From the
Pastor's Desk

Dear Sisters & Brothers in Christ,

When you receive this article the 58th Presidential Inauguration will have already taken place. We could probably have a lively conversation among our family at Trinity over this whole election and our views of our new President. Most important, however, is to always consider God in the mix of contemporary events; especially concerning this topic of authority.

I thought that it would be good at this time to review some clear teachings from Scripture on this matter of authority. This discussion also came up in our study of Daniel on Sunday morning when we looked at Daniel 2:21; "He sets up kings and deposes them." God is in control of all things including the rulers of nations. In Romans 13:1 God tells us, "For there is no authority except from God, and those that exist have been instituted by God." This is especially startling in light of the context of the times when Nero was the emperor of Rome and led one of the severest persecutions of Christians in the history of the church. Paul, the one inspired to write the book of Romans, certainly didn't question God in this matter. In fact, in 1 Timothy 2:1-2, he encourages Christians to pray for "kings and all those in authority." As in Daniel, so in Proverbs 21:1 we hear, "The king's heart is a stream of water in the hand of the Lord; he turns it wherever he will." We see the application of this truth in a number of political historical events as preserved for us in the Word of God. God used heathen rulers and nations to discipline His own people so that they would not completely fall away from Him. In Isaiah 10:1-5 we hear of God's confronting of His people, especially the leadership in their wickedness, and warns them of His upcoming discipline upon them. In Isaiah 10:5-13 we learn that He uses the nation of Assyria, a powerful heathen nation, to carry out His discipline. What is really awesome in this is that God reveals His control in controlling Assyria and allowing them to only go so far (Isaiah 10:12). Before Cyrus was ever born God was calling him by name and informing His people that, after the Babylonians took them into exile by God's directive because of their rebellion against Him, Cyrus would be used as God's instrument to restore His people to their land. You can read about this in Isaiah 45 and Daniel 10! In Acts 8 we learn of the governing authorities leading a severe persecution against the early church. On the surface it may beg the question as to whether God really knows what He is doing. However, as we follow the results of this event, we discover that the church of Jerusalem was "scattered throughout Judea and Samaria (verse 1). Thus, as a result of the misuse of authority by evil men, the Great Commission was put into action, the gospel spread, and the church grew!

We live in a different era but are blessed to live under the same Author of all authority, the Lord Almighty. He continues to direct the affairs of nations; He continues to protect His church, even if that calls for discipline; and, He always sets the boundaries. We do not know for certain what this new administration will accomplish but what we do know is that God is in the middle of it and will continue to exert His authority and will over it. He does this for the church, the body of believers, you and me personally. In the midst of those who see these times as doomsday we Christians have the great opportunity to express calmness and peace by our demeanor and how we approach these times. We especially have opportunity to share God's Word so that people can be informed and equipped. Most of all this affords the opportunity to share the Gospel; the Good News of Jesus Christ!

I leave you with these words as God inspired Paul to write them:

"First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for all people, for kings and all who are in high positions, that we may lead a peaceful and quiet life, godly and dignified in every way. This is good, and it is pleasing in the sight of God our Savior, who desires all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth. For there is one God, and there is one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus, who gave himself as a ransom for all, which is the testimony given at the proper time."

- ◆ Council agreed with Paul Jackson's proposal to monitor progress of each Board's five-year plan on a quarterly basis in April, July, October, and January.

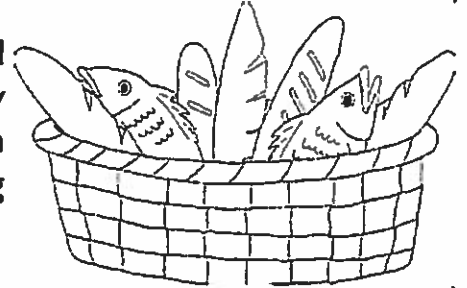

A boy who had just come from a Sunday school class was asked what the lesson was all about. He replied that it was about lazy people – “about a multitude that loafs and fishes.” It is true. In the account of the feeding of the 5,000 the people did nothing to earn their daily bread.



The multitude had come together in a lonely and remote place. They were in no position to engage in a “do it yourself” scramble for food. The people were our Lord's guests. And Jesus directed His disciples to have the people sit on the grass to be served a meal.

