Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I pray that God's grace is richly abounding in your life today and always!

It truly amazes me how great the effort is in our current culture and times to attempt to push God out of virtually everything. It is not uncommon to hear about the Ten Commandments engraved on walls having to be taken away. Of course, prayer has become a major

issue in schools and other public settings. Hollywood makes great attempts to mock Christ and degrade anyone who has faith in Him. None of this should really surprise us, however. In the opening words of John's Gospel it is written:

The true light that gives light to everyone was coming into the world. He was in the world, and though the world was made through him, the world did not recognize him. He came to that which was his own, but his own did not receive him (John 1:9-11).

It is really quite amazing that the creature fails to recognize the Creator Who has created him! Even the church of the day, the Jews, did not receive Him. This is quite a sad testimony of history. Now, currently, history continues to be made and tragically repeats itself. Evolution is now pretty much presented as fact instead of a theory and creation is mocked and discounted altogether. The Creator is still denied. Most of the world, yes even the religious and spiritual adamantly deny Christ to be the Son of God and the Savior of the World.

While this can be very discouraging at times it should not be. God has clearly informed us that this is the way a sin- corrupted and dark world thinks and operates. Jesus stepped into this world for this very purpose of confronting evil and, to do so, made His journey to the cross. Good Friday, which appears to be the darkest day, is truly a day of greatest blessings. Our Lord won for the entire world of all time the victory of salvation over sin, death and Satan. Even though He places this victory in the lap of every human being, most reject the gift and want no part of it. However, this does not change the reality of what Christ has done nor the value and effectiveness of the gift given. We rejoice that by God's grace we have not rejected His gift but joyfully receive it and all the blessings that come with it!

Have you ever considered this? It is quite amazing that most want to reject the public display of the God's moral Law, the Ten Commandments, even though they have this same moral law written in their hearts:

Indeed, when Gentiles, who do not have the law, do by nature things required by the law, they are a law for themselves, even though they do not have the law. They show that the requirements of the law are written on their hearts, their consciences also bearing witness, and their thoughts sometimes accusing them and at other times even defending them (Romans 2:14-15).

It would be a little difficult to remove the law from one's heart, wouldn't you say?

The really Good News in all of this is that God is never going away. The creature cannot remove the Creator as much as he or she may try. God is God and is always in control and sees to it that His will is done. Attempts were made to destroy Jesus; yet, when they thought they had succeeded with the crucifixion, Jesus rises from the dead! When attempts were made to squelch the proclamation of the Gospel in the early church, as recorded in Acts, God intervened and the Gospel message flourished and the church grew by the thousands against all odds. Nothing has changed today. Hollywood attempts to destroy Jesus through movies and a Baptist church in Albany, Georgia is led to do outreach through the development of movies for the big screen. On a shoestring budget they succeed by producing several movies that became great successes at the box office and proclaimed and continue to proclaim the Gospel to the multitudes. God is amazing in how He continues to work.

May we, then, in the midst of several events that can frustrate us be bold for the Gospel as we strive to live it and share it! God's Word never fails.

May we then be faithful in carrying on the great work that the Lord has entrusted us to do in sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ with the multitudes. What a blessed calling. We can do it with boldness and courage knowing who God is and that His truth will never fail! God bless.

Along with the transition of a new school year comes new faces including those of students, families, and staff. Everyone is invited to join us on August 13 for our Open House as we welcome those connected to the school.



What does this mean?- After paying all of our expenses for the year including cleanup and repairs after the May storm, we were short \$4280.00. However, after the end of the fiscal year, we received a check from our insurance for more than the deficit amount. A Note from the Editor: August reminds me of County Fair time in Nebraska. Many

years ago when I was younger, school didn't start until after Labor Day, making the focus of August about finishing 4-H projects for the County Fair and cherishing the last days of summer at the lake. An accomplished seamstress and good cook, my mother was our 4-H leader. She taught the young girls in our community to sew and helped them with their baking projects. She was a good teacher, supportive and encouraging. My friends all remember those days fondly, as do I, with the addition of the word "perfectionist". There were many late nights of sewing, ripping out stitches, sewing again and tears in the Roethemeyer basement in preparation for the County Fair. At the time, I would have used words less complimentary regarding my mom. A teenager does not have the perspective of the hours mom was investing in teaching her child a craft that she could use her entire life. A teenager only sees the missed summer fun, and only hears the, 'do it again'. My mom would say, "If it's worth doing, it's worth doing right" and "if you do it right the first time, you won't have to do it again". Mom never did the sewing for me, but many mornings I would trudge downstairs to the sewing room to find she had carefully removed crooked stitches and re-pinned the seam, so I could 'do it again' or to find she had lovingly pressed the acceptable work and it would be hanging up, a symbol of approval. It was years later that I realized the hours in the sewing room were less about learning to sew and more about teaching life lessons to her head-strong and stubborn oldest daughter. As I fondly remember those days, I think of the time and effort our Heavenly Father has invested in His sons and daughters. Teaching us His laws and His desire for perfection as a Divine and Holy Father. Wiping our tears away, encouraging us to live upright and righteous lives, and sending His son Jesus Christ to remove the crooked stiches from our lives by dying on the cross and washing all our sins, mistakes, and imperfections away. "You are all sons of God through faith in Christ Jesus, for all of you who were baptized into Christ have clothed yourselves with Christ." Galatians 3:26 That makes you a blue ribbon winner.
