Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

How blessed we are to know, trust and believe the Good News of Immanuel, God with us! We celebrate during this season of Christmas and always the historical reality that God became flesh and dwelt among us in the person of Jesus Christ AND that He is with us always!

I am always fascinated by an event that is recorded in the Book of Daniel; Daniel 2:11. Remember, God besieged Jerusalem, and Judah along with it, by means of Nebuchadnezzar, King of Babylon. God took His own people into exile to discipline the land for their rebellion against Him. Daniel was one of God's people that was taken into exile. Daniel was from the royal family and so was assigned to a special position within the king's court. Among his own people were the magicians and enchanters. The king would often seek their advice and guidance. One time King Nebuchadnezzar demanded that they not only interpret the dream that he had but also tell him specifically what the dream was! If they could not, then the king would kill them along with their families. It is in this context that they come to the king and say, "What the king asks is too difficult. No one can reveal it to the king except the gods, and *they do not live among humans.*"

Babylonian gods were, of course, remote and inaccessible. Why? Because they did not really exist. They were merely idols created by man.

Oh, how different for Daniel then and for us now! Immanuel, GOD WITH US! Daniel approaches this situation with confidence not in his flesh but in the presence and activity of God in his life. Daniel and his companions prayed to God seeking His mercy in this matter. God's response; "Then the mystery was revealed to Daniel in a vision of the night." (Daniel 2:19) As a result of God's intervention, Daniel was able to tell King Nebuchadnezzar his dream AND interpret the meaning of it. Daniel also gave God the glory for his ability to do this as he explained to the king; "No wise men, enchanters, magicians, or astrologers can show to the king the mystery that the king has asked, but there is a God in heaven who reveals mysteries, and he has made known to King Nebuchadnezzar what will be in the latter days."

(Daniel 2:27-28). Daniel's faithful witness not only spared his life, the life of his companions and the others but led the king to acknowledge God; "Truly, your God is God of gods and Lord of kings, and a revealer of mysteries, for you have been able to reveal this mystery." (Daniel 2:47). What the Babylonian gods were not able to do, the LORD Almighty did! He is not far away and oblivious to our lives but He is with us!

As we continue our journey of faith upon this earth we can always be blessed in knowing that nothing in our lives is hidden from God; yes, not even our sin. However, this is precisely why Jesus Christ came to us in the flesh. He came to deliver us and the world from the condemnation of sin. Unfortunately, most of the world rejects Him and the blessings that He offers. In so doing, they cut themselves off from the blessings and security of forgiveness and eternal life. We, however, are blessed with faith to know, trust and accept what Christ has done and as such, we have this wonderful new life! It is all a gift from God who loves us. So, we welcome God's presence and live securely in His presence among us. Like Daniel, there is nothing impossible with God as He works through our individual lives. This world is a dark place due to sin and it is getting darker. We live in a heathen culture somewhat similar to Daniel's time. As concerning as this can be we can rejoice in God's presence among us. He promises that He is familiar with all of our ways (Psalm 139). He promises to be our refuge and strength and a very present help in trouble (Psalm 46). He promises to abide with us in all forms of danger and even through death itself (Psalm 23). Jesus Christ, God Who has come in the flesh and dwelt among us, promised prior to His ascension into heaven; "I am with you always, to the very end of the age." (Matthew 28:20b). He is also the One who invites us to come to Him always, no matter the circumstance; "Come to Me, all you who are weary and heavy burdened, and I will give you rest." (Matthew 11:28)

Sadly, the Christmas season which should be filled with joy brings instead, to many, loneliness and depression. Why? Because it is a time when family and friends celebrate many times together at parties and other gatherings. For those with no family or friends or who are separated from them, it can be a very lonely and depressing time. This is the opportune season to reach out, especially to these, and bring to them the Good News that they are never alone and that they are never unloved by God Who is not way out there somewhere but Who is Immanuel, God with us!

The Journey to Bethlehem

The shepherds said to one another, "Let's go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has told us about." Luke 2:15

People still go to Bethlehem. Every year thousands of pilgrims go there to worship in Manger Square outside the Church of the Nativity. Bethlehem is called a "little town" in a Christmas song, and it is described by the prophet Micah as "small among the clans of Judah: (Micah 5:2). Nowadays it is a city of some 50,000 inhabitants.

The first pilgrims to worship Christ in Bethlehem were the shepherds. It was more than curiosity that brought the shepherds to the manger. It was faith, for they knew the angel's message was the Word of the Lord and they expressed their faith in their worship of the Christ Child. Upon leaving the stable they became heralds of Christ's incarnation when they "spread the word" (Luke 2:17) of the Nativity. They became missionaries, all the while honoring God in their vocation as shepherds.



We may not be among the pilgrims who nowadays journey to Bethlehem to worship in Manger Square, but we make this journey of faith in spirit. It is for us an act of faith to celebrate Christ's birth in our homes and churches. We believe that the promised Savior came in the person of Jesus. He came to be our Savior from everything that separated us from God and heaven. Jesus came into the world to liberate us from the grip of sin and the fear of death. And He set us free for something: to sing His praise with glad voices, to serve Him with willing hearts and hands, and to spread the word as did the shepherds.

Give thanks to God for the gift of His Son for our salvation.

The dream abruptly ended again after his death. I just didn't want to travel by myself. As I made my way through the quagmire of grief, I once again realized I was never alone. There have been times along this journey of life, when I have lost my way and could not see the path God had laid out for me. But His faithful promise to be with me always has prevailed. I am taking a leap of faith and traveling again, this time with my two daughters and their families. I am putting my trust in God. I am ready for the adventure to begin and to make memories that will last a lifetime.

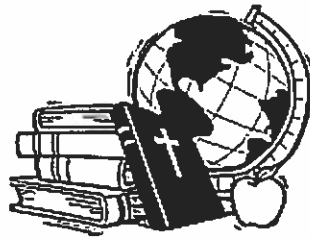

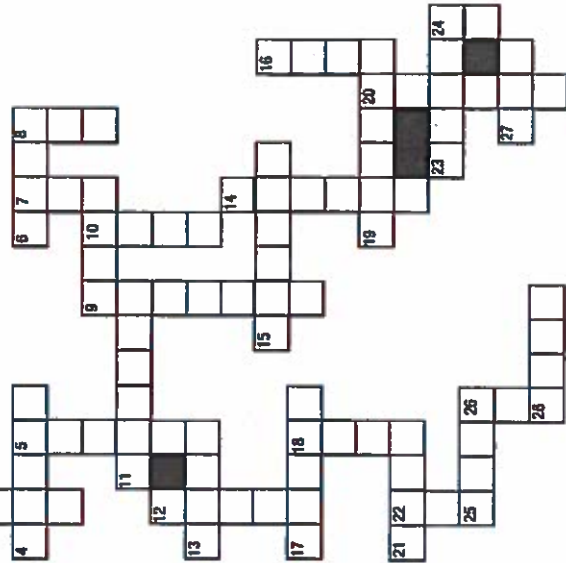
