





Note from the Editor: This month, my parents will celebrate their 65th Wedding Anniversary. When I was young and in love, I thought being married and forever living happily ever after was a given. Then I got married and moved out into "the world". I found living happily ever after took a lot of work by both husband and wife. Back then, I thought "I" could do the work for both of us and make my own happily ever after. "I" failed. Thankfully, God in His mercy is forgiving. Raised in rural Nebraska, I didn't know anyone who was divorced. My parents were partners in their marriage. They worked together on the farm, discussing bills and future plans. Mom would do field work, drive the tractor or whatever was needed. She had learned to sew clothes when she was in her teens and she helped stretch the budget by making clothes for herself and five daughters. My parents were and still are playfully affectionate. I can close my eyes and see my dad come into the kitchen after washing up, slipping his arms around mom's waist as she finished preparing supper. She would pretend to scold him, then kiss his cheek. Other times, for no particular reason at all, my mom would spontaneously throw her arms around my dad's neck and give him a big kiss. My dad would just keep on doing whatever he was doing whether that was talking to the farm hand, doing figures, or paying bills, like he hadn't even noticed, absolutely straight-faced. My mom would put her hands on her hips and say "Willis" like she was annoyed with him. Dad would wait a moment longer then he would break out in a big grin and chuckle as if to say "gotcha"! There was always conversation around the supper table about everyone's day and plans for the next day. That went on regardless of who was in the kitchen or at the supper table. When I would visit friends' home for a sleepover, I didn't find the same interaction. Some families did not sit together at the table, but took their food into the living room or their own room and watched TV. Others were at the table, but they ate in silence. I was too naive to recognize the signs of a broken home. The world we live in today, shows many more signs of being broken than when I was growing up on the farm. What used to be scandalous and rare now takes on the appearance of normal. The challenge is not to accept the brokenness as normal, this is not the world God planned for us. My parents taught us to invite God to our table at every meal, that He is our constant companion and to trust in Him to provide all that we need. Always. I look forward to my happily ever after, in hopefully many years to come, when God calls me home. In the meantime, I will be in Nebraska later this month to catch a glimpse of my parents happiness at 65 years of being together as one. May you have a blessed April!

Some may wonder how spring and budgets can mirror each other. It is an exciting time now that each board, with their five-year plan to guide them, is **planning** for their budget. They also have the help and support of an active Finance Board, putting all the pieces together. It's like planting seeds in a garden, it can be hard work digging, tilling and preparing the dirt for planting, but the anticipation of fresh grown produce makes all the work worth while. That is where we are...anticipating fresh, new growth!

Hopefully you have noticed, but knowing we have two services each Sunday, I will share with you that we have several new people who have been visiting our church and now want to become members. Pastor Hafeman has begun an adult information class and is thrilled to report 6 to 8 people are attending! In March, Pastor welcomed new members who have recently transferred their membership to Trinity. This is a good opportunity to remind everyone to wear their name badges...it helps when a new visitor wants to get to know you, or when someone just can't think of your name.

K-8 is very excited about the outcome of early registration for the 2017-2018 school year. This is an exciting time, but there is much work to do as well! As soon as we have a plan we will be asking for help from the congregation and the parents.

It has been amazing to see the response and support that the Memorial Committee has received for their stained glass window project. Keep in mind the LWML's Easter Love Offering. You will find an envelope in your box of envelopes appropriately named. This money will go towards the cost of the double pane tempered glass windows on the outside of the stained glass window. These new double pane windows should have a positive influence on our heating and air utility bills, when completed.

The Property Board has a growing list of projects, both short-term and long-term. If you have some time to help with planning and research they would sure appreciate it! Please talk to Les Durdy, Kristi Sanderson, Kevin Knief, or Cheri if you can help us out.

The community garden work is just around the corner. One of the preschool aides is also a nutritionist and is excited to help in the garden with the idea of using produce from the garden for the preschool and school for snacks and possibly even lunches!

Board Reports


- **The Board of Elders and Spiritual Ministries**
 - Chair lift system project for stairs in the church passed to the Trustees
 - Using a smaller, less expensive Easter advertisement in the Tribune and will also utilize the website for Easter advertising
 - Defining Pastoral Assistant job description with assistance from Pastor Hafeman and Larry Whitney
 - Looking at options to get a Reformation speaker. Paul Jackson will check with Gloria Christi and Pastor Hafeman will inquire at the Circuit Meeting regarding speakers and sharing expenses
 - A Luther movie has been released from the Synod and may be a potential opportunity for a movie night
 - Debi is looking into a banner and signs for Easter and other upcoming events
 - Pastor will recognize new transfer members this coming Sunday in church
 - Next meeting will work on the budget and how to publish the five-year plan.
- **The Board of Financial and Stewardship Ministries**
 - Eight months into the fiscal year and income is over budget and expenses are under budget. Ending cash in February is in the black.
 - This year's budget numbers from the Boards are due back to Finance by April 15th. The final budget will be presented at the Voters Meeting May 21.
- **The Board of Property Ministries**
 - Les Durdy updated current projects; lawn equipment is being serviced, natural gas line is repaired.
 - Have almost finished the budget.
 - Paul Jackson is assisting the Board with their five-year plan.
 - Need additional support for Virtus with lawn mowing.
 - Les explained electric demand. May be time to again research using solar power.
- **The Board of Education Ministries**
 - Budget for staffing submitted to Finance Board
 - BOCE approved early childhood budget that includes a substitute teacher, a pre K-8 hot lunch program, and the addition of a new classroom
 - Kyle Ericson nominated as Team Captain to get accreditation through the Lutheran school system
 - Hired a new K-8 teacher, Shannon Conner, for 1st and 2nd grades
 - Still need a Sunday School Superintendent
 - Next meeting with the Property Board on April 10th at 6:00 pm

