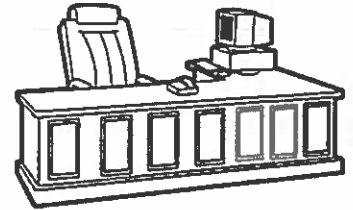

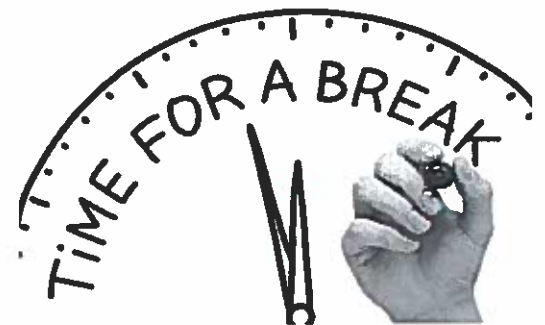

From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Trinity Family,

We are blessed to enter into the summer months of the year 2018. Hopefully this will offer time for you and your family to be able to spend more time together and to work in some trips to get away from the normal environment of everyday life. With this statement I think of our military personnel who are far away from their normal environments and, in some cases, in very dangerous places in the world. We do not hear a lot about the wars that continue to be fought as the news media chooses to focus on other things. However, for the families directly affected, it is no different than shortly after the tragedy of 911.

Every Memorial Day we are reminded of the cost of freedom as we remember and honor the fallen. This brings to mind an incredible ministry, *Faith Comes By Hearing*, which supports our men and women in uniform and their families through providing Bible Sticks to them. Bible Sticks are small digital audio players designed specifically for the safety of deployed troops. Each Bible Stick includes the complete Audio New Testament along with 65 minutes of selected Psalms. They are smaller than the size of your thumb and can easily be carried and listened to even in the heat of battle! How powerful it is to hear God's Word in the midst of danger and loneliness while being so far from home and family. Every time you provide a Military Bible Stick to our troops, they can request a free kids Bible and New Testament recording for their children and spouse. The family, though separated by distance, can listen to the Word Together.

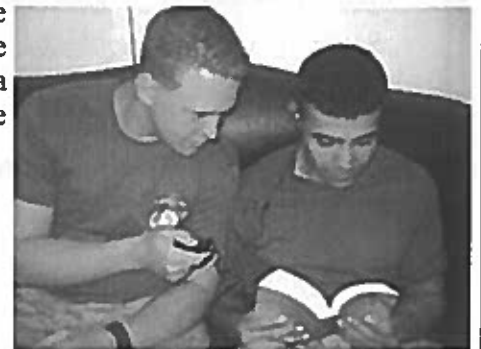
My wife, Lindy, and I had the wonderful opportunity to visit the headquarters of *Faith Comes By Hearing* last fall in Albuquerque, New Mexico. We met Ann Simmons, our congregational representative, and many other staff. We were treated royally in our visit and given an awesome tour of their facilities. It was an honor to hear from them that we, the Family of Trinity, are one of the greatest financial supporters of their Bible Stick ministry! I pray that we can continue, for the sake of our military personnel, to supply many Bible Sticks to them. Around 180,000 men and women enter and leave military service every year. We have the opportunity to provide them and their families hope and strength through God's Word.

Each year, in recent years, we have had a campaign to draw attention to this great mission and support it prayerfully and financially through special offerings given. This year our campaign began on Sunday, May 27th, over Memorial Weekend. We will continue this campaign until July 4th. Each Sunday during this period you will have the opportunity to give a special offering towards this effort. Each Bible Stick costs \$25. We exceeded our goal of \$2500 last year which provided over 100 soldiers and their families with Bible Sticks so that they could be in the Word of God together! I pray that we can exceed purchasing over 100 Bible Sticks again this year! Imagine the power of just one Bible Stick as we consider the power of God's Word that gives life and sustains life.

While our focus towards this ministry has been in support of the Bible Sticks it is important to understand that *Faith Comes By Hearing* also provides many other opportunities of hearing God's Word via smart phones. They provide written and/or audio versions of the Bible, or portions of it, currently in 1383 languages! I encourage you to download this app, *Bible.is*, onto your phone and become familiar with this great ministry. We have been praying for Lutheran Bible Translators and specifically, Michael Erslund who is currently serving among the Komba people in Ghana, Africa. If you check out this app you can look at the New Testament in the Komba language. As of now, it has not been produced in audio form. Many of these 1383 languages are currently also provided in audio formats. Imagine the power in witnessing to someone of another language? Simply forward via text or email the app and they instantly will have the Bible in their language to read!

Praise God for modern technology that can be used to His glory!

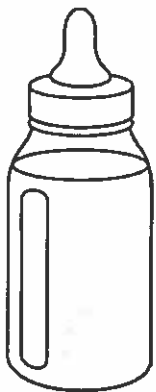

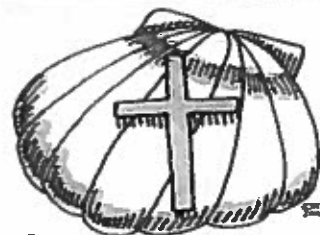

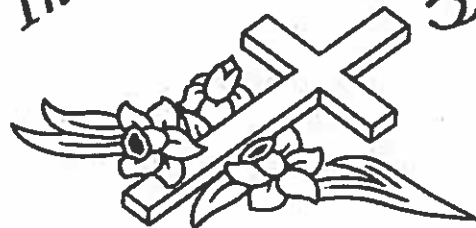
