





### What If?

(1 Cor. 15:14, 17, 18, 20)





"What if?" What a world of meaning is in these words!
What if —we didn't have enough food to eat?
What if —a tornado would pass through our town?
What if —there were a nuclear war?
What if —you were told you had an incurable disease?
What if —we didn't have freedom of religion?

What if? What if? What if?

The Apostle Paul poses a "What if" question in his first letter to the Corinthians, the fifteenth chapter:

WHAT IF Jesus had not risen from the dead? He then contemplates the horrible consequences:

1. "Our preaching is in vain." v. 14

Our preaching, teaching, witnessing, our establishing new congregations, supporting seminaries – if Jesus had not risen from the dead – would be in vain, foolish, folly, worthless, useless. After all, why preach and teach and witness about a dead Christ?

BUT HALLELUJAH! All our preaching and teaching and living is centered around the RISEN LORD JESUS! The Bible declares, "This Jesus God raised up, and of that we are all witnesses" (Acts 2:32).

2. Again, we ask, WHAT IF Jesus had not risen from the dead? WHAT IF? And Paul says:

"Your faith is vain." v. 14

If Christ is not risen, it is not only folly to preach and to teach about a dead person, but foolish to believe in one. Paul says, then "your faith is vain." Its empty, hollow and good for nothing.

But again, Christ's RESURRECTION is the core of our confession. We confess, "I believe that Jesus Christ . . . was crucified, died and buried, and on the third day HE ROSE AGAIN from the dead."

WHAT IF? What if Jesus had not risen from the dead? Our preaching is in vain and "your faith is in vain." And now the apostle adds something else: If Jesus had not risen from the dead:

3. "You are still in your sins." v. 17

If Jesus did not conquer death, how could He conquer sin? How could an ordinary man move the mountain of sin that separates us from God? But we are reminded in Romans 4: "Jesus our Lord . . . was put to death for our trespasses AND WAS RAISED for our justification."

WHAT IF Jesus had not risen from the dead? Paul, inspired by God writes:

4. "Then those who have fallen asleep in Christ have perished." v. 18

If Jesus had not risen from the dead, there would be no hope of every seeing our loved ones again, those who have died believing Jesus' promise, "Because I live, you shall live also." If Jesus did not rise, they will not rise. We will not rise

But all of the "WHAT Ifs" are swept away with the glorious proclamation, "But in fact CHRIST HAS BEEN RAISE FROM THE DEAD . . . " v. 20

BECAUSE JESUS LIVES our preaching and teaching and reaching is not in vain. Our faith is not in vain. We are no longer in our sins. We shall see our loved ones who have fallen asleep in Jesus.

And not only will we see our loved ones again, but together with them and with angels and archangels and with all the company of heaven we will laud and magnify His glorious name, evermore praising Him and saying:

"Blessing and glory and wisdom and thanksgiving and honor and power and might be to our God for ever and ever! Amen."





A Note from the Editor: It certainly seems that the older I get the faster time goes by. November is just a couple of days away and the holiday season is about to begin. As we prepare to celebrate Thanksgiving this year, may it be about our real relationship with our Lord Almighty and not just about tradition. The 'tradition' of a Thanksgiving Dinner is less about Pilgrims and Indians and all about giving thanks to God for everything. Let us prepare for the eternal feast of thanksgiving foretold by Isaiah, "On the mountain the Lord Almighty will prepare a feast of rich food for all peoples, a banquet of aged wine -- the best of meats and the finest wines." 