Old Business

- April Council Meeting rescheduled for April 17th at 7:00 pm
- The second of the three Easter services is at 8:30 am instead of 8:00 am to better accommodate Easter Breakfast
- Paul Jackson is still looking into putting together a Stewardship team

New Business

- Pastor evaluation sent out to four Board Chairs and is due back by March 19th
- Trinity now has 67 permanent followers on Facebook and 196 people have viewed the TLC Youth & Family blog
- Pastor Hafeman said a new Adult Information Class has begun. Board members may be invited to speak with new members.
- Two new couples have visited Trinity for services and Bible study within the past three weeks from other area churches



From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Can you try to imagine for a moment being one of the disciples living through the horrors of Holy Week? Jesus had informed them that He would be crucified but that was a hard truth to swallow. It simply didn't register with the Apostles. They were in the glory mindset and waiting for Jesus to suddenly call them to arms and to get rid of those ruthless Romans and reestablish the Kingdom; the great Davidic Kingdom! Even in the Garden of Gethsemane Peter drew his sword when the soldiers came to arrest Jesus. He assumed it was the time for action.

It seemed as though everything from that point on was falling apart in the ministry to which Jesus had called them. Who wants to follow someone who is arrested, tried, brutally beaten and crucified on a cross as the hardened criminals were? To add insult to injury the crowds demanded that Barabbas be released instead of Jesus; Barabbas of all people! This wasn't in the disciples' plans. Peter, in fact, at an earlier time when Jesus had informed him along with the others that He would be arrested and killed, made it clear to Jesus that this would never happen to Him (Jesus). Jesus responded with harsh words to Peter, *Get behind me Satan!*

Well, he actually did it. He allowed Himself to be arrested. He allowed Himself to be crucified. He allowed Himself to be killed. Jesus, however, had already made it clear that this was all necessary and would fulfill the purpose for which He had come. He never ceased to be totally in control of all of these historical events and clearly stated it:

For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life that I may take it up again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have authority to lay it down, and I have authority to take it up again. This charge I have received from my Father (John 10:17-18).

Peter ends up denying His Lord three times. The others run away and hide. Only John, along with the women, are recorded as being near the cross. Later even Peter and John go into hiding with the other Apostles. They knew that the horrible things being done to Jesus would soon be attempted on all of them, His followers. Where is the hope? Jesus is dead!

Certainly there would be no hope for us if indeed Jesus remained dead. All of God's promises of a Savior given from the time of Adam and Eve would have been proven to be lies. We would have a whole different focus in life in the sense that life on this earth IS IT! When we die our life is all over. We would wander down the same road as the two disciples on the road to Emmaus without hope; *We had hoped that He was the One to redeem Israel (Luke 24:21)*. Without the risen Christ there can be no hope.

We know that Jesus appeared many times to the disciples and affirmed to them that He Who was dead is now alive! Jesus even appeared to over 500 gathered together. What a cloud of witnesses; maybe one or two could be questioned and create some doubt about having experienced the risen Lord but not 500! There was renewed hope, and along with hope, courage. After Pentecost we see these same Apostles no longer hiding but spreading the Good News of the risen Lord!

How blessed we are to live in hope knowing that Jesus is not only risen but that He reigns over the universe for our good. He is not far away but, as promised, with us always. He will never leave us nor forsake us but will continually guide us and bless us. When our life ends on this earth our life does not end but transitions from life on earth to life in heaven. On the last day even our bodies, left behind at death, will be restored without the former afflictions of sin and glorified and reunited with our souls so that we may dwell in both body and soul in heaven for eternity! Jesus, by His own resurrection from the dead, has conquered death and gone through the mystery of death as true man. He offers this victory to the world and personally shares it with everyone who believes Him to be the Son of God, the Savior of the world.

Oh how different life is when we live in hope. Oh how different life is when we no longer fear death which is our entrance into glory. In the meantime the Lord has honored us with the task of sharing this Good News with the world! There is nothing more important that we can do.



Children of God,





It's going to be a great day celebrating our risen Lord!


Sunday, April 30th: Youth Sunday, both 8:00 am and 10:30 am services


