


In 2018 the Pregnancy Resource Center had:

We have been blessed to see Gospel singers, Dave Andersen and Roger Walck, and hear amazing Gospel music along with incredible ministry and miracle stories. We have journeyed together through Trinity Lutheran School's talent

show and the graduation of our eighth grade student, Michael Sweet. We also experienced the wonderful grace of God extended to Michael at his graduation ceremony; he was baptized! We were blessed to see seven of our youth confirmed into the LCMS and become communicate members of Trinity. As we reflect back upon these incredible events we are reminded of how blessed we are as God's people and to be in fellowship with our church and school family at Trinity.

Now, the excitement continues. We support a number of various mission efforts through prayer, acknowledgment and financial support. We have completed our annual campaign to raise funds for the production and distribution of BibleSticks, through Faith Comes By Hearing ministries based out of Albuquerque, NM. These are mp3 players with all of the New Testament and selected Psalms downloaded to them so that our military personnel can listen to God's Word even in very dangerous situations and places; even in the heat of battle. What a blessing. We also, annually, support our local Pregnancy Resource Center here in Greeley. This center serves as a support to women with unplanned pregnancies. They have helped guide several mothers into recognizing the precious human life that is in their womb. Several abortions have been prevented through the counseling that they provide. Praise God for saving lives! This campaign, to raise funds to support this great ministry, runs from Mother's Day to Father's Day. Plastic baby bottles are handed out during this time for the purpose of collecting money in them and then returning them on the Sunday of Father's Day. It is not too late for this offering if you desire to contribute to it. Just call the church office.

The excitement continues this month. We are blessed to have one of our missionaries whom we support, Rev. Roy Askins, stop in and visit with us at Trinity. Here is a brief description of God's work that he is entrusted to accomplish by God's grace:

Rev. Roy Askins serves the Lord as a career missionary through The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) in Chiayi, Taiwan, Republic of China. Roy is the director of communications for the Asia Pacific and the Southern Asia and Oceania regions. He helps to share the story of what God is doing through LCMS personnel, partner church bodies and all believers, using print media, video, social media and the Internet. These resources are used to enlighten the church worldwide and encourage LCMS congregations and members to pray for and consider supporting those serving in these regions and around the world.

Roy will give a special presentation to our family of Trinity on Wednesday, June 12th, at 7 pm. I hope that you can come to listen and learn more details about the incredible mission work that is happening in the region of Asia and meet one of our missionaries in person. "Dealing with Good and Evil"

"Do not repay evil with evil or insult with insult, but with blessing, because of this you were called so that you may inherit a blessing. 1 Peter 3:9

We heard the scientific theory that for every action there is an opposite and equal reaction. This principle can be applied to daily life as well. Good or evil actions usually cause one of four reactions.

The first kind of reaction is to repay *good with evil*, and this kind of exchange is devilish. The second reaction is to reward *evil with evil*. This is the law of the jungle: and eye for an eye, a tooth for a tooth. The third is to reward *good with good*; this is humane but it isn't too difficult. People give us gifts, and we give them gifts. Friends invite us to dinner, and we return the favor. The fourth reaction is to reward *evil with good*. This is divine; this is being Christ-like.

Just to say we "ought" to reward evil with good is mere moralizing. More must be added to the formula, as Peter does in the passage above. Then this: "For Christ died for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring you to God. He was put to death in the body but made alive by the Spirit" (1 Peter 3:18).

Christ not only gives us an example, He gives us the power to do as He has done. By His wounds we are healed from the darkness of sin and the desire for revenge. We are spiritually healed by the best medicine ever administered: the redeeming love of Christ. "He himself bore our sins in his body on the tree, so that we might die to sins and live for righteousness; by his wounds you have been healed" (1 Peter 2:24).

Yes, by His wounds we are able to repay evil with good!

Note from the Editor: I realized as I drove to work the other day, that it has been an unusually long time since I have seen green leafy trees. Of course, it's normal for trees to loose their leaves in the fall and be bare all winter, but last summer the hail stripped the leaves off of all my trees to the point that I wondered if they would ever come back. I should know better, God's hand is always at work and sure enough, those tender young leaves were there shimmering in the bright morning sunlight against a cloudless blue sky, a beautiful picture reminding me of God's loving handiwork. It's easy to forget that God is always there taking care of everything. The temptation to worry, plan, or find ways to solve my challenges myself is always there. It takes a conscious effort to remind myself to just take a step back and get out of God's way. One of the most challenging things for me to do is to "Wait for the Lord" and seemingly do nothing. I have come to realize, that in reality I am not doing "nothing", but rather I am exercising my trust in God. Sometimes it can be really hard to wait for the Lord, to just trust in God without worrying, planning, or trying to come up with my own solution for a challenge. A devotion ${f I}$ studied a few weeks ago was on Jesus' words in John 15 explaining that He is the grapevine, God the Father is the gardener and I am a branch. I often reflect, in my conversations with God, on whether I am producing good fruit or if He is disappointed in my fruit and I should try harder lest I end up on the chopping block. Isaiah talks about God being disappointed in Israel, much like a gardener would be in a fruitless vineyard. God the Father sent His son Jesus Christ to represent everyone that God has ever called to be His own. Not only did Jesus lay down His life to pay for my sins, but everything God wants His people to be, Jesus is. I should not worry about my fruitlessness if I let Jesus live in me. He is fruitful on my behalf. I'm not a horticulture expert, but when I think about it, that's what branches do, they sit on the vine. They do nothing. They wait for the Lord. They trust in God. Branches don't just put their mind to it and produce fruit, the vine is their lifeblood and the fruit comes from the vine. If a branch is separated from the vine, it cannot bear fruit. As summer approaches, may you find joy in doing nothing, peace while you wait for the Lord, and confidence in your daily exercise of trusting in God, with the knowledge that when Jesus lives in you, there will be an abundance of fruitfulness. Jesus tells us, "I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener. He cuts off every branch that bears no fruit, while every branch that does bear fruit he prunes so that it will be even more fruitful... Remain in me, and I will remain in you. No branch can bear fruit by itself; it must remain in the vine. Neither can you bear fruit unless you remain in me." John 15:1, 2, 4


