

Dear Family in Christ,

I am really excited about our Lutheran School's theme for the year; "Real. Present. God." I do not know if we consider or appreciate enough the fact that God is so intimately present with each of His precious children every moment of every day.

Just think about the beginning of your life; "From one man He made every nation of men that they should inhabit the whole earth and He determined the times set for them and the exact places where they should live. (Acts

17:26) From eternity past God already knew you and the time and place where you would be born! You did not come into being by chance or accident. This is why each human life is so valuable and should be greatly respected. Then that precious time came; "For You created my inmost being; You knit me together in my mother's womb . . . Your eyes saw my unformed body." (Psalm 139:13, 16a)

God continues to affirm His presence with us throughout our lives; "God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble." (Psalm 46:1) Jesus promises that He is always with you; "And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." (Matthew 28:20b) As Israel was ready to enter the promise land by God's directive, Moses affirms to them these words of assurance from God; "Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid or terrified because of them, for the LORD your God goes with you; He will never leave you nor forsake you." (Deuteronomy 31:6) God's Word, His promises, are timeless. 


The Elders are working on making sure we have information available for those who need help with services and planning for elderly family members, or them selves. There are copies of the following in the church office:

- * Seniors BlueBook, a helpful little book with lots of information on resources. This would be good for families to have a copy at hand.



Thank you for welcoming me to Trinity! I had heard about what a loving and supportive environment this place is, and I am seeing it first-hand each day. I'm still working to get all the "ducks in a row" for the preschool – but I'm still finding new stray ducks each day. Luckily I have a great team helping me get it together. Katlyn Dick will serve as my




Classroom assistant in one preschool room. Mary Schultz will be assisted by Esther Morris in the other preschool room. Afternoon childcare will be covered by Viola Thompson and Kaylea Kesterson. Please pray for each of these ladies as we serve the youngest group of Trinity students.

Our goal is to have 40 preschool students this year. As I write this, we are 1 student short of that goal. We do have a couple 2 or 3 day openings and we still take new students after the start of the school year, so keep referring people to us.

One of the most pressing needs right now is additional classroom chairs. We are following a lead to purchase some from another Lutheran school that recently closed. If we need to purchase chairs new, they are typically \$30 each. Watch for an update next month; we may do a chair drive this fall to get additional chairs and replace some of the ones that are showing a lot of wear-and-tear.

At our preschool staff meeting, we talked about continuing school improvement. There are things we do well now, but how can we become exceptional? That will be our focus this year. We will meet monthly and review the minimum licensing rules and regulations and state standards and look for those ways to keep getting better.