Our spiritual sustenance comes from Jesus Christ just as completely and miraculously. It is a miracle of divine grace that by the water and Word of Holy Baptism faith is given us, and by the consecrated bread and wine of Holy Communion Christ's true body and blood are imparted for our spiritual growth in Him. It is most astounding that the simple Gospel message of our Lord's cross and empty tomb, which is folly and an offense to human reason, is the wisdom of God and the power of God whereby those who hunger and thirst after righteousness are fully satisfied.

Divine grace means that we are Christ's guests. We come to His Holy Meal empty handed. Salvation is God's outright gift – we contribute nothing. The Good Shepherd, who laid down His life on our behalf, leads us to the “green grass” of His Word, providing all we need for our spiritual nurture. We sing, “The Lord's my Shepherd, I'll not want; He makes me down to lie In pastures green; He leadeth me The Quiet waters by.”

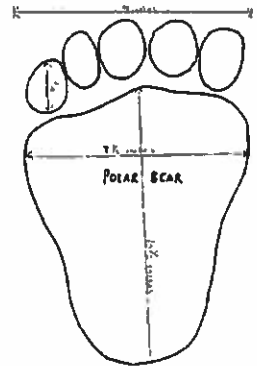

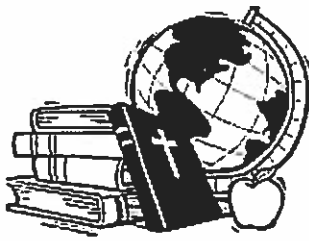

Growing up in a farming community in Nebraska, I thought "towns' folk" lived an enchanted life. Endless paved sidewalks for riding a bike without the concern of sandbur induced flats, friends next door to play with, neighborhood grocery stores where one could buy a treat, and so many more advantages. How could you ever have nothing to do?! My cousins who lived in this magical place, longed for the open spaces of the farm and the chance to ride horses, to feed the animals, drive the tractor in the field, ride in the back of the pickup truck down dusty country roads. Ah, perspective. There are different perspectives about "heroes" as well. There are sports heroes of all kinds, movie star heroes, comic book heroes (I, myself am a big fan of Captain America) and any number of other heroes. First responders, firemen, policemen and soldiers, and police are all good examples of heroes. Sometimes the best heroes are the ones close to home. My biggest earthly hero is my Aunt Paula. Right from the beginning, she was there for me, as my baptismal sponsor. A godly woman, she remembered and presented me with gifts for my birthday, Christmas and Easter that would encourage my spiritual growth through my confirmation. A good mother, good cook and most importantly a good listener, I do not remember of her ever raising her voice. Her children (3 boys older than me and a girl younger who was closer in age to my younger sisters) are well-mannered, polite and respectful. She survived cancer not once but twice and was widowed some three decades ago. Fourteen years older than my dad, as a young wife and mother, she opened her home to my dad so he could attend school in North Platte, NE where she lived. She, of course, would scoff at being a hero and would skillfully remind me that Jesus in the "real" hero, coming down to earth, living a sinless life, but giving His life on the cross to pay for all of our sins. Earlier this week at age 99, she went to her heavenly home. When life as we know it here on earth, ends for someone we love, it can be a time to contemplate one's perspective. Admittedly, I am squeamish when it comes to attending funerals. If there is a correlation between the number of funerals I have attended and the number of attendees that will be at my funeral, it will be a very small group. I am unable to attend her services and perhaps that is just as well, because although I will miss her greatly, I would have a hard time not smiling and grinning during this solemn occasion as I only have fond memories of her. After all, my earthy hero is sitting at the feet of her hero surrounded by all the glory of heaven, how could I be sad about that?

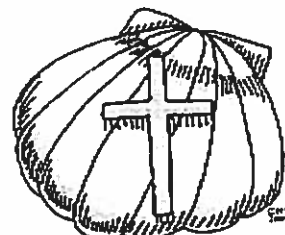

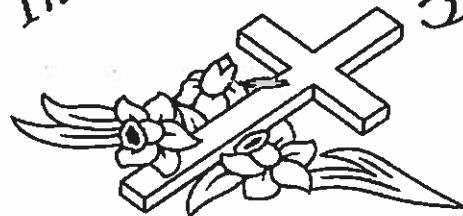
