The parade started at the Lutheran Church on the south side of town and stopped just short of the Catholic Church on the north side of town. (It was slightly up hill at that point and no place to turn around and disperse if you went all the way to the Catholic Church.) The entire parade route was probably less than half a mile, but it seemed much more when you marched in streets of sand that were ankle deep! Along that half mile, there were three more churches in a town with a population of 70. Everybody knew everybody. There were ball games in the park, an amateur talent show in the Community Hall, roping and riding events at the arena and music playing at the Bandstand. The volunteer firemen would open the firehouse and proudly show off their fire trucks to everyone who walked by. The Methodist Church ladies all made pies to sell and the Congregational Church ladies displayed their quilts. It was a picture just waiting for Norman Rockwell to paint.

Thinking about it now, looking at the quilt displays was one of my favorite things of the day, well except for homemade peach pie. I was intrigued with the varied colors and patterns and how a piece of fabric from an old dress or shirt was transformed into something new, something beautiful, and useful. I am in awe of the wonderful things God does all around us by transforming the old and making it new, beautiful and useful. We were all made new through baptism, but I must admit, that there are days I don't feel new, I just feel old. Always watching over me, God sends His Holy Spirit to renew me again, everyday if need be, by reminding me of His love for me. He has provided the Lord's Supper, so that I might renew my spirit and be His instrument.

God's handiwork is all around us, even here at Trinity. Seventy years in the making, God continues to "renew" Trinity. It is by God's grace that the school is not only open, but growing. It is not my place to tell God how much I think it needs to grow, but rather my place to serve Him with a "renewed" spirit. With His infinite wisdom and understanding, God has called His servants from New York, Minnesota, West Virginia, Georgia, Michigan, Nebraska, Kansas, Colorado and even Texas to be a part of His handiwork here at Trinity. 



STRENGTH INTRIALS

In this you rejoice, though now for a little while, if necessary, you have been grieved by various trials, so that the tested genuineness of your faith – more precious than gold that perishes though it is tested by fire – may be found to result in praise and glory and honor at the revelation of Jesus Christ. (1 Peter 1:6, 7)

When things are not going quite right, a bit of advice frequently handed out is to keep a stiff upper lip. The advice suggests that there are certain difficulties you can expect in life, and the only way to cope with them is to grit your teeth and make the best of it.

The Christian has a different view of life's difficulties. First of all, he understands their origin. They result from sin. All problems, all suffering, all sorrows, all difficulties, all misery, all frustrations have a common origin. They result from sin. Sin has contaminated the whole human race, and the believer also suffers from that contamination.


In addition, the Christian has another view of the difficulties he encounters in life. He knows that they are under God's control and that they are intended for his good. Granted, there are times when this is extremely hard to understand and accept. Yet the Bible stresses this again and again. God sends corrective measures into our lives, just as parents do with their children. Peter wrote to his readers that the trials which they were encountering had come "so that your faith... may be proved genuine and result in praise, glory and honor when Jesus Christ is revealed."

God's love for us is so great that he wants nothing to lure us from living and abiding in his saving grace. It is our trials in life, our problems, our tribulations which keep us from becoming too wrapped up in worldly affairs. If everything went along smoothly in life, if every day brought nothing but joy and pleasure, if every week and every month were nothing but one big pleasure trip, we would face the grave danger of becoming very attached to this world.

But we are strangers on this earth. Heaven is our home. The trials of life remind us of this. With the strength God provides, we can endure these trials. The resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead is God's assurance that He will give us that strength. This is a very important part of our living Easter hope. How rich we are that God strengthens us in all the trials of life!

O Lord, grant us strength as we encounter the trials and difficulties of life. Help us realize that they serve our good and will continue only for a short season until we live with You in heaven. Amen.

JOURNEY OF aith

They say there are hidden blessings in cancer. I could not believe that statement could possibly be true when I started my journey.

I went to my Nurse Practioner for my annual physical and scheduled a routine mammogram. As I left my breast diagnostic center the technician told me either I would get a call or a letter in the mail. I waved and said I would look forward to my annual letter. My doctor called on Sept 30th to say my biopsy was positive, I had breast cancer. We both cried on the phone together. I didn't know what I was in for; I thought we would take out the lump and call it good. Unfortunately my journey was not so easy and not so fast. My daughter was still healing from a brain aneurysm and I wanted to be strong for her. I also did not want to tell people and have them feel sorry for me; I was the one to help others. To receive help was a new concept for me and honestly I was not comfortable with it. The blessings started from the most unusual places. People called to offer help. I didn't know what I needed. How could I possibly ask for help? Some wise person told me, put yourself in their position, you would want to help. The help came in ways I never expected.




I work in an alternative high school and telling my staff and students was hard, but they all stepped up and the support was amazing. The staff threw me a "Farewell Lumpy Party" and supported me with an annual Thanksgiving Turkey Trot and a video that would make a grown man cry. I thought I had chemo handled, the side effects and working seemed to be ok but in January my husband died. Planning a funeral and handling two totaled cars while in chemo didn't break me, it made me stronger with God's help. Actually my friends and family held me up and gave me the strength I needed to keep going. I met beautiful people with smiles on their faces and encouraging words when I least expected it but needed it most.

I am blessed to have a family that truly loves each other. I have daughters who would do anything for me, a sister who is there in every way possible and grandchildren who make my life happy every day. My friends are tremendous, really, really good caring people. One day I found myself just crying not because I felt sorry for myself or overwhelmed with sadness, but overwhelmed with gratitude and love. I couldn't believe all my friends cared so much. One of my good friends took me to every chemo treatment. The day after I lost my husband I had a chemo treatment, all 8 nurses in the infusion department came to me and gave me a hug.

After 5 months of chemo and 37 radiation treatments I am truly on my way to a new life. So much has changed in my life but I am blessed each day with love. I have met people who have changed my life and now more than ever cherish the family and friends who have been by my side. God has given me so many blessings and I have found strength in his loving arms.
