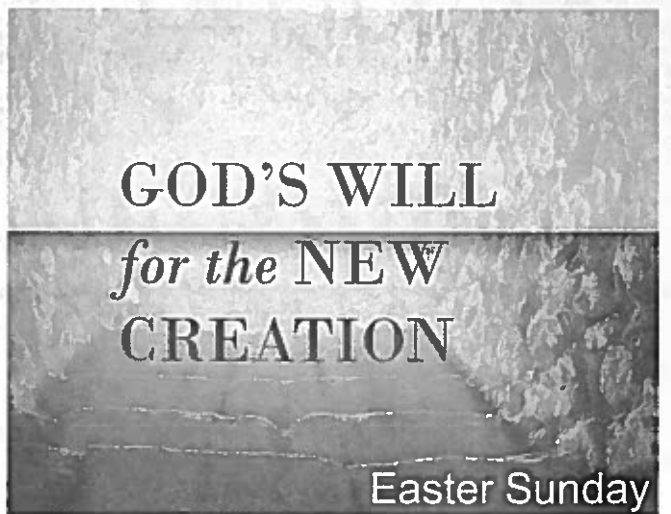

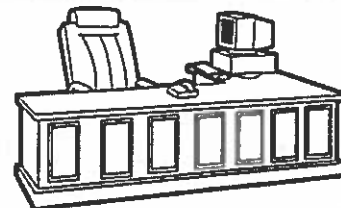

Counting the Cost

"Whoever does not bear his own cross and come after me cannot be my disciple." Luke 14:27

When the *Titanic* sank in the north Atlantic on April 15, 1912, it carried 2,200 passengers but had lifeboats for only 800. What a miscalculation!

Jesus set the record straight with regard to calculating the cost of discipleship. Following him is no picnic. It means loving Him more than one loves members of their family. It means receiving the same kind of hatred, contempt, and physical abuse heaped on Him.

Jesus cites cases of miscalculation – a man who had miscalculated the cost of building a tower and a king who underestimated the cost of a military campaign. Serious financial losses as well as ridicule followed. Jesus set the price of following Him high: "So therefore, any one of you who does not renounce all that he has cannot be my disciple" (Luke 14:33).

Jesus counted Himself in the cost of His redemptive ministry. Before His arrest in Jerusalem, He announced that He would be mocked, flogged, and crucified, adding, "On the third day He will be raised to life!" (Matthew 17:23) The outcome – Christ's resurrection and our guaranteed salvation – made the sacrifices worthwhile.

How thankful we are that Christ did not use *Titanic* arithmetic in providing salvation for only a few! St. Paul wrote to the Corinthians, "He died for all, that those who live might no longer live for themselves but for him who for their sake died and was raised." (2 Corinthians 5:15) We have no problem now in counting the cost of discipleship. We count it a privilege.

We are pleased to announce that the new stained glass window project is complete. The new windows were dedicated during both services on Sunday, February 11th. What a change to the sanctuary this has made. Not only will it help with heating and cooling, it is wonderful to see God's sunlight shining through the beautiful colored glass.

This project involved many people. Last year's Easter Love offerings, through the LWML, covered the cost of the clear glass and installation. Thank you everyone who gave to the Easter Love offering. Contributions given to the memorial fund of friends and loved ones were used to purchase the colored glass.

A big thank you to Virtus Einspahr, Peggy Peters, and Cathy Witte from the Memorial Committee who were the initial team that started this project. They helped with the design, using the colors of the Paraments in the glass and working with families to release memorial funds. Virtus worked with Moffat Paint and Glass, getting the bid for removal of old Plexiglas and the installation of impact resistant, double paned thermal glass to protect the stained glass.

Kevin Knief was instrumental in installing lighting to the three windows on the west side of the sanctuary. Kevin not only installed the lighting, but also did the wiring for the project.

Rod Heiden and I are currently working on name plaques for each window. Watch for these to be installed in a few weeks.

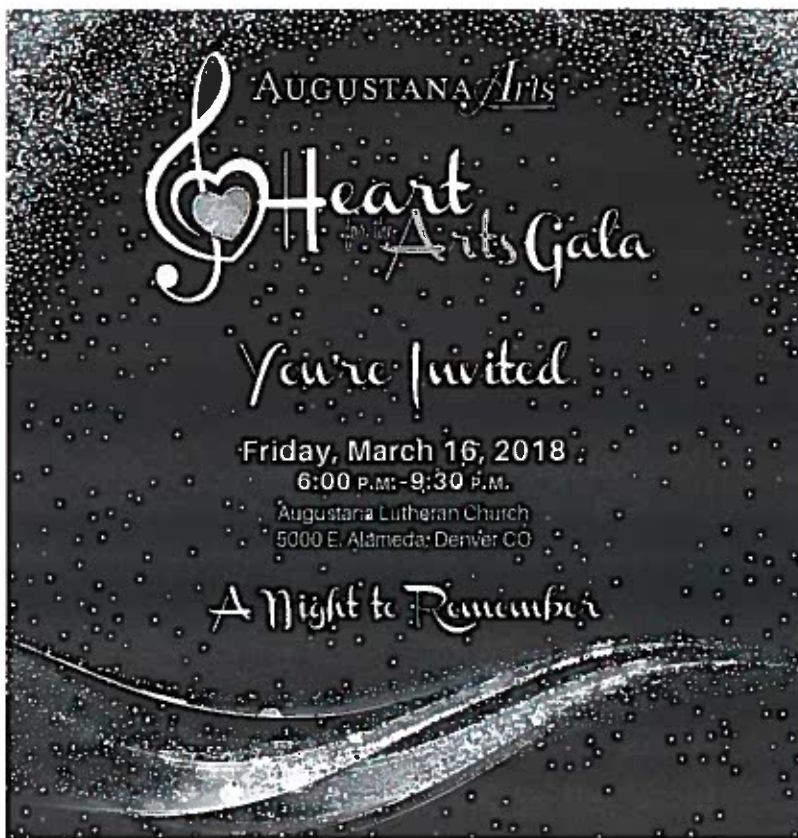
Cooks Night Out

Coupons will be available in the Church Narthex on Sunday, March 18th. Be sure to join us for food, fun and fellowship! See you there!

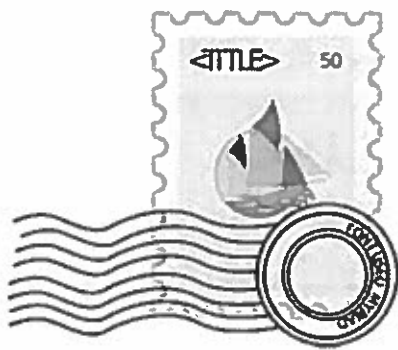
