Invite people to get involved in these ministries. Encourage women to join our local LWML group who meets every 1<sup>st</sup> Thursday of the month. 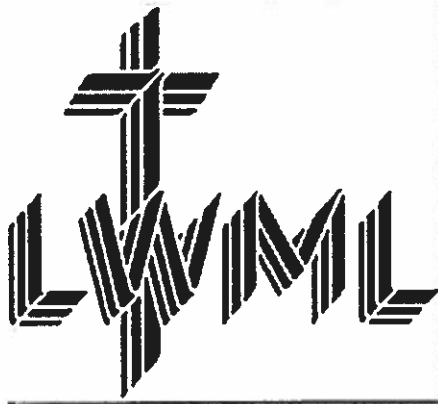

# CONFIDENT FAITH

**Say in a word, and my servant shall be healed. (Luke 7:7)**

What is a man's word worth today? Nothing gripes me more than empty promises made by repairmen, contractors, salesmen, or, for that matter, friends.

"It will be done tomorrow," he says.

You take him at his word. You drive the distance to his shop only to hear, "It's not ready yet." And you come to the bitter conclusion that you were only being strung along.

You and I do not like being strung along by anyone for any length of time. And we have been "taken" so often by the business world and by others. Therefore we might fault God for stringing us along with something that is very important with us, such as: Will our sick dear one get better? Will I grow in faith? Will I carry out my desire to be a better Christian?

We make our request known in prayer to our Lord on Sunday morning and expect an answer by Sunday afternoon. And when it takes a while for us to see God's answer to our prayers in our life, we might accuse him of stringing us along.

So I will rephrase the initial question. What is God's Word worth today? Can it be taken to mean something? Will God's promise mean action in my life?

Jesus simply had to speak the word, and the centurion's servant would be healed. That is what the centurion believed, and it was enough for him. And if Jesus chose to carry out his request in miracle form in that way, that is the way it would be done.

When we take our broken hearts, lives and souls to the Repairman from Nazareth, results are guaranteed. They will be long lasting because Jesus is God. He has earned our salvation by his death on Calvary's cross. He is also our Good Shepherd.

We won't be put off with our problems when we go to Jesus for a solution. We won't be put down because our names do not carry any weight. Jesus knows us by name. Nor will we be put to the bottom of the list. Jesus plays no favorites.

Jesus' word means action in our life. Action now . . . for now and eternity.

**O Lord, I wait patiently for your answer. I am confident that it is already on the way for Jesus' sake. Amen.**

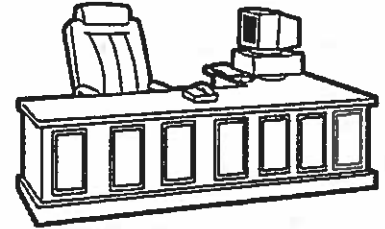

Once upon a time in a galaxy far, far away.....just kidding. However, somewhere along the way, the order of steps for members to reserve and use the Trinity Facilities has been lost, forgotten or just put aside. Here is a reminder of the protocol for using the facility for your event.

## **How to Reserve Use of the Trinity Facility for An Event!**

**\*\*First**, when planning an event, you must to talk to the Campus Administrator Debi Roethemeyer and explain what the event is for. She may be reached at the church office from 7:30am to 4:30pm Monday thru Friday at 970-330-2485. If your event has special needs and/or is an outside event, you may be required to get approval from the Trustees. Events that may require Trustee approval would be a Car Wash, Car Show, Garage Sale, etc. It is a good idea to consult with the Trustees to make sure appropriate safeguards for both property and attendants are addressed. A damage deposit may be required.

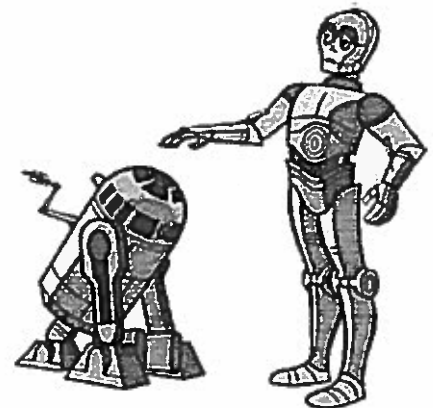
**\*\*Second**, call the Campus Administrator to place your event on the Master Calendar. There is only ONE Master Calendar and the Campus Administrator is the one who knows if a date is available or not. Be sure to reserve times that include set up and clean up to avoid overlapping. Don't assume someone else in your group has made this reservation, better to call multiple times than not at all.

