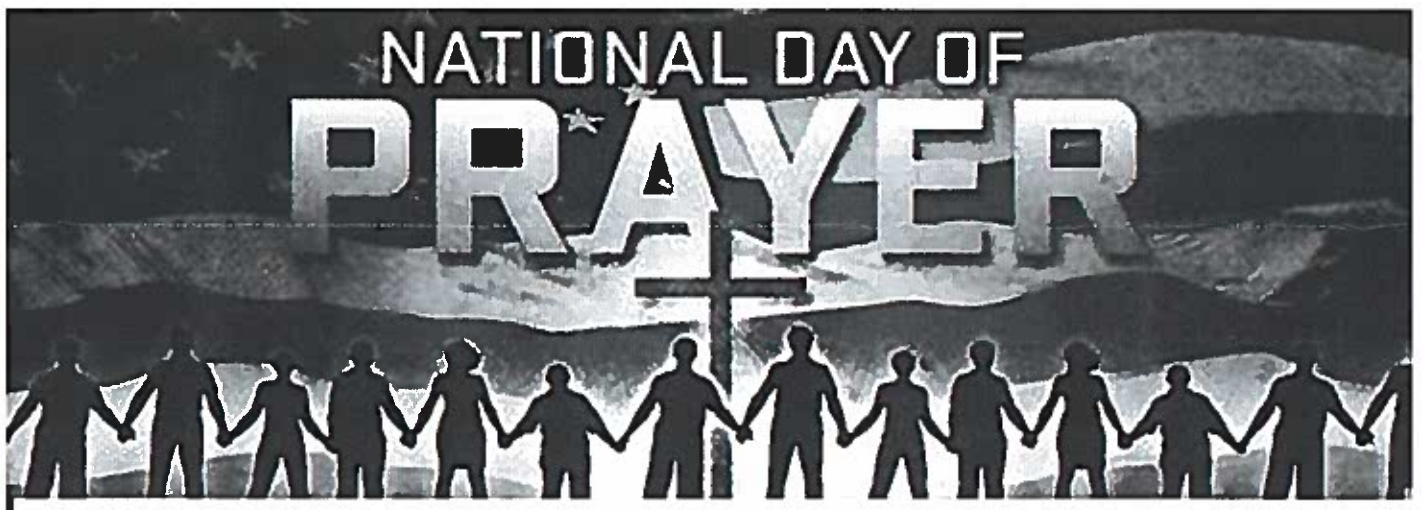

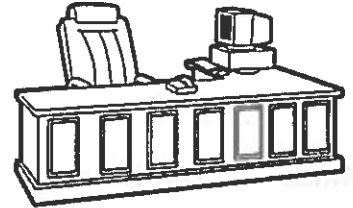

 - Started the “Embrace Grace” Bible Study group for pregnant mothers in conjunction with and support of the Pregnancy Resource Center
 - Upcoming Faith Day at a Rockies baseball game; more information and sign-up to follow
- The Board of Property Ministries
 - Preparing equipment for summer, will begin spring cleanup and gardening soon
 - Asphalt and concrete to be replaced at the light pole in church parking lot
 - Flashing around the cross at the back of the church being repaired
 - Replacing garbage disposal in Fellowship kitchen
- The Board of Education Ministries

A Note from the Editor: Last week I was blessed as I walked around the school, to run into a group of pioneers on the Oregon Trail. Mrs. Erickson's classroom had just finished reading "Little House on the Prairie" and although Laura Ingalls, the author, was never on the Oregon Trail, they thought this would be a fun way to conclude their "Pioneer" studies. Each student had made a covered wagon out of a regular wagon with blankets or sheets draped over ribs made out of PVC or pool noodles. In this life-size game of "Life", at the toss of the dice a student may be bitten by a snake, break a leg, run out of water or various other pitfalls in the American West. They constructed a raft out of scooters and loaded their wagons, one at a time to be ferried across the river. All along the way, Mrs. Erickson was their guide, always before them, showing them the way. It reminds me of the Israelites as they made their way through the wilderness on their way to the Promised Land. God was there guiding them as a pillar of cloud during the day and a pillar of fire at night. Looking closer at these journeys, they are not just about the physical travel to new or different homes, but a spiritual journey fraught with challenges, snake bites and much more. Sometimes we may find ourselves lost or wandering in the wilderness and may be tempted to just quit. God was always with His people the Israelites, and He is always with us as we seek His guidance on our life's journey. May we be Christian pioneers, always seeking His guidance and always moving towards our Lord and Savior. *"Show me your ways, O LORD, teach me your paths; guide me in your truth and teach me, for you are God my Savior, and my hope is in you all day long." Psalm 25:4-5*

All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them. Acts 2:4

On Pentecost, the Holy Spirit was poured out on the apostles, settling upon them with power and many gifts. These gifts included the ability to speak in other languages, as well as the knowledge of the Word of Christ, which the Spirit restored to their memories.

The Spirit still comes to the church and to individuals. And when he does, He brings many gifts - more than we can count. The prophet Isaiah mentions seven of them: The Spirit Himself, wisdom, understanding, counsel, power, knowledge, and the fear (or reverence) of the Lord.

These are gifts the Holy Spirit pours out on Christians today. In the confirmation rite, this is said to the catechumens: "God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, gives you His Holy Spirit, the Spirit of wisdom and knowledge, of grace and prayer, of power and strength, of sanctification and the fear of God."

The Spirit Himself is the greatest of these gifts for He converts us, bringing us to faith in Christ, our Lord and Savior. A "little Pentecost" occurs with every individual conversion.

Besides giving us Himself, the Spirit gives *wisdom*, making us wise unto salvation. He gives us *understanding*, the ability to distinguish properly concerning things. He gives us *counsel*, or good advice from the Counselor, for ourselves and to share with others; He gives us *might*, the power to prevail in and through faith; He gives us *knowledge*, knowing and believing in the true God and in Jesus Christ, whom He has sent; and finally, He gives us *fear*, which is not terror but proper respect for God and His Word.

Whatever day it is today - Sunday or any other day - let us give thanks for the Holy Spirit, the heavenly Guest who comes, bringing choice gifts.
