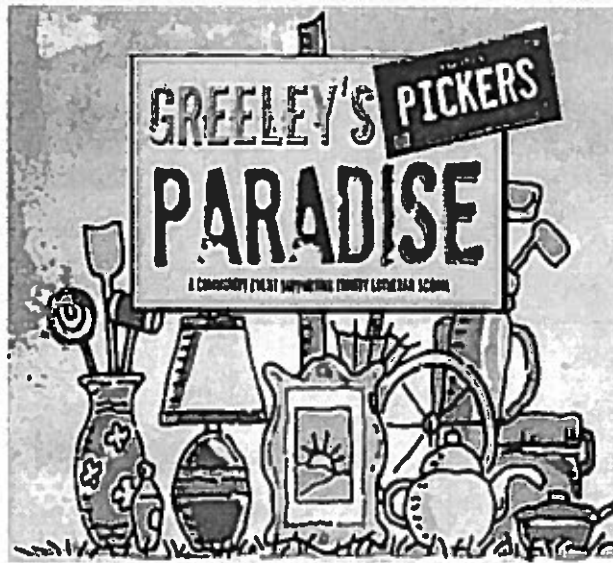

A Note from the Editor —I had a dream about loved ones of mine showing up at my house. I was so excited to spend time with them, but in an instant, they changed their mind and went instead to a meeting place, suggesting I could meet them there. They left without me, just drove off leaving me standing there. The feeling of abandonment crept over me as I watched them drive away without me. I loved them so much and they didn’t seem to care about my feelings at all. I was glad it was just a dream, but it left me feeling unsettled. I wondered if there was more to the dream than just an uncomfortable feeling to be pushed aside. The Old Testament has many accounts of people having dreams with messages. I went about my day, my routine, but wisps of the dream kept floating into my mind. In my dream, I arrived at the meeting place, once again excited to spend time with my loved ones, only to find it full of other people. My loved ones were mingling with everyone there, laughing, joking and such with different groups as they moved around the room. I was saddened that they did not acknowledge or introduce me. Suddenly, I was in a kitchen and I was frantically trying to prepare food in unfamiliar surroundings. Again by myself, I was “expected” to provide. Faces would pop in and tell me how much more my loved ones, loved each of them over me, it was a horrible feeling. Still shaken by the dream, I sat down to begin my devotions and I wondered.... Could God have given me a glimpse of how He feels? Do I show up at His house, but not really to see and spend time with Him? Do I not wait for Him to accompany me and leave without Him? Do I invite Him or just “expect” Him? When I am among others, do I acknowledge Him? Do I thank Him? Or do I “expect” Him to provide all that I want? Does God feel that I love the things and people of this world more than I love Him? Does He feel I have abandoned Him? Forgive me Lord. Let me come to Your house to see, hear and spend time with You, Lord, not check my watch as I mentally run through my list of things to do while you are speaking to me. May I invite you and bring you with me everywhere I go and in everything I do. Give me strength and courage to always acknowledge You, Your gifts and Your presence in every part of my life, everyday. May I give thanks and praise to You for providing all that I need, not because it is expected, but because of Your love for me. May my life and actions be a testament that I love You, Lord, first and most; that family and friends, although important, are gifts from You and are not more important than you. May You never feel that horrible feeling of abandonment. May all Your children cherish their time with You whether in Your house or in their hearts.

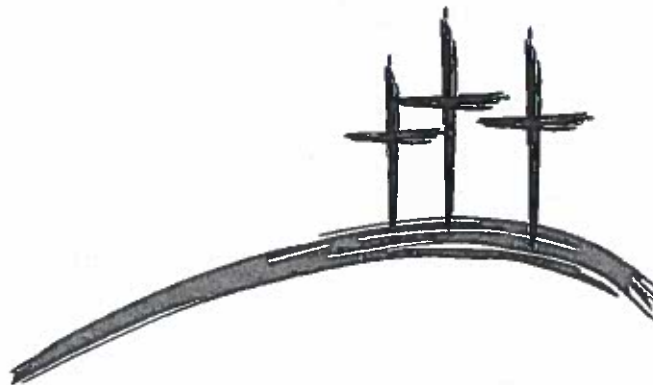

It's hard to believe that it was just over a year ago the "Clavir Family" made a life changing decision to move from California to Colorado. This enthusiastic family of three have made Trinity their home. The frequently asked question is "why?"

Before Pam and Ken met at Our Savior Lutheran Church in Arcadia, CA in the late 1980's, they were each searching for God's guidance and care as they rebuilt their private lives. God provided with an added bonus of not only a best friend, but a life partner. God is awesome!

Ken was born in Chandler, AZ, but was raised in California. He completed his undergrad and graduate education at Concordia University in Irvine. Ken, Pam, and Elaine regularly attend the 8 am service and Bible Study that follows. All three are loving their new life in Greeley and raise their hands in praise to God as the adventure continues.....

