


# Sin and Salvation

For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus. Romans 3:23-24

The Reformation began on October 31, 1517, when Martin Luther posted his Ninety-Five Theses on the door of the castle church in Wittenberg, Germany. It was long overdue.

Luther's theses reflect the two basic truths of the Law and the Gospel. Thesis I quoted Jesus' words calling for repentance, saying the "the whole life of believers should be one of penitence." The Gospel shines through, especially in Thesis 62: "The true treasure of the church is the holy Gospel of the glory and grace of God."

The first truth is Law, the Bible's message of the reality of sin. Through our first parents, Adam and Eve, sin has come down on all of humanity. Sin brings death as the penalty. The call to repentance goes out because "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God."

The next truth is Gospel, God's grace extending to all. This grace means free, unearned, and unmerited salvation: the forgiveness of sins, the promise of eternal life, and spiritual newness. Salvation by God's grace comes to us through the worthiness of Christ, who atoned for the sin of the world. By believing in Him as the risen Lord and Savior we become the beneficiaries of His righteousness and holiness. It is for His sake that God declares us righteous and holy. This is the doctrine of justification. It is the heart of the Gospel, the basis on which the Christian church stands.

The three truths "by grace alone," "for Christ's sake alone," and "through faith alone" have a fourth measure: "sola Scriptura." This is to say that the Bible is the only source of what is taught in the church.

Let us give thanks this October to God for restoring the Gospel in its purity and power.





### **Reformation is October 31st!**

"Luther's Seal" or Luther's Rose" is arguably the single image that best explains the theology of Martin Luther and the Reformation. In a 1530 letter to Lazarus Spengler, who helped design the seal. Luther writes:



From the wilderness of Koburg Castle -8 July 1530

Honorable, kind dear Sir and Friend! Grace and Peace in Christ!

Since you ask whether my seal has come out correctly, I shall answer most amiably and tell you of those thoughts which now come in my mind about my seal as a symbol of my theology. There is first to be a cross, black, and placed in a heart, which should be of its natural color (red), to put me in mind that faith in Christ crucified saves us. For if one believes from the heart, he will be justified. ["For it is by believing in your heart that you are made right with God, and it is by confessing with your mouth that you are saved." -Romans 10:10] Even though it is a black cross, which mortifies and which also should hurt us, yet it leaves the heart in its natural color and does not ruin nature...that is, the cross does not kill, but keeps man alive. For the just shall live by faith, by faith in the Savior. ["This Good News tells us how God makes us right in His sight. This is accomplished from start to finish by faith. As the Scriptures say, 'It is through faith that a righteous person has life."-Romans 1:17]

Such a heart is to be in the midst of a white rose, to symbolize that faith gives joy, comfort, and peace. In a word, it places the believer into a white joyful rose, for this faith does not give peace and joy as the world gives. ["I am leaving you with a gift—peace of mind and heart. And the peace I give isn't like the peace the world gives. So don't be troubled or afraid." -John 14:27] Therefore, the rose is to be white, not red, for white is the color of the spirits and of all the angels. ["..an angel of the Lord came down from heaven and rolled aside the stone and sat on it. His face shone like lightning, and his clothing was as white a snow." -Matthew 28:2b-3 and "She saw two white-robed angels sitting on the head and foot of the place where the body of Jesus had been lying." -John 20:12]

This rose, moreover, is fixed in a sky-blue field, symbolizing that such joy in the Spirit and in faith is a beginning of the future heavenly joy. It is already a part of faith, and is grasped through hope, even though not yet manifest.

And all around this field is a golden ring, to signify that such bliss in heaven is endless, and more precious than all joys and goods, just as gold is the most valuable and precious metal.

May Christ, our dear Lord, be with your spirit until the life to come. Amen.
