*The Board of Property Ministries


- *A dedication of the stained glass windows in the sanctuary is planned for February 11th

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ.

Happy Valentine's Day! Generally, we think of romance and the special one that we love in our lives. It is a time for a special date filled with surprises. I would imagine that this day could be quite depressing for those who have lost the "love of their life." It conjures up all kinds of wonderful memories of special times shared together and, most of all, the love shared with one another. We miss them all the more on this special day.

Have you ever considered, though, the greatness of God's love for you and the reality that He describes His relationship with us as we being His bride and He being the Bridegroom? God has established this "marriage" with us by means of His love shared with us through the gift of His Son, our Lord, Jesus Christ. No matter what changes we go through in life, including the loss of loved ones through death, God is always and will remain always with us!

This month in the Church Year, we will transition from the Epiphany season into the season of Lent. It is a season to seriously consider the depth of our sin and to focus upon repentance. In so doing we zoom in on the detail of our Lord's suffering and death; the huge price God determined to pay to deliver us from our sin. You will notice that the paraments (cloths on the altar, lectern and pulpit) change to purple. Purple, like black, is a penitential color, in contrast to a festive one. It is appropriately used during Lent. The forty days of Lent, including the six Sundays that fall during this season, use this deep, rich color which has come to represent somberness and solemnity, penitence, and prayer. Jesus, the king of the Jews, wore a purple robe only once. As the soldiers mocked and tormented him, the Scriptures record they placed on him a "purple garment" in order to ridicule him and belittle the claim that he was a monarch. Therefore, purple is used during this penitential season of Lent as a vivid reminder of the contempt and scorn he endured, and the subsequent sacrifice he made for our eternal salvation. Ecclesiastical purple should remind all Christians of their daily need to humbly give attention to leading a life of repentance.

This Lenten season, during midweek service, we will be focused on the theme, "Thy Will Be Done." Not as I will, but as you will, Jesus prayed to His Father the night before He went to the cross for our salvation. And this is our prayer as well this Lent as we seek to do God's will in our lives, as we draw near to the observance of Christ's suffering, death and resurrection during Holy Week. This Lenten series will draw our attention to a different aspect of God's will at work among us. Biblical characters are used as insightful reference points each week to guide us in following our Lord more nearly day by day. Midweek services will be at 10 am and 7 pm. There will be a lunch that follows each of the morning services and a light dinner beginning at 6 pm prior to each of the evening services.



Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent and the season reaches its climax on Good Friday and comes to an end on the following day, Holy Saturday. I began this article with the greeting, "Happy Valentine's Day!" Ash Wednesday falls on Valentine's Day this year; February 14th. The Happiest Valentine's Day is knowing and trusting the greatest love expressed to us by God through the gift of His Son. He loves His bride, the church, unconditionally, consistently and eternally! Not even death can separate us from His love; in fact, at death, we will come to know His love at a whole new level as we see Him with our own physical eyes in heaven! Oh, I guess I am getting a head of myself. We will hear more about this as we celebrate Easter; which by the way, is on "April Fools Day!"




School and Preschool Happenings




Cooks Night Out
