

ORIGINS: On January 13, 1984, President Ronald Reagan issued a proclamation designating January 22 as the first National Sanctity of Human Life Day. (January 22, 1973, was the day the U.S. Supreme Court legalized abortion-on-demand in all 50 states.) Churches around the United States use the day to celebrate God's gift of life, commemorate the many lives lost to abortion, and commit themselves to protecting human life at every stage.

Churches continue to recognize the third Sunday in January as Sanctity of Human Life Sunday. In 2019, the date will be January 20.

To commemorate this day, we will be accepting donations of diapers for newborns or gift cards (Walmart, etc.). These will be given to the Resource Center to assist them in their efforts of helping women with unplanned pregnancies, and protecting the lives of the unborn.

Grace and Peace In Christ

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. (I Corinthians 1:3)

Each star in the night sky has a wonderful secret. What we see as only a twinkle of light is actually the blaze of a brilliant, distant sun. Consider what that tiny sparkle really is, and you will appreciate a star's true majesty and power.

Our Bible verse is just a brief thought. But it's like a star. Although this verse is small, it has a wonderful message. Consider what these words are saying, and you will appreciate the true majesty and power of our Savior's love for us.

The Gentiles once greeted one another with a Greek word that resembled "grace."

The Jews said and still say, "Shalom," meaning "Peace." The Holy Spirit guided Paul to join these two thoughts as a special greeting in his New Testament letters. For Christians of all time, these words are like a diamond ring on a bride's finger. They remind us of love and faithfulness, the Father's love-in-action for us in Christ.



Grace points to the way God feels about us and treats us. Grace is kindness, generosity and love shown even to those who do not deserve them. Because we are all sinners, we deserved punishment. But God gives us love. We often forget to thank him. We often live as though he isn't even there and as though he will never return. But the Lord cares for us. He has forgiven our sins through Jesus. He watches over us and blesses us. God shows us grace.

Grace brings us peace with God. This peace does not come from us. It isn't just how we feel or something we must make for God. Jesus created this peace for us. He did this by keeping his Father's law perfectly for us and by suffering on the cross the punishment for our sins. The Holy Spirit reminds us of what Jesus has done. Through God's Word, the peace we have moves us to trust the Lord more and more. It moves us to live thankful lives in harmony with God's Word.

Trouble, worry and our own sinful weakness often bring a shadow over this peace. But they can never overcome it. How can we be sure? God our Father and his Son our Lord have created grace and peace for us. The cross guarantees this gift forever. We are ready and waiting for Christ's return.

What a wonderful message is in this one little verse! Whenever you hear these words, remember God's great gift of love to you!

Lord, may our lives be a thankful answer to your grace and peace.

HIGHLIGHTS OF DECEMBER'S VOTER'S MEETING

New Congregation Officers:

President – Michael Thuener Vice-President — Cheri Carsten Secretary — Elaine Jecminek

All boards confirmed their members as is, with the addition of James Roohr to the Board of Christian Education.

Treasurer Vicki Akin, shared a trending report for income.

At the end of November 2014, the Envelope Offerings Calendar Year to Date were \$479,722.95 and have steadily trended down so that the end of November 2018 Calendar Year to Date Envelope Offerings were \$398,805.00 (nearly \$100,000 less over a 4 year period). By contrast, the school tuition has trended upwards with 2014 at \$139,348.12 and 2018 at \$236,476.96.

Please remember both the church and the school in your daily prayers.

Council Minutes of the November 10, 2018 Meeting - Approved and posted to the website.

Treasurer's Report through December 5, 2018 - Reviewed and approved.

Board Reports

- The Board of Elders and Spiritual Ministries
 - Plan to hold another elderly services resource seminar in March
 - Discussed how to handle follow-ups with visitors
 - Pew renovation will be completed by next week
- The Board of Property Ministries
 - Facility maintenance is status quo
 - Bid for replacing carpet in the school library is \$5,000 but there may be an opportunity to apply for a Scholastic grant.
 - Putting together info on basement remodel for additional room for Bible studies
 - Preschool playground leveled off with road base, will change fencing again, and sandboxes are ordered
- The Board of Education Ministries
 - DCE reported Embrace Grace received a grant and donation
 - Currently 40 preschoolers with 20 eligible for kindergarten. Kyle and Gwen are working to bridge the transition. Annual Roundup will be at the end of January.
 - Kyle replaced all school computers with a tech-card Tech Cart and is now able to go room-to-room with Chrome Books
 - No K-8 tuition increase next year but a 5% increase for preschool
 - Scholarship fund balance at the end of fund raising period is \$32,000; goal is \$40,000 by end of school year
 - Kyle focusing on TLS sponsorship program with area businesses. Flyers available at the church and school.
- The Board of Financial and Stewardship Ministries
 - Cash flow is okay
 - · Reviewed presentations for Voters Meeting
 - Two boxes of additional giving envelopes ordered for back-up and visitors. Also added 12 envelopes for monthly scholarship donations next year.
 - Looking into the LCMS credit union for credit card processing. Plan to have a donation button on the new church website.

Old Business

Voters Meeting, Election of Officers, and all Board confirmations on Sunday, Dec. 9th at 12:30 pm plus nominations for Synodical President, First Vice President, and/or Area Vice President.

New Business

All Boards Meeting in conjunction with the new Council members will include goal setting and a review of each Board's five-year plan on January 12th at 8:00 am.

Church and School leaders will be encouraged to use the Scrip program. Box top collections for the school are still profitable and on-going.

Staff luncheon scheduled on the last day of school, December 21st in lieu of staff gifts this year.

2019 OFFERING ENVELOPES —are here! Numbers have changed, so *please* do not use the 2019 envelopes until Sunday, January 6th or your contributions may not be credited correctly to **YOUR** account.



Did you know: if you **do not** mark your giving envelope, all monies go into the "General Fund". If you write an amount in on the line for either Missions or Building Fund, those monies are accumulated and at the end of each calendar month, distributed accordingly.

Did you know: those who mark their envelopes with amounts for Missions allow Trinity to send between \$10K to \$15K per year to the Rocky Mountain District for the missions selected.

Did you know: that when you write an amount in the Building Fund space on your giving envelope, that those monies are added to the LCEF mortgage payment each month, to pay down the mortgage loan principal. An average month sees our loan being paid down by more than \$1000.00. Take that times 12 months and we just made an additional monthly payment.

In addition, less interest is paid from our loan payment and more goes towards the principal.

To recap:

*Current Expenses: goes to paying our bills, water, electric, insurance, gas, salaries, etc.

*Missions: goes directly to Rocky Mountain District for the missions they have selected

*Building Fund: is added monthly to the mortgage payment as additional principal

We give because God first gave to us! Everything we have, everything we are, are gifts from God.




