 - * Still looking for a Sunday School Superintendent

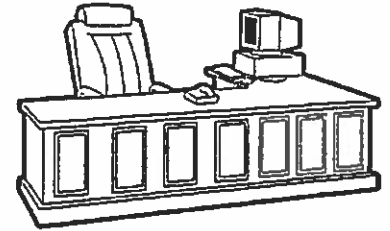

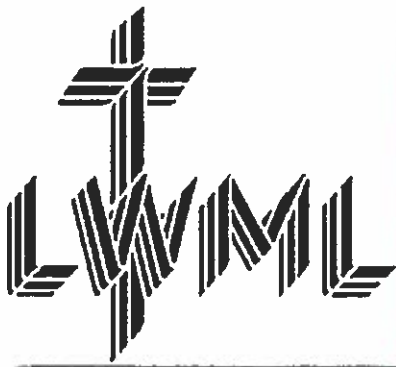

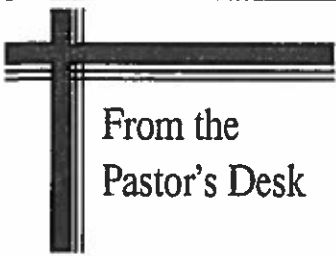

Pastor's Desk

Dear Family of Christ,

We have been blessed to be on a journey together through Christmas and the season of the Epiphany. We have celebrated the birth of our Lord, Jesus Christ; God became man and dwelt among us! Throughout Epiphany we have learned of many ways that Christ has revealed Himself clearly to be God and Savior. Now, after Epiphany the mood of our worship will change abruptly. Joy gives way to penitence as we begin to commemorate the suffering and death of Jesus Christ. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent. This season reaches its climax on Good Friday as the Scriptures lead us to Golgotha where our Savior died for the sins of all people of all time. As we recall the depth of Christ's suffering we are compelled to remember that our sins brought all this upon Him. So, we search our souls and humble our hearts. The color purple signifies this penitent mood. We rejoice that through His bitter suffering and death that Christ removed our guilt and won the forgiveness of our sins.

Traditionally throughout the Lenten season we not only worship on Sunday but also on Wednesday. The Wednesday Midweek services will follow the theme, *Fellowship with the Father: The Lord in Prayer*. This will offer a wonderful time for you and me to grow in our prayer lives together. During this series of prayer services we will be learning how to pray from none other than Jesus Himself. Here is a list of the weekly themes:

Wednesday, March 8	"Alone from the Crowd"	<i>Luke 5:12-16</i>
Wednesday, March 16	"Awake at Night"	<i>Luke 6:12-13</i>
Wednesday, March 22	"The Journey Ahead"	<i>Luke 9:18-24</i>
Wednesday, March 29	"The Right Way"	<i>Luke 11:1-4</i>
Wednesday, April 5	"Word AND Prayer"	<i>Luke 23:34-46</i>

The order of worship will be abbreviated versions of Matins in the morning at 10 am and Vespers in the evening at 6 pm. A luncheon will follow the 10 am service each week and a light dinner will be served, beginning at 5 pm, in the evenings prior to the 6 pm service. Please hold this season up in your prayers specifically asking God's blessings upon His Word as it is read and proclaimed; that many members and visitors would come to worship and pray together and that we, together, can grow in our prayer lives. *That is really exciting!*

