2018 OFFERING ENVELOPES –are here! Numbers have changed, so **please do not use** the 2018 envelopes until Sunday, January 7th or your contributions may not be credited correctly to **YOUR** account.



Did you know: if you **do not** mark your giving envelope, all monies go into the “General Fund”. If you write an amount in on the line for either Missions or Building Fund, those monies are accumulated and at the end of each calendar month, distributed accordingly.

Did you know: those who mark their envelopes with amounts for Missions allow Trinity to send between \$10K to \$15K per year to the Rocky Mountain District for the missions selected. Some of those missions are posted on the Mission bulletin board in the Narthex.

Did you know: that when you write an amount in the Building Fund space on your giving envelope, that those monies are added to the LCEF mortgage payment each month, to pay down the mortgage loan principal. An average month sees our loan being paid down by more than \$1000.00. Take that times 12 months and we just made an additional monthly payment. In addition, less interest is paid from our loan payment and more goes towards the principal.

To recap:

- *Current Expenses: goes to paying our bills, water, electric , insurance, gas, salaries, etc.
- *Missions: goes directly to Rocky Mountain District for the missions they have selected
- *Building Fund: is added monthly to the mortgage payment as additional principal

Dearest Trinity Family,

Thanks for allowing me the opportunity to design and create the stained glass windows for our church.

Once the glass and supplies were purchased I couldn't wait to start the project. Picking out the glass involved 5 people and approximately 3 hours time plus a couple trips to Denver.

It's a great gift from God to be blessed with this talent and to share the talent with our church is a bigger blessing.

Beverly was a great assistant during this project. She not only was the assistant, but also the one who lifted and transported every piece of glass it took to create these stained glass windows. There are over 24 individual pieces averaging the size of 2 feet x 4 feet. I must add that they are not light in weight. She had to move each individual piece at least 3 times!

The window design is a representation of a piece of material, a cloak, as used in Biblical times - like used at Easter a cloak draped over the cross. The cloak starts at the top left side and takes a full twist about 1/3rd of the way down and ends with movement off to the lower right.

The primary colors were chosen to coordinate with the paraments of the Altar, representing the different seasons of the church year.

Red - Reformation/Confirmation/Pentecost Sunday

Purple - Lent

White - Christmas/Easter

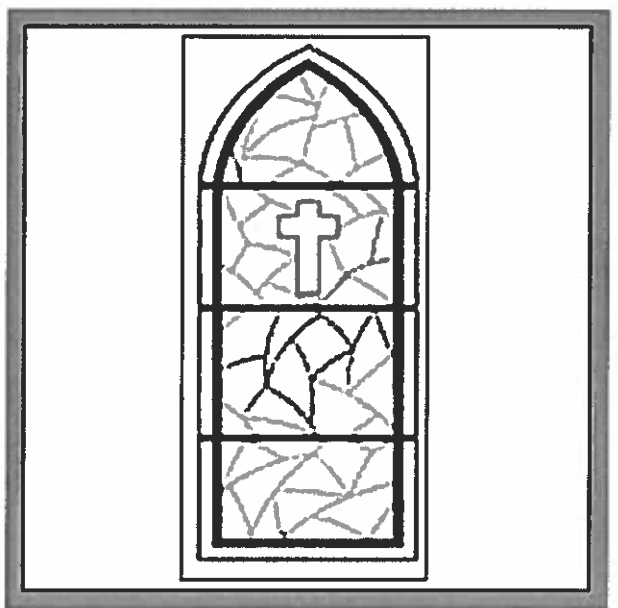
Green - Pentecost

Blue - Advent

Burgundy - was chosen because of it's rich color.

The three multi colored windows use pieces of each primary colors with the exception of white, as there is white used on the left and right sides of each panel.

Blessings at Trinity

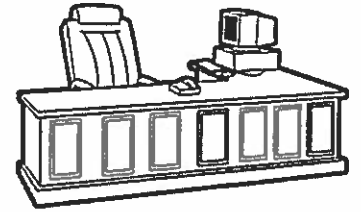

Happy New Year to all of you. My prayers are for a very peaceful and prosperous new year, blessed by our Lord.

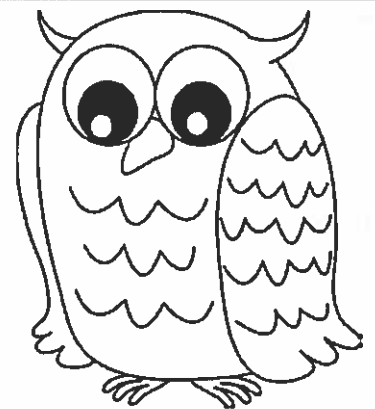

ORIGINS: On January 13, 1984, President Ronald Reagan issued a proclamation designating January 22, as the first National Sanctity of Human Life Day. (January 22, 1973, was the day the U.S. Supreme Court legalized abortion-on-demand in all 50 states.) Churches around the United States use this day to celebrate God's gift of life, commemorate the many lives lost to abortion and to commit themselves to protecting human life at every stage.

The Light of Epiphany

The people walking in darkness have seen a great light. Isaiah 9:2

Come winter, especially in northern climates, daylight is of short duration and the desire for “more light” is often expressed.

Our world is in a spiritual darkness, winter and summer. The gloom that is sin deepens into the total darkness of godlessness, greed, hatred. People speak of the “seven deadly sins.” Truth is, sins are more numerous than seven, more than seventy times seven. And each one is as deadly as the next because every sin merits God’s condemnation. This is darkness – fatal darkness – and what is all the more frightening is that people, in Christ’s day and now, “loved darkness instead of light” (John 3:19). If given the choice, they choose the darkness of sin over the light of salvation.

The Epiphany festival celebrates God’s outreach to the heathen world. The coming of the Magi to worship the Christ Child anticipated the worldwide mission command given by the same Christ thirty years later. At the end of His ministry on earth, Jesus told His followers to evangelize the world – “all nations” (Matthew 28:19). Salvation from sin is God’s gift to all who believe in Christ as Savior and are baptized.

Jesus is the “Light of the world” (John 8:12), the “Sun of righteousness” (Malachi 4:2), the “Radiance of God’s glory” (Hebrews 1:3), the total expression of “the grace of God that brings salvation . . . to all men” (Titus 2:11). He enlightens the road leading to heaven; He is our guiding light for a purposeful life here and now.

Pray that the same Christ the Wise Men worshiped is proclaimed throughout the world as the one and only Savior.

Saturday January 20th: Guess Who's Coming to Dinner

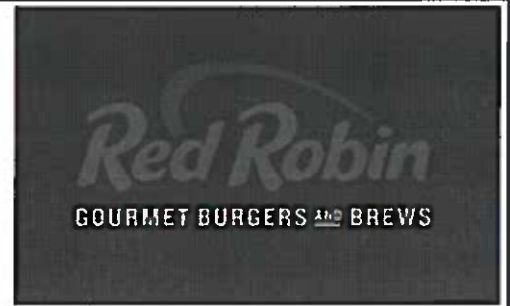

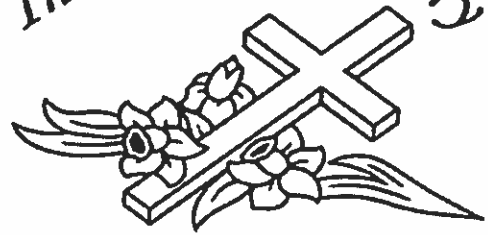
