

Have you considered the special times in which God has blessed us to live; the 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Reformation! It immediately draws my attention to the great sacrifice that was made by many before Martin Luther who died as martyrs for the faith in their attempts to get the clear message of the Gospel of Jesus Christ out to the multitudes. By God's grace Luther succeeded even though his life was often threatened. Can you imagine standing before a powerful leader who commands you to renounce everything that you have proclaimed about the truth of the Gospel and if you refuse to do so you could be executed? Luther at the Diet (assembly) of Worms (Worms, Germany), faced this very circumstance at a hearing before Emperor Charles V of the Holy Roman Empire where he had to answer to charges of heresy. He was called upon to renounce everything that he was teaching with regards to God's truth as revealed in the Bible. Luther refused and responded with these famous words:

Unless I am convicted by scripture and plain reason—I do not accept the authority of popes and councils for they have contradicted each other—my conscience is captive to the Word of God. I cannot and I will not recant anything, for to go against conscience is neither right nor safe. Here I stand, I cannot do otherwise, God help me. Amen."


Consider how blessed we are to be able to freely express God's truth without the fear of persecution or martyrdom. We are even more blessed to know God's grace and to possess the security of salvation. 500 years later, Trinity Lutheran Church continues to proclaim the truth through our preaching and teaching within this congregation and school.

It is so exciting to see, in this 500<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Lutheran Church, the great blessings that God continues to bestow on our family here at Trinity. If you were at the installation service for our school teachers and staff a few weeks ago, you can see how this ministry is growing and our staff is growing! We currently have 40 in preschool and 36 in K thru 8<sup>th</sup> grade! At least 76 young people are going to consistently hear about God's grace throughout this year of school. They will take this message home to their parents.

In all this excitement there is also added responsibility, financially, to support this great ministry. We, Pastor and the Executive Council, are asking that you would prayerfully consider giving a special offering to build up our Savings Account so that we continue to have a safe cushion to draw from when offerings might be down; especially in the summer months. In tracking our offerings, we are seeing a trend that the envelope offerings do go down significantly in the summer months. There is less tuition income as well. So when the payroll, benefits, mortgage amounts are constant, but the offerings and tuition income are not, we have to draw funds from savings. When the offerings and tuition income goes back up in the fall and winter, there is not enough to replenish the savings account. Bottom line.....with our greater responsibility we need a larger cushion. Please prayerfully consider this need as you decide how to make your offerings.

In celebration of the Reformation we are going to have a special giving opportunity throughout the month of October that will be built around the number, 500. This will be fun and exciting as well as a great blessing towards the continuance of proclaiming God's truth for generations to follow! Look for more details in the near future!

A Note from the Editor: I enjoy driving. I always want to drive when my family or friends are traveling somewhere with me. My grand daughter is learning how to drive and is not "loving it", yet. A few weeks ago, five of my family members joined me on a road trip. It had been a long day, I was tired, it was late and I was driving on a curvy mountain road that I knew, but hadn't traveled in more than 10 years. One by one, my grand children, then my daughters drifted off to sleep. I glanced over to the passenger seat and saw that my son-in-law had ahold of the grab bar (or as it is sometimes referred to, the "Oh, Sh-t bar) and his knuckles were white! I know that feeling! My first husband had a daredevil attitude about life and when we were first married, I had not learned to trust. 


