. The theme of the two later services is: "It's only for the Weekend!" I have an interesting story to share from Lindy's and my journey to the Holy Land. Near one of the locations of where they believe Jesus' tomb may have been we heard the cutest story with such a wonderful true meaning. I hope that you can come and hear it.

We are so incredibly blessed to live in the fulfillment of Jesus' death and resurrection and can say with the Apostle Paul as he quotes the prophet Isaiah; "Death has been swallowed up in victory." Where, O death is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?" And, with Paul and fellow believers, we can strive to always "stand firm, giving ourselves fully to the work of the Lord." (1 Corinthians 15:54b, 58a).

What a blessed life to live in the security of everlasting life!

It's hard to believe that we're already entering the home stretch of another school year! Spring Break is in the rearview mirror and summer break appears on the horizon.

Rehearsals have already begun for the spring musical, "101 Dalmatians". The elementary students are learning lines, songs and choreography. Preschool students are learning some songs and will provide lots of cuteness as Dalmatian puppies. Be sure the evening of April 24 is set aside on your calendar to come see this performance in the school gym.



Come see this delightful 30 minute play featuring performances from all ages, Preschool through 6th Grade.


In a loving home in the city of London, canine parents Pongo and Perdita happily raise their Dalmatian puppies until the monstrous

Note from the Editor: I am always amazed at the ways God communicates with me. When I was much younger, I struggled with knowing God's voice and to be honest, I sometimes still do. Satan is very practiced at imitating God's voice, but if I really listen, there are always clues when it's not God's voice. God doesn't change, so He wouldn't tell me to break His commandments by hurting someone physically or emotionally. God wouldn't tell me to be untruthful, hateful or to hold a grudge. That is Satan's voice. There are times that God puts words into my mouth and as I speak them, I hear His words. There are times that I am guided through many obstacles, not knowing what to expect. When I reach a certain point in my journey, a point that God has pre-arranged, I receive His message. Sometimes He speaks to me through my daily devotions or Bible readings. A while back, a loved one began to struggle with changes that were made in their employment. The job was no longer the job that they were contracted to do. This person was feeling spiritually attacked. I heard of a possible job opening that I thought they would be perfect for, a real dream come true, in my opinion. I suggested they make inquires, I told the prospective employer that I knew of a candidate for their job opening. Later that week, the Bible reading for my devotions was the Old Testament story of Balaam. I poured over the verses once, twice, three times. Balaam asked God if he should go with Balak's men. God says no. Balaam sends them away, but the implication is that Balak needs to make it worth Balaam's while to go with them. A more important group of ministers would return offering to make Balaam wealthy if he comes with them and does what Balak is requesting, which is to curse the Israelites. Once again, Balaam asks God and this time God says he can go, but God is angry. I didn't understand this. One of the explanations I found, through research, said that God wanted to bless Israel through Balaam, but Balaam was too self-centered and vain to be a good conduit for God's plan. Balaam needed to be transparent and realize that he was powerless, a mere pawn in God's hands. God wanted the important ministers to witness what He had in store for Balaam and in so doing add to Balaam's humiliation, breaking Balaam, making him a usable conduit for God's blessings. Another explanation suggested Balaam was trying to manipulate God to his own benefit. As I laid in bed that night, I wondered if I was a Balaam, trying to benefit myself under the guise of helping my loved one, trying to manipulate God's will to match my will. I folded my hands and asked for God's forgiveness. I had heard God speaking to me through the Words of the Bible and even though I profess to Trust God, it was obvious to me that in this situation, I had become a meddler. I was reminded that Trusting in God means I need to get out of His way, stop interfering with His work. I don't know how my loved one's situation will turn out, but God does. He has a plan and I pray that His will be done as I once again put my trust in Him and get out of His way. May you be an open vessel to receive God's blessings and a pleasing conduit through which His blessings flow to those around you. "But blessed is the man who trusts in the LORD, whose confidence is in him." Jeremiah 17:7

What is your favorite Easter hymn? Is it "Jesus Christ is Risen Today", or "I Know That My Redeemer Lives", or "He's Risen, He's Risen?" I always love the music of Easter, as we sing together of the joy of Easter, as the Body of Christ. The songs tell the story of the ultimate miracle — the achievement of our forgiveness by Jesus' death on the cross and His victory over death in His rising on Easter. Colossians 3:16 says, "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing each other in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God." I look forward to celebrating our Risen Savior this Easter with you all, my beloved church family!

You are invited to hear Carol Halter, LCMS missionary in Hong Kong, speak to the senior group at Immanuel Loveland at 1 pm on Friday April 24.

Deaconess Carol Lee Halter has served as an evangelistic missionary among the Chinese people in Hong Kong since 1981. From 1969 to 1981, Carol served as a missionary with the Chinese Lutheran Church of the Holy Spirit in San Francisco, Calif. For three and a half years before that, she was a volunteer missionary in Hong Kong.

Carol does humanitarian, evangelistic and educational work among Chinese people of all ages who live in Hong Kong. Her prayer is that all Chinese people will hear the saving Gospel of Jesus Christ — especially from each other. Fluent in Cantonese, Carol nurtures and trains Chinese people to grow in Christ and to share the Gospel. She does this by holding educational and evangelism seminars and Bible classes, and by counseling individuals.

After her deaconess internship and her 1965 graduation from Valparaiso University as a Lutheran deaconess, Carol committed her life to ministry to Chinese people. She received her master of divinity degree from Hong Kong Concordia Theological Seminary in 1984.


