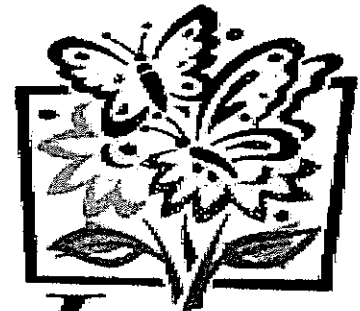

*But with You there is forgiveness, therefore You are feared. Psalm 130:4*

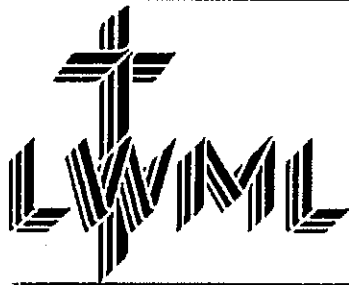
Psalm 130 is usually heard at penitential worship services. In the Scriptures, without exception, death labels all people as sinners and sin as the cause of every evil. "The wages of sin is death" (Romans 6:23). "Therefore, just as sin entered the world through one man, and death through sin, and in this way death came to all men, because all sinned." (Romans 5:12).

Such acknowledgment of sin leads to the painful question: "If You, O LORD, kept a record of sins, O LORD who could stand?" (Psalm 130:3). The holy Judge has to regard us as guilty. All our very best deeds are unclean, like a filthy garment (Isaiah 64:6). However, the psalmist continued with this comforting answer: "With You there is forgiveness . . . . Put your hope in the LORD, for with the LORD is unfailing love and with Him is full redemption. He Himself will redeem Israel from all their sins" (Psalm 130:4-8).

Yes, indeed, forgiveness of all our sins is won through Christ's blood and sealed by the Holy Spirit through the Word, Baptism, and the Lord's Supper. So, where there is forgiveness of sins, there is also life and salvation. We have peace with God, and everything is to our good (Romans 5:1; 8:28).

(Hebrews 10:23-25)*

## *From the Pastor*

As we enter into these summer months living in Colorado there are quite a variety of activities available to us. Certainly, all we have to do is look to the west and see the beautiful Rockies that God has provided to us for our enjoyment. Unfortunately, this time of year can also distract us from *assembling together* in fellowship as God's people in accordance to His Commandment; *Remember the Sabbath day by keeping it holy.*

This commandment is no different from the rest of God's moral law in that He gives His Law to us for our good and not to be a burden. God reveals a number of blessings offered and received in conjunction with this commandment. When we gather in public worship with one another we are nurtured and strengthened in our faith through hearing the preaching of God's Word and receiving the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper. It is through these means of grace that God reveals and strengthens His truth to us so that we know what the true confession of hope is and that we may then hold fast to it without wavering. Some would say that they can worship God in the mountains. I love the mountains and do feel very close to God in the midst of them; however, this form of worship does not replace preaching and receiving His precious meal which we are His gifts offered to us with the intent of receiving them often.

Nowhere in Scripture does God direct us to be *lone rangers* in the faith. Instead, as we hear in this text, God informs us not to neglect to meet together. This meeting together is a reference to public worship and fellowship. He gives a couple clear reasons in this passage as to the purpose behind His command. We all need to be encouraged in the faith. Life can really beat us up at times, the temptations can be severe, and we need to be lifted up; yes, first and foremost, by God's Word and Sacrament, but also through the mutual encouragement that we can give to one another as we gather publicly for worship and, in this time, that we can hold one another up in prayer and be in God's Word together through Bible study. These experiences are life-changing and life-sustaining. Would you ever consider weekly worship time as just an option in the busyness of life? Is this the example that you would want to set for your family; worship as just an option?

We also all need to be stirred up to do good works and to love one another. This does not happen in a vacuum but in the context of God's people publicly gathering together. Consider this, if everyone chose to worship God while hiking or fishing in the mountains separate from ever assembling together in public worship, what would happen to local ministry and to world mission efforts? Who would plan them? Who would support them? Pastors would need to find work outside of ministry to support themselves which would take a lot of their available time from doing ministry. The same holds true for mission efforts. Local congregations would close. Denominations would collapse due to no support.

God is very orderly and that includes His structure of ministry and the visible church. Pastors are called by God to serve the sheep God has gathered in the local *assembly*; congregation. Through the combined efforts of God's people gathered in many congregations great mission plans and efforts can be made and succeed. The Gospel, by God's design, continues to spread throughout the world. Remember, God hasn't given us another day on this earth for the sake of the hockey playoffs, the stock market, another vacation opportunity or the like; but, He gives us another day for the sake of those who currently are separated from Him may be brought into the fold, the Church. This should give some clarity to priorities from God's revelation.

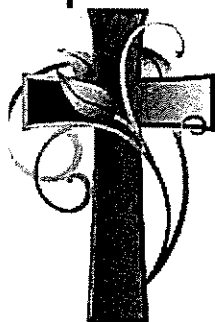
