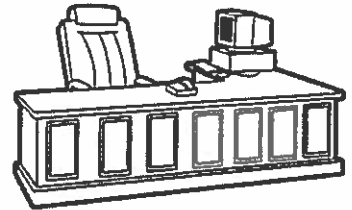

Intact Liberty

And you shall consecrate the fiftieth year, and proclaim liberty throughout the land to all its inhabitants. Leviticus 25:10

On July 4, 1776, the bell in Independence Hall in Philadelphia was rung to proclaim the independence of the United States of America. The text from the book of Leviticus was inscribed on it. You may want to look that text up: Leviticus 25:6-17.

The liberty proclaimed to the Israelites was mostly an economic one. It provided that every fiftieth year, land was to revert to the original owner to strengthen the family. In that year there was to be no sowing or reaping. The people lived off their reserves.

The Declaration of Independence was a political document with a somewhat religious orientation. It declared that all people were "endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights," including life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness.

Liberty and freedom are still in our vocabulary. Citizens have the duty and privilege to uphold the principles articulated in the Declaration of Independence. Civic freedom needs to be preserved.

The Declaration of Independence was not conceived in a vacuum. It was influenced by the principles of the Christian faith. *"For freedom Christ has set us free; stand firm therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery"* (Galatians 5:1). Jesus Christ rendered full obedience to the demands of God's Law and freed us from observances of the Sabbath, circumcision, dietary laws, and the like. Our Savior bore the penalty for all our sins and disobediences. We are free to serve the living God, thanks to faith in the merit of Christ. We must not bargain our Christian freedom away but stand on it.

Let us give thanks to God for the freedom we enjoy as citizens!

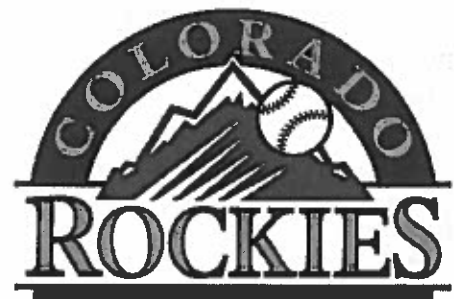

A Note from the Editor: Growing up on a Nebraska farm, July is all about the wheat harvest.

When I was very young, neighbors would get together and help each other with their harvest. It was a social time for the community. As the profit margin on wheat crops shrank, getting everyone's crop in at the peak of ripeness put a strain on neighbors helping each other. Along came the 'custom combine companies'. They would start in Texas and make their way north. My dad would hire one of these companies and work right along side of them with his own combine. Older cousins would watch my sisters and me when we were too young to help, while mom rotated between cooking meals and driving trucks. I loved it when I was considered old enough to help mom cook up both lunches and suppers for a whole crew. No doubt that is where I learned how to "cook for thrashers" something that is so ingrained, that I still do it even though I am cooking for one. The work was hot, sticky and exhausting, but the reward came in the cool of the evening when I could climb up and sit in a truck filled to the brim with freshly harvested wheat. Taking off my shoes and socks, I would slide my feet into the cool grain. Laying back on top of the mountain of grain under the stars, I would ponder the immenseness of God's creation while snacking on morsels of grain. The opportunity for this spiritual moment was very short. Even though the combines had lights, the moisture in the evening air was too much for the delicate grain and the harvest had to stop, for the day. A few weeks ago, the cover of the Sunday bulletin showed Jesus in a waist-high field of golden ripe wheat and I was immediately transported back to those July evenings at harvest time. I found myself thinking about Jesus and His disciples walking through the fields and picking heads of grain to eat. Traveling through all the towns and villages on foot, preaching and healing had to have been hot, sticky exhausting work and their food, heads of grain. Just like those harvests I remember there was much to do. Jesus tells us, as he told His disciples, "*The harvest is plentiful but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into his harvest field.*" *Matthew 9:37-38.* God has called us to be His workers. May He bless our harvest and make our labors fruitful.

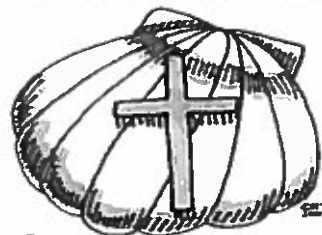

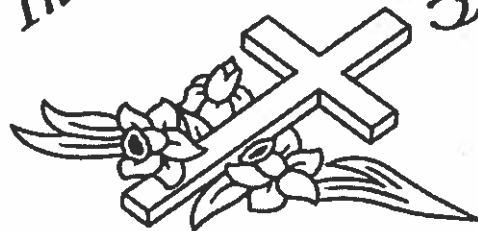
