The "If" Is Removed"

If only for this life we have hope in Christ, we are to be pitied more than all men (1 Corinthians 15:19)



After the *Titanic* struck an iceberg on April 14, 1912, Anna Turga was told to go to a higher deck. But she was cold and decided to go to a lower deck where it was warmer. She was then saved. Years later her son wrote, "The decision turned out to be crucial. Most of the people on the upper deck drowned."

So often life seems to depend on "if," on a certain condition for better or for worse. This is especially true of events on which our eternal salvation depends. What if Christ had not risen from the dead? St. Paul wrote what the results would have been: the dead would not rise, all hope would be lost, our faith would be futile. There would be no Easter – no reason for the things we do as Christians: pray, worship, minister. This also would apply, "If only for this life we have hope in Christ, we are to be pitied more than all men."

However, the "if" is canceled and all these outcomes are avoided. Christ did indeed rise from the dead. Christ Jesus "died for our sins according to the Scriptures ... was buried ... was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures" (1 Corinthians 15:3-4). The apostles and many others knew this for sure for they had seen and heard and touched the risen Lord for themselves.

And today we rejoice in a faith that is valid. It rests on this promise of Jesus: "I am the Resurrection and the Life. He who believes in Me will live, even though he dies; and whoever lives and believes in Me will never die" (John 11:25-26). It follows, as St. Paul declared, "No matter how many promises God has made, they are 'yes' in Christ" (2 Corinthians 1:20).

"Life is a journey, not a destination." Ralph Waldo Emerson

As we enter into the month of April, the word JOURNEY swarms my mind. We are observing Jesus' journey to the cross, but that doesn't mean we confuse that with his destination. Let us also continue to journey with Jesus as we "take up our crosses daily and follow him." Luke 9:23

Our middle school students, along with their teachers, Mrs. Angela Erickson, and Mr. Brian Wilcox will be on a journey to Washington DC April 29 through May 3. This trip will include: the Smithsonian Museums, the Holocaust Museum, a Capitol Tour with a Senator, watching a Nationals baseball game, Arlington National Cemetery, the National Zoo, Mount Vernon, and Ford's Theatre. Our middle school students have been fundraising for the past three years to cover all expenses for this trip. The main fundraising opportunities have been the school hot lunch program and the Christmas Store. We ask for prayers for the final preparations and for this part of the journey

Throughout the month of April, we will be collecting gently used shoes for an Angel Bins school fundraiser. For every pound of shoes that we collect, we will receive money. A drop-off box will be available at the front of the school.

As we talked about the Lenten season, your preschool teachers, Miss Marshall and Mrs. Mary, made some plans to help the season be meaningful to our young students. Many of our preschool families have no church home or attend churches that do not observe many of the traditions of the Lenten season.

The highest priority was that the children continue to go to the Lord's house regularly. In previous years, the preschool class didn't always attend the morning Lent service with the elementary students, but they are attending this year. Ash Wednesday was the first time many of them had experienced the imposition of ashes.

Pretzels are a traditional Ash Wednesday snack. Each child took home a small bag of pretzels to share with the family with a little poem reminding them that Lent is a time of prayer. Each classroom has also added activities to the daily routine to observe the Lenten season. In Miss Marshall's class, each child made a bead cross the first week of Lent. They were encouraged to wear it as a necklace, carry it in their back pack or find a place to display it. The class also added an extra prayer time to the day. A prayer bucket is on the classroom altar. The helper for the day chooses a slip of paper from the bucket listing the prayer topic for the day. We have prayed for doctors and nurses, our pastor and friends.

In Mrs. Mary's class, the children made Lenten lap books. On the cover, they colored a picture of Jesus, dying on the cross for our sins. They learned that Lent is a thoughtful, prayerful, quiet time of the church year, as we remember that Jesus loves us so much that He died on the cross to pay for the sins of the world. Inside their books, they color a square each day on the Lenten path to Easter. They glued the Lord's Prayer and John 3:16 in their books, and they were encouraged to pray these each day. In an envelope inside their books, is hidden a colorful paper ALLELUIA, which they will open on Easter Sunday, as we celebrate the Resurrection. He is risen indeed, Alleluia!

We will be inviting the preschool families to the "Journey to the Cross" event and Holy Week services at Trinity. Pray that the Holy Spirit will use our instruction, school activities and our worship experiences to grow the faith of these little ones and that the Good News of sins forgiven and a risen Savior touch the hearts of their family members.





Note from the Editor: "Is it spring yet?" Surprisingly, these words are not from my grand children, but from my friends. The anticipation of spring seems to grow more as we tire of the cold and snow. Even though the equinox in March suggests the arrival of spring, it is often April that confirms it. Remember the rhyme we learned in elementary school, "April showers bring May flowers"? Here in Colorado, those "showers" can be snow or rain even in April, but spring is a time of new beginnings. In the old testament, the Passover marked a new beginning for the Israelites. They left their lives of slavery in Egypt and followed God as He led them to the Promised Land. 
