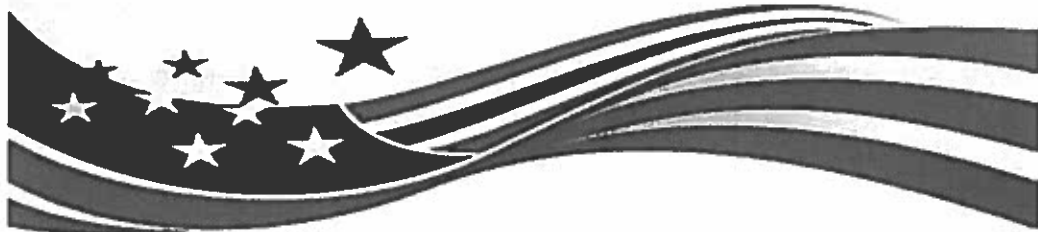

From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,
We are truly blessed to know, trust and accept God and all the promises that He provides to us! We are greatly blessed living in the security of everlasting life. We are blessed to know that God is in control. We are blessed to look forward to the plans and purposes that He has designed for us in the midst of each day of life that He provides to us. We are blessed to know that we are loved unconditionally now and for eternity. We are blessed to know that God is the provider of all things and that we need never worry or be anxious about anything. We are blessed with God's presence among us. He is real and present as we Lutherans celebrate this theme with our great school system throughout this year. We are blessed to live in the promises that God has revealed to us; especially the Kingdom of Glory in

heaven. We are blessed to have God's inerrant Word in written form; the Holy Bible. We are blessed with the Sacraments; the Lord's Supper and Baptism. How wonderful that God provides these as gifts to us. We cannot see God but we can see water and bread and wine. Through these visible means God promises incredible blessings. With the Lord's Supper we know, trust and accept that in, with and under the bread and wine are the very body and blood of Christ sacrificed for us so that we can have forgiveness from all our sin. There is no question, in light of these truths, what God's will is for you each day as you are in the midst of other people. Be extra aware of the opportunities for conversation. I have learned over the years how incredible it is in the ways that God intentionally sets us up with other people for the opportunity to have a hearing for the Gospel. I can remember seeing a neighbor struggling to replace a starter on his vehicle. It was obvious that he was becoming quite frustrated. I simply went over and asked if I could be of help. Together, we got the starter off and replaced and reinstalled. During that time we had great conversation. A relationship was established that carried on for several years! Do you think that was by chance? Absolutely not! God works in these ways for the sake of having a hearing for the Gospel. Have you ever noticed when you are interested in getting a different car and have a particular model in mind how suddenly you notice this model out on the road? Your mind has been refocused due to the interest. May we be in a similar mindset noticing those who seem to be separated from God and living without hope. May we prayerfully seek them out and look for the opportunities that God sets up for us to be able to dialogue with them. This Thanksgiving time is a perfect setup. Let's inform many and remind others of the source of all things for which to be thankful.

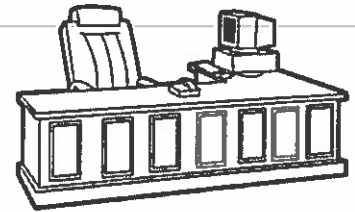

A Note from the Editor-Not long ago, I was talking with my grand children, when the subject of the holiday season came up. I asked them which holiday they were most looking forward to, expecting either Christmas or Halloween. I was surprised when they all shouted at the same time, Thanksgiving! The joy of God's love was eluding me. After the job of settling matters was finished, I no longer felt I had a purpose. I tried many things to fill my days. A friend suggested reading. Written as Christian fiction, God used it to re-awaken a desire to know Him more and I began reading the Bible and having a devotion time each day. I have learned that in order to have a relationship with God, I need to know Him and the best way for me to do that is to be in His Word. One of the chapters in the book that stood out to me was entitled, "The Gift of Gratitude", being grateful for everything God has given each of us. I have noticed that when I focus on the things of this world, the view of life is darker than when I focus on the things that are gifts from God. Call me Pollyanna, but I have found the benefit of the "Glad Game", focusing on the blessings God has given me rather than the challenges that the sins of this world lay on me. When the woes of the world lay heavy on me, I begin by thanking God for the beating of my heart as I quietly listen for it; then for the breath in my lungs as I take deep breaths. Slowly those woes fall off my shoulders and the many things that I am thankful for begin to cascade out in praise to God. We have a tradition at our Thanksgiving table, everyone adds something that they are thankful for to the prayer that we say before we begin to eat. 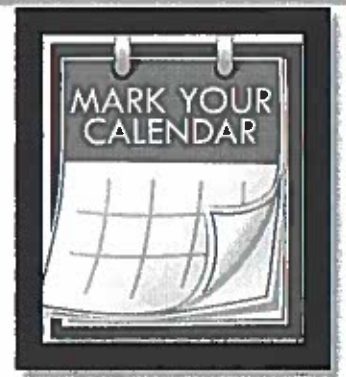

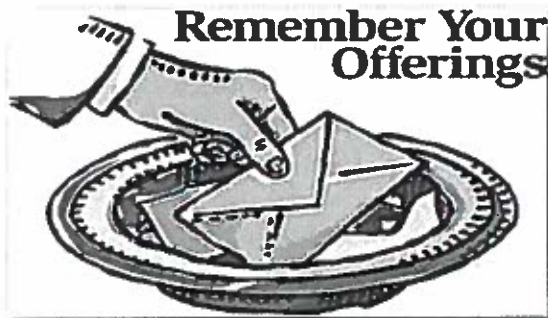

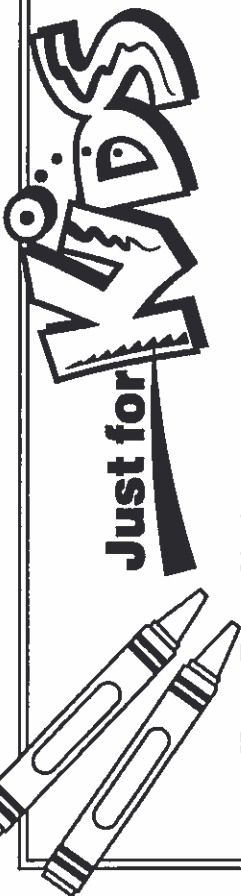
