

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Happy New Year! Yes, you heard me right, Happy New Year! No, I am not like many of the stores who already get Christmas decorations out long before Thanksgiving. I am drawing our attention to the new Church Year which begins with the season of Advent. If you are able to come to worship the first Sunday in December you will notice that the altar paraments and my stole will be blue in color. Advent, a preparatory time of waiting and watching, communicates the message of hope. BLUE-the color of the sky-helps convey that powerful message.

The word, Advent, means "coming." It is the nearly four week period right before Christmas in which we prepare to celebrate the coming of Jesus Christ into the world. As we look forward to the day of His birth there is, of course, much joy and gladness in our hearts. But there is also regret and shame. For, if it were not for our sins the Son of God would not have had to humble Himself in this way. Another traditional color for Advent is purple which represents regret and shame. It is a season of mixed emotions. During these weeks of waiting for the day of Christ's birth we are like the Old Testament believers who longed so eagerly for the Savior whom God had promised.

You will be provided many worship opportunities to prepare your heart and mind for the celebration of our Lord's birth. The two Midweek Advent Services will address the question, "What Child Is This?" These services will be held at 10 AM on Wednesday, December 5th and Wednesday, December 12th. Christmas Eve Worship will be on December 24th at 5 PM. This will be a candlelight service and will continue to address the question, "What Child Is This?" Isn't it sad that the majority of the world does not know who Christ is? Even more tragic is that most of the world doesn't even want to know. It is so necessary that we continue to be equipped with the knowledge of Jesus Christ so that we may continue to grow in our own understanding of Him so that we may grow in our faith in Him. On Christmas Day we will celebrate the birth of our Savior following the theme, "Immanuel Has Come." Worship on Christmas Day is at 10 AM.

It brings such great joy to me, and I know to you also, to see so many children being brought up in the knowledge of the Lord at Trinity Lutheran Church and School. We have many children in our school learning about Jesus every day along with learning reading, writing and arithmetic. It is my hope that you can join us for the School Christmas Program / Worship on Wednesday, December 19th at 10 AM and 6 PM. It is also my hope that you will join us for the Sunday School Christmas Program / Worship on Sunday, December 16th at 10:30 AM. I hope that you can come to regular worship at 8 AM and then stay for the 10:30 AM worship to show your support and encouragement to the kids and learn from another perspective the true meaning of this season.

It was incredible to see our parking lot full to overflowing to serve people coming to vote on Election Day. We are so blessed to live in a nation where we have a voice and can express our desires through voting. However, it also saddens me in the sense that voting for "princes, who cannot save" (Psalm 146:3), draws overflowing parking lot crowds while parking lots become less filled every year for the celebration of Jesus Christ who is the King of Kings and the Lord of Lords. I pray that you will pass the word along to your friends, family, co-workers, neighbors, etc. about these upcoming worship celebrations and personally invite them to come and join with us in preparation for and the celebration of the incredible birth of our Lord, Jesus Christ. Upon hearing the Word of God we will all grow in our understanding of What Child Is This? We will be better equipped to share this Good News with others. Yes, we will continue to be filled with hope!




