Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

We really see the heart of our Lord, Jesus Christ, in His longing for those who remain separated from Him as recorded in a number of places in the Gospels:

"Jerusalem, Jerusalem, you who kill the prophets and stone those sent to you, how often I have longed to gather your children together, as a hen gathers her chicks under her wings, and you were not willing." (Matthew 23:37)

"When he saw the crowds, he had compassion on them, because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. Then he said to his disciples, "The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field." (Matthew 9:36-38)

The Lord also informs us that the reason the world has not yet ended is for the sake of those who still remain separated from Him:

"The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise, as some understand slowness. Instead he is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance." (2 Peter 3:9)

We have been called not only to pray for workers in the harvest field but to be those workers in the harvest field. God daily sets up the opportunities for us to witness to those around us. Especially, if we pray for the opportunity, be sure that the Lord will provide the opportunities. It could be in an unexpected phone call; visiting with a cashier at a local store; helping someone cross a street; the passenger sitting beside you on an airplane; a telemarketer; someone coming to your door to witness a false god to you; scouts asking for donations; a waitress at a restaurant; your car serviceman . . . The list is unending. You may be the one whom God has intentionally put in front of these people for the specific purpose of witnessing to them. By the way, witnessing involves a lot of listening; hearing their story and then beginning from where they are to bring them where God would want them to be. The Lord models this for us many times. One of my favorites is the woman at the well (John 4:1-42).

I think that we fail to appreciate, sometimes, how blessed we are to live in faith; to live in God's favor and with all of the security He provides to us. Most people, including your co-workers and neighbors, do not live with security. Apart from security is worry and fear at extreme levels. It is no wonder that so many people are stressed out to the limits. I can't imagine facing each day with the seemingly overwhelming news that we hear locally, nationally, and internationally. This world, due to sin, is a very evil, dangerous and dark place. How blessed we are to live in the Light of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ Who has established total security in our lives. We know by God's promises that He is our refuge, our strength, a present help in trouble, our Counselor, our Lord, our Savior Who died for our sins and our Victor Who has won for us victory over even death! He assures us that nothing is impossible for Him. We are blessed to know, trust and believe that He is always with us, always looking out for us, always protecting us and always guiding us to the extent, by His promise, that He will not allow anyone or anything to separate us from Him! It is so easy for us to assume that this is the normal way of life for most people on this earth. The very opposite is the truth; we are not the norm. We are blessed.

In considering how blessed you are by God, may this be the motive to share the blessing with everyone God provides to you. This requires that we are attentive to what God is doing. Have you ever noticed that when you are looking for a particular model of vehicle you start seeing that particular car all over the place? Why is that? The reason is because you are now focused and concentrating on that particular model of car. Prior to this, there were probably hundreds of these particular vehicles that were in your sight but you paid no attention to them. God desires that we would be so focused upon His will; particularly His will for us to witness to unbelievers around us. Begin by listening. When you listen to a stranger and really are interested in what they have to share they are going to be much more open to hear what you have to say. Listen for how they share feelings of insecurity with you. Approach them with the Gospel at the point of their insecurity so that you can reveal to them how the Lord changes things. Connect them with people who can help them through whatever issues they currently face. It is so important to remember this great quote from Theodore Roosevelt:

"People do not care how much you know until they know how much you care."

As God's people, caring for others should be our great strength based upon our Lord's caring for us! May God bless you and me as we strive to be a blessing to those around us with the hope that they too would come to know and trust in Christ.



A Note from the Editor: History intrigues me. It doesn't really matter what kind of history. Greek Mythology. America history, including Indians, gold rush, Civil War, presidents, entertainers and cars. European history, Dark Ages, the Crusades, Russian Czars are all exciting. Biblical history tops them all. I was delighted to have the opportunity this spring to make the drive to Fort Morgan with family and friends to experience "The Tabernacle". In my mind, the Tabernacle that the Israelites carried through the wilderness with them, had to be "HUGE". After all it is recorded in Exodus that 600,000 fighting men along with their families left Egypt, crossed the Red Sea and entered the Wilderness. Biblical scholars suggest that one in four Israelites were counted in that number, which means there could easily have been 2.4 million Israelites wandering in the Wilderness. "HUGE", right? This replica was made to the exact measurements as outlined by God in Exodus. Immediately, it was obvious that the enormity was in God's presence rather than the physical size of the structure. Reverently, the narrator guided visitors through the stations of worship; why each were there and how through the life and death of Jesus Christ they were all satisfied for each of us, today. Studying history can be both exhilarating and painful, especially when it comes to personal history. Then there is the conflicting points of view. A history teacher will tell you "history is important because if we don't learn from the past, we are doomed to repeat it." (The Israelites should have listen to that one.) While a caring parent may tell there child who has been hurt, "you have to move on, if you live in the past, you will miss the present and the future." Both statements have value. Certainly when I examine my own history, there were exhibitanting moments of accomplishment, success, joy and happiness. There are also times of loss, failure, and tremendous pain. Examining our history can be one of Satan's traps. He sucks us into second guessing our decisions, wanting us to play the "what if" game, and encouraging us to be afraid. Telling us that because we failed, because we lost, because it hurt, we should be afraid and not try things that are new or different and to let go of things we enjoy. He wants us isolated and alone, we are easier pick in's that way. The REAL history lesson here is that we all fall short, we all fail to keep God's law. That is why God sent His One and Only Son, Jesus Christ to lay down His life for us on the cross, shedding His blood and washing away our sins, clothing us in righteousness. "a righteous man will be remembered forever. He will have no fear of bad news; his heart is

steadfast, trusting in the LORD." Psalm 112:6 b-7 Trust in the LORD.


