



Dear Family in Christ,

I pray that your life and the life of your loved ones would be filled with the grace and mercy and love of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ!

What a joy it is to journey together, united in faith, through this Epiphany season. One of the great historical events that we often visit this time of the year is Jesus' baptism (see Matthew 3:13-17; Mark 1:9-11; Luke 3:21-22; John 1:32-34). Remember when Jesus comes to John the Baptist requesting to be baptized by him? John, a sinner, was shocked at Jesus' request because he knew Jesus was

without sin and not in need of baptism. However, he obeyed Jesus after Jesus responded to him with these words, "Let it be so now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness." Jesus submitted to John's Baptism, the same baptism the sinners were undergoing in order to affirm His identity with sinners and to provide them with perfect righteousness. Remember what God inspired Paul to write concerning Jesus, "God made Him (Jesus) Who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in Him (Jesus) we might become the righteousness of God." (2 Corinthians 5:21) What an incredible mission our Lord was on from the time that He was conceived by the Holy Spirit (free from Original Sin); filled the Law perfectly through His perfect obedience as true man; and then, shed His blood for the sins of all people of all time at the cross where He died. Of course, we are blessed to live in the fulfillment of His resurrection from the dead and to know that the victory over sin, death and Satan has been won. The perfect One did not need baptism but baptism needed the perfect One. So, through the work and power of Jesus Christ, our baptism receives its power to accomplish for us the great things promised by God. Here is a listing of just a few:

"You are all sons of God through faith in Christ Jesus, for all of you who were **baptized** into Christ have **clothed yourselves with Christ**." (Galatians 3:26-27)

"Repent and be **baptized**, every one of you, in the name of Jesus Christ **so that your sins may be forgiven**." (Acts 2:38)

"Whoever believes and is baptized will be saved." (Mark 16:16)

"He saved us not because of righteous things we had done, but because of His mercy. He saved us through the washing of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, whom He poured out on us generously through Jesus Christ our Savior, so that, having been justified by His grace, we might become heirs having the hope of eternal life." (Titus 3:5-7)



Wow! Talk about abundant blessings through the gift of baptism; clothed with Jesus perfect righteousness, forgiven, saved, given an inheritance and receiving the hope of and security of eternal life! In your personal baptism (Do you remember the date?) God called you personally, by name, to be His child. Jesus now shares life with you. You are never alone. He is always, by His promise, in your presence. Talk about security.

Think about all of the "in Christ" passages in Scripture. Here are a few:

"For in Christ Jesus you are all sons of God, through faith." (Galatians 3:26)

"Therefore, if anyone is **in Christ**, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come." (2 Corinthians 5:17)

"For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ shall all be made alive." (1 Corinthians 15:22)

Through baptism, the Lord has called us into fellowship with Him; we, the baptized, are sons and daughters of God; we are a new creation; and we have been made alive in the Lord! Let us then approach life with confidence and courage seeking God's will being honored to "do" life with Him, now, and for eternity.

President Mike Thuener welcomed everyone. Vice President Cheri Carsten asked each board to review their 5 year plans, develop goals for 2019, and report back to share their 2019 Goals with the entire council. All boards reported back as follows:

Board Planning Reports:

- The Board of Elders and Spiritual Ministries
 - The board affirmed Gary Klipp as Chair
 - 2019 Goals:
 - Take the Gospel to the community
 - Seek publication opportunities, e.g. radio, newspaper, social media
 - Expand outreach to school families
 - Interact with the "kid community" via events such as parade floats, Stampede, football, basketball, & volleyball
- The Board of Property Ministries
 - Affirmed Dan Jecminek as Chair
 - 2019 Goals:
 - Examine the possibility of a defibrillator. Steve Cooper has a source, and estimated \$1000.00 cost. Virtus Einspahr advised there may be funds available from the Easter Love offerings
 - School parking lot resurfacing there is a possibility that recycled asphalt could be used, and repairs could be done in-house
 - ♦ Doors in the church need weather stripping replaced
 - Playground sandbox this will be done as soon as weather permits
 - Phase 3 Narthex expansion costs are being explored. We have learned if we use the Fellowship Hall for expansion of Sunday School classes, costs to update would involve a drop ceiling, electrical changes and adding a chair lift, all which come to over \$75,000

 - Affirmed Linda Klipp & Pam Clavir as Co-Chairs
 - 2019 Goals:
 - ♦ #I goal is GROWTH!
 - ♦ Financial:
 - ♦ Scholarship—Solicit outside resources to decrease \$ requested from congregation.
 - ◊ Put the Youth ministry in the budget.
 - Facility/Campus:
 - ◊ Finish the playground.
 - **♦ More efficient security system.**
 - Outreach/Events:
 - ◊ Increase fellowship church/school.
 - **◊** Subcommittee for the youth/Christian education.
 - ♦ Evangelism for the unchurched—help to grow our numbers.
- The Board of Financial and Stewardship Ministries
 - Affirmed Kristen Meritt as Chair
 - 2019 Goals:
 - Electronic giving via website is being explored
 - Treasurer's succession plan, as Vicki Akin will be leaving after this term
 - ♦ Electronic giving kiosk possibility is being explored
 - Mike Thuener asked board members to consider giving a presentation to the church as to how the congregation can get Scrip online.

Mike closed with thanks to all for their time and hard work. He is looking forward to working with them all this year. Pastor closed the meeting with prayer, and all joined in The Lord's Prayer. We adjourned at 10:00 a.m.

Ingathering will focus on Mites for National LWML's deadline on March 31, 2019!


We will also collect Toilet Paper and Feminine Hygiene Products for a local food pantry.



A Note from the Editor-Evidence of God's hand in my life is all around, but one area that I find most interesting is His use of His Word. I just finished Genesis which concludes with the story of Joseph. I have heard and read the story of Joseph since I was a child in Sunday School, and yet this time the account touched my heart in a way it had not before. I had always looked at it from the perspective of God's sovereignty, how God put Joseph where he needed him to be, to save the Israelites from the famine and bring them to Egypt. This time I saw more prominently the forgiveness. Even though his brothers sold him into slavery, Joseph forgave them. Joseph was confident in God's plan and protection for him, giving thanks to God for the blessings he received in this foreign land. It's difficult sometimes to give thanks to God when we are feeling wounded or betrayed. With recent events bringing old hurts back to the forefront in my life, God's Word, through Joseph's story, guides me. The devotions that accompanied my Bible Study challenged me to answer the questions, "Am I a forgiving person?" and "Am I quick to forget offenses against me?" The first question I felt confident was a yes, I am a forgiving person. However, I waivered on whether I was quick to forget. Define "quick". I have been known to "chew" on offenses until all the flavor is gone and then chew some more. As I examined my heart in this matter, I asked myself if I have really forgiven if I have not forgotten? Psalms 103:12 tells us "as far from the east is from the west, so far has he removed our transgressions from us." If I have experienced God's forgiveness in Christ, (and I have daily) then shouldn't that be motivation for me to forgive others in the same way, to cast their offenses as far as the east is from the west? You may have heard this saying, "Not forgiving is like drinking poison and expecting the other person to die." Perhaps one should add, "it hardens your heart to God's love." As we approach February and National Heart Month, perhaps we should examine our hearts. Ask God to guide us in forgiving and forgetting past transgressions against us and to give us the peace that only total forgiveness can bring. May your heart be healthy, full of love and forgiveness. "Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you." Ephesians 4:32