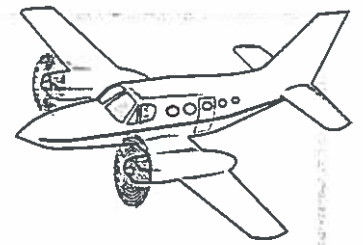

Note from the Editor: When I was between 12 and 15 years old, I would sometimes be allowed to help my dad feed the cows in the west canyon. I say allowed, because I wasn't very good at it and there could often be significant amounts of time before my dad would give me another chance. Dad would load the pickup bed with bales of hay, then put the pickup in "grannie gear" for me, to steer as he tossed the bales of hay off the pickup to the cows following behind. This procedure was only used when there was too much snow for the cows to find their own food. Barely able to see over the steering wheel, I did my best to hold the steering wheel steady, but I couldn't see the prairie dog mounds and holes, and ruts, covered by snow. When the wheels of the pickup hit those unseen obstacles they would jerk the pickup threatening to throw my dad off his feet and out of the pickup. Life can be like that. No matter whether we are speeding through and life is a blur or we are in "grannie gear", we can get knocked off our feet by the unexpected prairie dog holes. Knowing God and having a relationship with Him can steady us when the path is uneven and rough. Reading the Old Testament is a good way to get to know (with God's help) who God is. He is the creator of all things. He is jealous. He gets angry when His children disobey Him. He loves unconditionally. He gave His one and Only Son as the ultimate sacrifice to pay for all the sins of the world. In Deuteronomy, Moses speaks to the children of Israel as they prepare to enter the Promised Land, reviewing all that has happened with God's chosen people since God freed them from the Egyptians. Moses reminds them of God's statutes and to keep them faithfully, encouraging them to avoid the ruts and stumbling blocks along the way, by teaching their children and even writing God's statutes on their doorposts so they could always remember. Talking to God through prayer is another way to develop our relationship with Him. 1 Thessalonians 5:17 tells us to "pray continually;". Picture a small child putting their arms up, reaching for their parent. The child cannot under their own power or strength reach up into their arms, the parent must bend down and pick them up. So it is with our Heavenly Father, we cannot under our own power, strength or knowledge find God. We can look for Him in His Word, we can talk to Him in our prayers, and we can reach for Him with our hearts, but ultimately, God chooses to bend down and pick us up, sins and all. May our prayers be full of joyful thanksgiving that He has chosen each one of us as well as prayers that He will continue to pick us up when we get tangled up with prairie dog holes and thrown off our feet.

Getting to Know Jesus Better

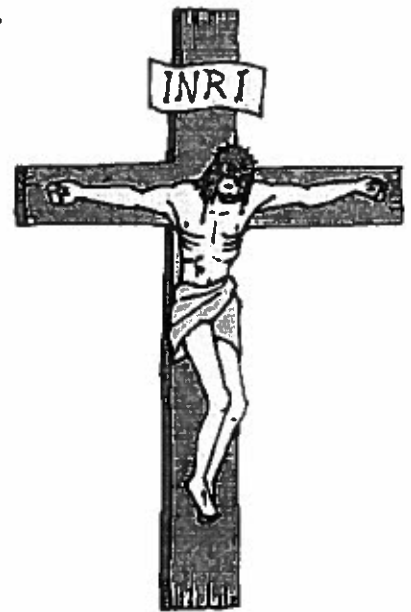
O Hope of Israel, its Savior in time of distress, why are you like a stranger in the land, like a traveler who stays only a night? Jeremiah 14:8

A newspaper columnist, having delivered an address at a social function, was on his way home on the train. He was surprised that some of the passengers called him by name. Had he become a celebrity? When he got home, he discovered that he had forgotten to remove his nametag.

Jesus wore a nametag, not on His lapel but above His head on the cross. The tag told who He was: "Jesus of Nazareth, the King of the Jews." One might wonder why this identification was necessary. Was Jesus not well known after raising Lazarus from the dead? Did He not ride into Jerusalem amid public acclaim? Was not the whole city stirred up because of his arrest, arraignment before the Sanhedrin and Pontius Pilate, and the noisy procession to Mount Calvary?

What we have here is a yes-and-no situation. Yes, many in Jerusalem recognized Jesus, but they really didn't know Him. To some He was an impostor, a troublemaker, or a mere teacher and would-be healer. To a relatively few was His true identity as the Messiah and Son of God revealed. As for the majority, this was true, as St. John wrote, "He was in the world, and though the world was made through him, the world did not recognize Him" (John 1:10). He remained a stranger and a traveler just passing through.

So the nametag on the cross was necessary. It was also truthful. The label upheld Jesus' testimony before Pilate, "You are right in saying I am a king" (John 18:37). Our Lord is indeed our true Messiah and King. And since He is, we are happy to know him through the Word and Sacraments.

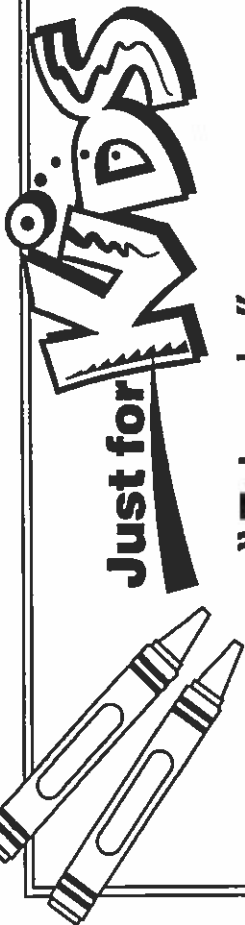