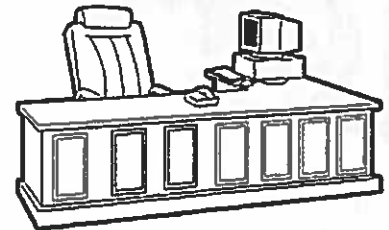

As you know, we have been trying a "blended" service since the first Sunday of June. We handed out surveys each Sunday to solicit your opinions. We also sent out the same survey in the last newsletter. Thank you so much to all of you who gave us completed survey instruments. We received 136 of them.

Pastor, the Elders and I reviewed them all. There were some great suggestions for our worship, and some of these have already been implemented.

We also looked at the attendance and offerings for each of the Sundays in this trial. Our analysis and discussion led us to the decision to go back to our previous two services (at 8:00 and 10:30) starting August 7. The Bible Study groups, conducted by Pastor Allmann, Pastor Hesse, and Larry Whitney, will again be held between the services.

Since there were so many positive comments about this service we thought we should ask your opinion about trying this blended service again next summer. We will have an additional questionnaire for you to give us your final opinion. This questionnaire will be in the bulletin on July 31 and August 14. If you are not in church either one of those days, I would be happy to send you a questionnaire to complete for us.

Again, thank you for taking the time to tell us what you think.

Thank you to all of you who attended the Garms Family Concert on June 26. We thoroughly enjoyed this family's musical talent and the love of God they shared with us. We sent them on their way with a total donation from the church and from those present at the concert of \$659.

Please mark your calendars for the 2nd Saturday of each month. Peggy Peters and Kristi Sanderson are doing amazing work cleaning up around the church, and **they could sure use some help**. It is our church and school to care for, and we really can't afford to hire people to do these projects to keep it looking nice. Hope to see you on August 13! What does this mean?- Spending was \$29,009 more than money brought in.

Explanation of Financial Report

As you can see, we ended up the fiscal year just ended with a cash deficit just under \$30,000. The budget approved at the Voters Meeting in June of 2015 projected that we would have a cash deficit of around \$46,000. That on the surface would appear to be good news, however, a deficit is still just that. So, how were we able to spend more money than we took in? Well, we in essence borrowed it from ourselves. We took it from the extra money in our checking account, leaving us with only about \$5,000 in that account at the end of the year just completed.

I am sure your question now is what does this mean for the new fiscal year we are just starting. At the Voters Meeting in May a budget was approved that calls for a cash deficit of \$97,000. If we use our current savings account balance against that we are still left with a shortfall of \$52,000. Obviously, we do not want to do that. Our weekly offerings for the last month went from \$15,330 the first Sunday in June to \$7,400 the last Sunday in June. That "run rate" will cause a cash flow problem for us.

So, now is the time to ask for God's help; and to ask you, the members of this congregation, for your help. We have a lot of good things happening at Trinity. Our school is fully staffed, the preschool is full, people have a "good feel " about them, and for the most part, all of our Boards are fully staffed with volunteers. Our Sunday Services are filled with blessings from the Holy Spirit, through the messages from Pastor Hafeman, and the Bible Studies. We have a lot to accomplish to keep our ministries at Trinity moving in a positive direction.

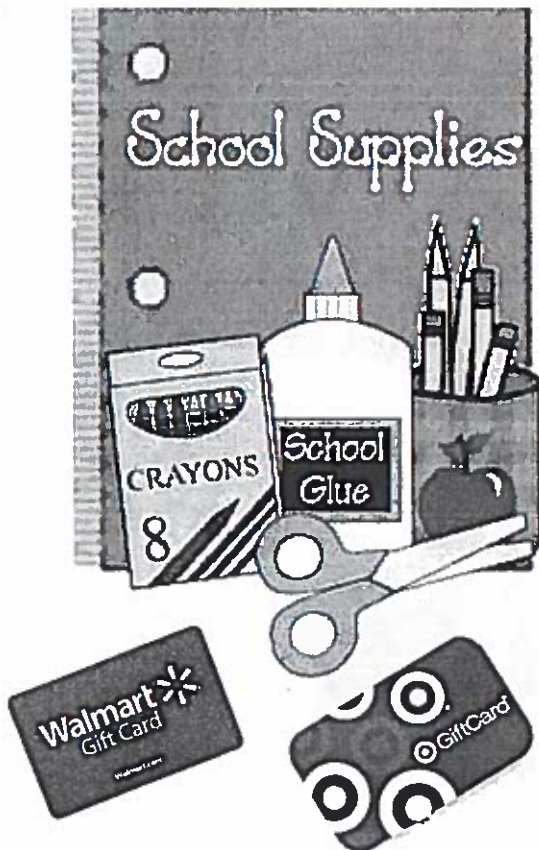

THANK GOD YOU'RE SAFE

Yes, it's great to be alive – spiritually alive in Christ, filled with a living hope as heirs of God. Yet being a Christian in this world is not a “piece of cake.” In fact, without the grace of God it would be impossible to remain a Christian.

