A Note from the Editor: After a long hot summer of farm work, my family looked forward to our annual trip to the mountains. Dad would load up the slide in camper into his pickup, so it could be cleaned and packed. For most of the year, the camper sat on jack stands in the open machine shed where it would accumulate months of not just dust, but dirt from the prairie winds. Everything had to be vacuumed out and wiped down. There was a strategic art to packing for a long weekend or week. Food, pots and pans, clothes, toiletries, games, it was a long list. With four little sisters, this could often be a time of contention. Everyone had their own "must have" items that there was no room for. A bit like the nursery story about The Little Red Hen, everyone wanted to go to the mountains, but no one wanted to do the preparation work, nor were we patient once we loaded up and headed out. It was several hours of "are we there yet" and "how much farther". There were no extended cab pickups then. Dad and mom rode in the cab and us girls in the back. It was not necessary to make a "reservation" to camp, it was all first come. One of our favorite campgrounds in the Rocky Mountain National Park had a quiet steam of water that ran through it. I couldn't wait to find the place where two fallen trees had formed a bridge across the stream. Crossing the stream, I imagined myself on an island waiting to be explored by me. The water flowed smoothly, like a little babbling brook and looking down the rocks and stones looked like gemstones as they glistened in the patches of sunlight that streamed through the trees. looked forward to finding a quiet place where I could listen to the natural sounds around me and have some space away from my little sisters. The New Testament recounts several times when Jesus would separate himself from the noise of the crowds to find a quiet place to pray to His Father. I didn't realize it then, but I was looking for a place to talk and listen to God, away from the busy world around me. I have found it is something I need daily. Sometimes, that quiet place can be found in memories like this one. God is always there, ready to listen, ready to hold me in His loving and healing arms. All I have to do is ask. That is all any of us have to do, ask. May you find your quiet place and may your conversation with God refresh you daily. Do not be anxious about anything, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your request to God." Philippians 4:6

If God is for us, who can be against us? Romans 8:31

A child put the Romans 8:31 verse this way in his own words: "if God isn't for us, we are up against it." This isn't exactly what the text says, but the reply contains a truth that the Bible teaches in many places.


God is against sin, especially the master sin of unbelief. God is against the unbeliever. The risen Christ declares, "Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved, but whoever does not believe will be condemned" (Mark 16:16). God's condemning judgment against the unbeliever is a dire sentence, as the writer of the Hebrews epistle has written, "It is a dreadful thing to fall into the hands of the living God" (Hebrews 10:31).

But the blessed truth is that God accepts us as His children for the sake of Jesus Christ. "He who did not spare his own Son, but gave Him up for us all — how will He not also, along with Him, graciously give us all things? Who will bring any charge against those whom God has chosen? It is God who justifies" (Romans 8:32-33). Those whom God has declared just by faith cannot be condemned — not by Satan, not by the world, not by the human conscience.

Since God is for us, He blesses us with His gifts: mercy, grace, salvation, and eternal life. He makes us more than conquerors in life's conflicts. He keeps and guards us so "neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 8:38-39).

It is a wonderful thing that God is for us!



Also, we have accepted a bid, and are waiting on the work to be done to repair the light pole in the church parking lot. Thank you Kevin Knief for helping us with this project.