**\*\*Third**, if tables and chairs are needed for your event such as a Birthday celebration, Anniversary celebration etc., please have that information ready when booking your date. The number of tables and chairs required and when the set up will be needed is important and pertinent information.

Members are allowed to use the facility without charge with the understanding that they are responsible for cleanup and the facility should be returned to the same condition as it was before your event. If the facility is not left in the same condition, a cleaning fee may be charged to cover the cost of cleaning by the custodian.

**Remember**-when using the dishwasher in the Narthex or either kitchen, **YOU** are responsible for unloading the dishwasher and putting the dishes away. The next person will not know if the dishes are clean or dirty.

If everyone is respectful of each other's needs and property, everyone will be able to enjoy the use of our facility for their event.

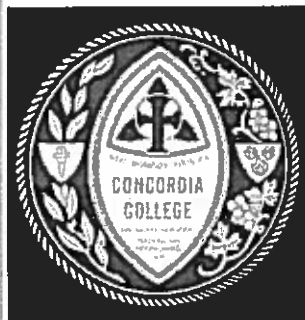

# Meet Our Preschool Staff

She was the lead teacher last year and being Director qualified, was able to take over the Director's job when Kari Way returned to the Western Slope. Katie's mother opened their home to foster children and if you spend anytime with Katie, you can see what a **HUGE** heart she has for children. She is soft spoken and humble, always giving thanks and credit to God. She says that when she was thirteen, she spent time in South Africa with her sister who was working there as a children's pastor. I hear that she is learning to speak Swahili. What a gem God has placed in our midst.



Mary Shultz is our new lead teacher in the preschool. A graduate of Concordia College in Bronxville, NY, she has over 30 years of classroom and homeschool experience, and she is a perfect fit in our preschool. Mary resides in Milliken with husband, Rev. Greg Schultz, son Michael (24), daughter Emily (22), and Daisy the cat. Her eldest son, Benjamin, lives in Mankato, MN with his wife Janeen and their son Micah (1). Immediately, you can see that Mary has an unconditional love for her all of her students. She has the younger children (2 1/2 yr. olds) in her class and they can sometimes want "mommy" sooner than mommy is scheduled to return. Then you will see Mary rocking them and singing to them. She loves being a grandma (and it shows), as well as singing, gardening, and making quilts. She has a soft, caring voice whether she is teaching her kiddos or supporting her co-workers. Another gemstone from God.

Shauna Yanke-Hofmann is our new lead teacher for the afternoon childcare. She began working with children at Beautiful Savior Lutheran School in Broomfield, CO as an aide in the after school program. She was 16 years old. She continued to work there throughout High School and during the summer break while she was in college. A 2010 graduate of UNC, she has a BA in German and secondary education. After college, she found herself back at Beautiful Savior where she decided to pursue an Early Childhood Group Leader (or Lead Teacher) position by taking State required courses. Her teaching experience ranges from birth to college. Back in Greeley, Shauna lives with her husband and three cats. She is currently working on her AAS degree in Early Childhood Education at Aims and hopes to be Director qualified in the near future. Shauna loves working with children and on any given day you will find her reading, coloring, or playing with the children in her care. 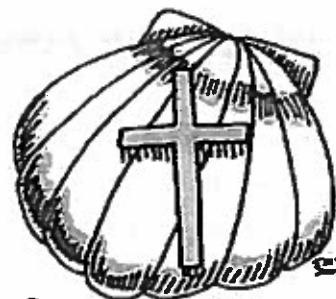

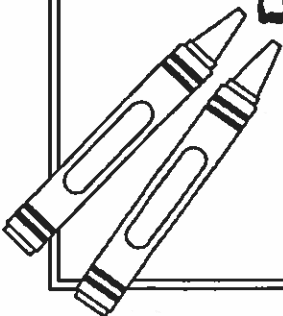