The fact that we are alive, born again children of God, means that our life will be a struggle, a daily battle. The unholy three, the devil, the sinful world and our sinful flesh, gang up on us. They work hard to weaken and destroy our faith and our spiritual life.

“Our struggle,” Paul wrote, “is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the powers of this dark world and against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms.” Indeed, the devil's schemes can sometimes make us wonder whether it is so great to be alive. The fierce temptations we face, the sins we struggle against make us wonder, “How can I ever win? How can I hope to remain a believing child of God against such odds?”

One thing is sure – if it came down to us against Satan, if it were only up to us and our own strength and will, the battle would be lost. Peter, for one, discovered that we cannot rely on our own powers.

But Peter himself here encourages us to know and to trust that we are safe. The unholy three – devil, world and flesh – cannot win the battle and steal our salvation from us. “Through faith you are shielded by God's power,” Peter tells us, from the present moment until the time when Jesus comes again to give us our inheritance of eternal glory.

Thank God for his mercy! It really is great to be alive in Christ, to know that our gracious God will not allow us to fall back into the hands of Satan and into spiritual and eternal death. He will shield us, guard and keep us till the last day.

But let's be sure that we don't miss two important words, “through faith.” God's promise does not give us the right to fall asleep and to neglect our faith and spiritual life. God keeps us in faith by his Spirit through the preaching of the gospel and the sacrament of the altar. As we faithfully use them, he keeps us; we will be safe.

Heavenly Father, guard and keep us so that the unholy three may not deceive us or lead us into false belief, despair and other great and shameful sins; and though we are tempted by them, enable us to overcome and win the victory, through our Lord Jesus Christ. Amen.

 - 4) Church entryway lights are installed and functioning

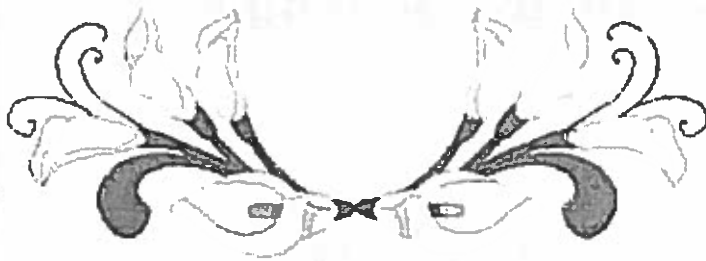
- The Board of Education Ministries

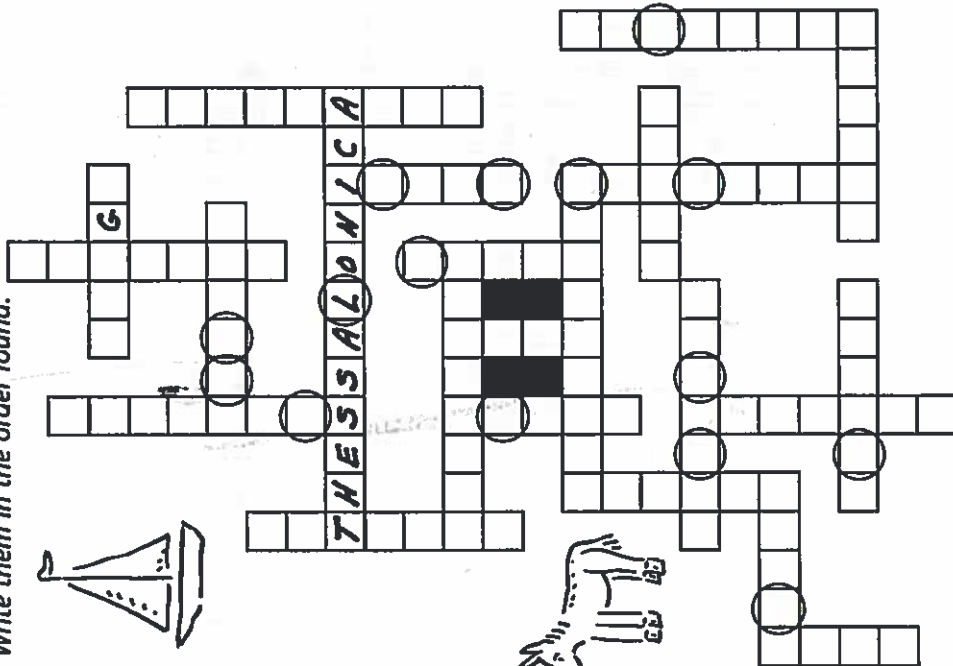
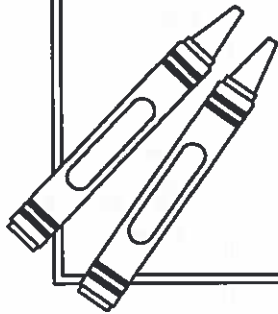
