



Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

Have you considered the special times in which God has blessed us to live; the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation! We are reminded of the great sacrifices made by many who contended for and upheld the truth of the Gospel even at the point of

facing death; for instance, Martin Luther. After having posted his 95 theses Luther was commanded by Charles V of the Holy Roman Empire to recant all that he had stated in them. Luther refused with this famous statement:

Unless I am convicted by scripture and plain reason -I do not accept the authority of popes and councils for they have contradicted each other -my conscience is captive to the Word of God. I cannot and I will not recant anything, for to go against conscience is neither right nor safe. Here I stand, I cannot do otherwise, God help me. Amen.

By God's grace, Luther succeeded in getting the truth of the Gospel to the multitudes in his day. Several wonderful and accurate video presentations have been put together to cover the history of Luther and the Reformation. These will be shown on the first four consecutive Sunday evenings in October in the sanctuary at Trinity. For those who cannot come to these events the DVDs will be available for you to borrow and watch at your leisure at home. Here is the schedule:

Martin Luther: The Idea that Changed the World Sunday, October 8, 5 pm

The Luther Mile (a tour of historical Reformation sites)

Sunday, October 15, 5 pm

500: The Impact of the Reformation Today
Sunday, October 22, 5 pm

Luther recognized the importance of children learning the Gospel at a very young age. Parents were encouraged to teach their children the main doctrines (teachings) of Scripture. To enhance this he wrote his Small Catechism which is still used today in most Lutheran congregations and homes to prepare young people for confirmation.

This continues to be God's mission entrusted to us at Trinity. We are blessed to have our own school with the freedom to teach all of our students the Good News of Jesus Christ! What a blessing. We are growing and currently have 40 preschoolers and 36 students in K thru 8th grade. Of course, with growth comes more financial responsibilities in supporting this growth. Would you consider a special offering, above and beyond your normal giving, in celebration of Reformation 500 to continue to enhance the preaching and teaching of the Gospel? These monies will be used to build up a savings fund to draw from for cash flow when normal offerings decrease during the summer months; there is also less tuition income during these summer months.

If you would like to make a special offering in celebration of Reformation 500 envelopes will be available to you on the counter in the entry way of the church and also in slots in the pews. In light of this special occasion we ask that your amount given would be given in multiples of "5"; for instance, 5 cents, 50 cents, \$5, \$50, \$500, etc. This can involve the whole family in the spirit of giving. These envelopes will be received during the regular worship offering each of the Sundays in October.

This will be fun and exciting as well as a great blessing towards the continuance of proclaiming God's truth for generations to follow! GOAL: \$30,000

Do you know why? Every Sunday, the Pastor asks you to sign-in by using the pew sheets located on the left side of the back of the pew in front of you. I have heard remarks that some question why they need to this every week, if they have previously signed in and nothing has changed. (i.e. address or phone numbers) Here are a few brief reason why:

1. These pew sheets are collected each week and your name is entered in our attendance program. This program generates regular reports for our District and our Synod as to the number of active members in our

congregation which aides them in decisions regarding resources. If only half of the people sign in, our reports would show we have half as many regular members attending service as we actually do.

2. In our fast paced lives, people relocate and often do not request transfers to a new church. In order to keep our numbers as accurate as possible, every year reports are run and if we find names on the report that have not attended in a specific length of time, they are made inactive to conserve our resources. (If we don't know you are here, because you didn't put your name on the pew card, you may be made inactive and would no longer receive mailings or newsletter, etc.)

Did you know playing in mud is good for kids of all ages? Well, scientists have now confirmed what children have known all along! Research shows that dirt contains microscopic bacteria called Mycobacterium Vacce which stimulates the immune system and increases the levels of serotonin in our brains, an endorphin that soothes, calms, and helps us relax. Scientists believe that regular exposure to the bacteria may reduce a child's vulnerability to depression, in short, playing in mud makes you happier! That is just one of the many things we have been learning in preschool this month.



One week we focused on Humpty Dumpty and discussed what would happen if Humpty fell on other items. The children helped as we made a chart and came up with a "hypothesis" of what would happen. This gave us opportunity to talk about vocabulary words like hard/soft, heavy/light. Each child took their turn dropping an egg from the wall, leaving the results in the hallway for parents to see at pick up time. The kiddos also made their own Humpty Dumpty and used their small motor skills to tear or "crack" Humpty Dumpty, then put him back together with Band-Aids.

The children enjoy our Jesus time each day and so far this month we have spent time talking about who Jesus is, that we know Jesus loves us so much that he died on the cross to take away our sins. We know that sins are the bad choices/thoughts we make. We learned that Jesus wants to be our best friend and we can talk to him wherever we are and at any time. We also had the story of Jesus walking on water from Matthew. The kiddos really enjoyed the song "Jesus is My Best Friend" and the song "How Much I Love Him".

This year we have organized a Preschool Advisory Board that meets each first Tuesday of the month. These are parents who volunteer their time to help and plan our fun events. They also give us their ideas for new things that might enhance our mission here at Trinity. We are looking forward to their support.

Please continue to keep us and our mission in your prayers. Add a prayer of thanksgiving. Our State of Colorado licensing specialist was in to see us, check our files, and the safety of our preschool areas. Praise be to God we passed all the safety inspections. We can confidently say 'we provide a quality program for the children in our care'. Go play in the mud!





A Note from the Editor: I enjoy a good mystery. In my younger days, my author of choice was Agatha Christie. Recently, I discovered a BBC series shown on PBS called Father Brown, set in a small English village in the 1950's. Having spent time in England when my first husband was in the Air Force, the setting brings memories of those days flooding back to me. Of more interest is the main character Father Brown, whose curiosity often leads him to see a crime when others, including the police, do not. His driving force is to find the truth and minister to the wrongdoer that they may acknowledge their sin and repent in order that their soul be saved. Something this TV character said started me looking deeper at my relationship with God. Another character's confession seemed hollow and insincere and Father Brown called him out saying something like if your repentance is not heart-felt and genuine, it is the same as being unrepentant.' Every Sunday I confess my sins and ask for God's forgiveness, but is it heart-felt and sincere or memorized and repetitive? Do I acknowledge those sins and truly repent? Do I take God's forgiveness for granted? A study of Luther's Small Catechism and specifically Luther's answers to the question "what does this mean?" after each of the ten commandments, identifies my sins to me and my need to genuinely repent of those sins. As the 500th anniversary of Reformation approaches, perhaps this is a good time to get reacquainted with Luther's writings. Consider having your own "Reformation Walk" by attending the Sunday evenings planned for October and may they enhance your daily walk with Jesus.




