From the Pastor's Desk

Happy New Year! Yes, the new year of 2017 is quickly approaching but I am speaking of the new Church Year which is introduced in the season of Advent. This season is a wonderful season filled with hope as we make preparations for our Lord's comings; Advent means coming. We look forward to having a huge birthday party for our Lord on Christmas Eve and Christmas Day as we remember His coming as a little babe in Bethlehem. We look beyond His first coming to when He will return in glory just as the disciples saw Him ascend into heaven nearly 2,000 years ago!

This season is a season of gifts and giving. We will consider several of the gifts that have been given by our Lord to His Church and continue to be given through our worship times together during the Midweek, Christmas Eve and Christmas Day services.

As the 500th anniversary of the Reformation approaches, let Martin Luther's beloved hymn "From Heaven Above" speak to you in our special Advent worship series. Each service in the 4-part series focuses on the divine gifts that come down to us through the birth of Jesus.

Service 1 (The Gift of Hope), based on Matthew 12:15-21, looks at how the people of Israel waited in hope for the promised Messiah, and how we now wait in hope for his return on the Last Day.

Service 2 (The Gift of Love), based on John 3:13-17, looks at how the steadfast love of God is revealed in the gift of his Son and how we, as the redeemed people of God, have the privilege of sharing his love with others.

Service 3 (The Gift of Peace), based on John 14:25-27, reminds us that we have peace with God through our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, and that we are now ambassadors of that peace to all the world.

We invite you to join us for a very special Christmas Eve service entitled, "The Gift of Joy," which is part of our "From Heaven Above" worship series. The good news of great joy that the angels sang of on that holy night and the joy the shepherds felt as they ran to the Babe of Bethlehem will be captured in Scripture, song, sermon and candlelight in this touching and celebratory service.

We invite you to join us for a very special Christmas Day service entitled, "The Gift of Glory," which is part of our "From Heaven Above" worship series. The gift of glory, found in the only-begotten Son of the Father born on earth from heaven above, will be captured in Scripture, word and song in this triumphant service of celebration.

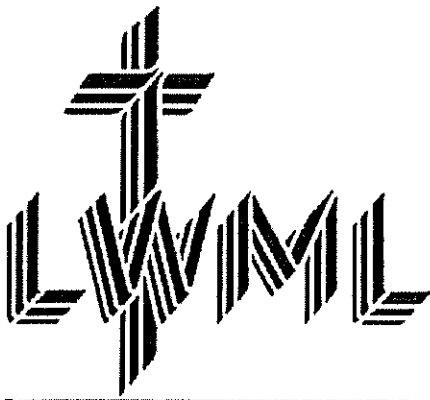

We would either go to a relative's home or have relatives to our house for Thanksgiving Day, but Christmas Day and New Year's Day were spent at home. 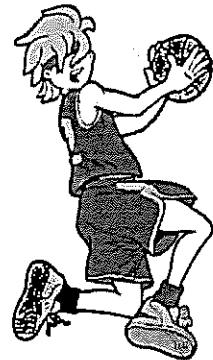
Children of God,

Our Pre K through 8th graders also invite you to join us for our Christmas Program, which they will present on Wednesday, December 21. Please look for more details in the newsletter.

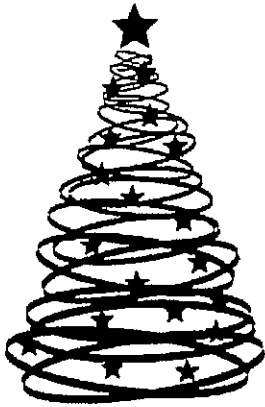

Bring your contributions to the school office before December 10th. Thank you.

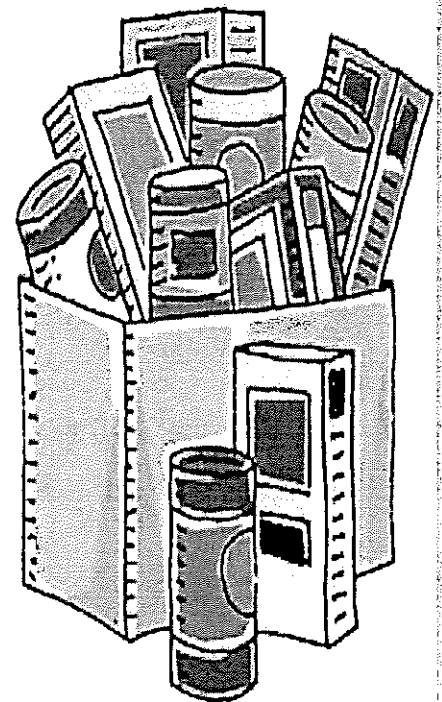
On December 19th and 20th, the "shops" will open and we would welcome your assistance minding the store and taking payments from the students or helping them wrap their presents.

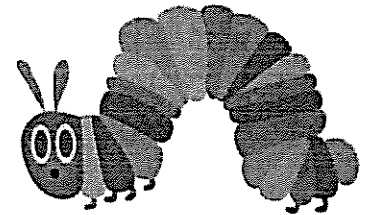

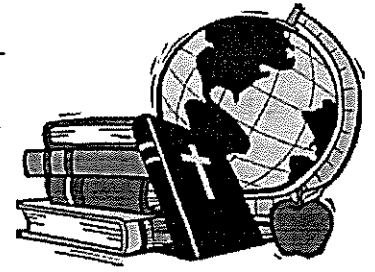

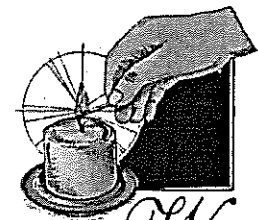
