Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we enter into the month of March we are approaching the beginning of another season of the Church Year. We have been blessed, in recent weeks, to celebrate the season of Epiphany (showing forth) and to experience from God's Word the many revelations given concerning this One Who was born as a babe in Bethlehem, Jesus Christ, God and Savior. We began this season with the Magi seeking "the One Who has been born King of the Jews" and concluding with Jesus' transfiguration where He revealed His glory, in the flesh, to Peter, James and John and now, also, to us.

As we leave the season of Epiphany the mood of worship changes. Lent is a season of preparation leading up to Easter. It is the forty days plus the six Sundays before Easter. Joy gives way to penitence as we begin to commemorate the suffering and death of Jesus Christ. For centuries, it has been observed as a special time of self examination and penitence. Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent and establishes the theme that we stand as sinners condemned to die but for the grace of God. This is symbolized by the imposition of ashes on the forehead, with the words, "You are dust and to dust you shall return." In the Old Testament, ashes were a sign of penitence (feeling regretful for sin) and mourning. This season reaches its climax on Good Friday and comes to an end on Holy Saturday; the Saturday before Easter Sunday.

You will notice that the colors of the paraments change to purple during the Lenten season along with the pastor's stole. Purple, like black, is a penitential color in contrast to a festive one and is appropriately used during Lent which has come to represent somberness and solemnity, penitence, and prayer. Jesus, the king of the Jews, wore a purple robe only once. As the soldiers mocked and tormented him, the Scriptures record they placed on him a "purple garment" in order to ridicule him and belittle the claim that he was a monarch. Therefore, purple is used during this penitential season of Lent as a vivid reminder of the contempt and scorn he endured and the subsequent sacrifice he made for our eternal salvation. Ecclesiastical purple should remind all Christians of their daily need to humbly give attention to leading a life of repentance.

This year for midweek worship we will focus on the "Sermon on the Mount." This series for Lent takes parishioners through some of the most familiar teachings of Jesus from his Sermon on the Mount in Matthew 5-7 and relates them to the events surrounding Christ's life, death and resurrection. In the process, the services will powerfully reveal that the cross itself is the ultimate "sermon on the mount" for our journey of faith in this sacred season. Here are the weekly themes: Ash Wednesday • Blessed Are You • Matthew 5:1-11 Ash Wednesday reminds us that though we have been brought low by sin, our Lord will bless us with new life in him through the cross. Week I • Salt and Light • Matthew 5:13-16 Christ calls us to be salt and light in this world of sin. We who have tasted and seen his great love for us on the cross can spend our Lent savoring his salvation and shining with his glory and grace in the places where he has put us. Week 2 • Prayer and Fasting • Matthew 6:5-18 Lent is a season of prayer and fasting. We grow in our relationship with Christ by communicating with him, and we learn more about him and ourselves by giving up those things that can distract us from our connection to him. Week 3 • Do Not Worry • Matthew 6:25-34 So much of our lives, even in Lent, is spent worrying about what might happen or what has happened. Christ teaches us to stop being anxious, but simply to trust that he knows what is best and will take care of us to the very end. Week 4 • Judge Not • Matthew 7:1-5 We live in a very judgmental world, so Jesus' advice not to judge sounds radical to our modern ears. When we leave all judgment up to God, we free ourselves to look at one another through fresh and forgiving eyes. Week 5 • Build on Rock • Matthew 7:24-27 We build our lives on very shaky foundations, and then we are surprised when things start collapsing. Jesus reminds us in his teachings that the only solid foundation is himself, the Rock of our salvation. On him alone we build.

Services will be offered each Wednesday, , March 6th thru April 10th, at 10:00 am and 7:00 pm.

Trinity Lutheran Church Executive Council Minutes February 9, 2019

The meeting was called to order at 8:45 a.m. by Mike Thuener and opened with a prayer led by Pastor.

Quorum was established. Present at the meeting were Pastor Hafeman, Mike Thuener, Cheri Carsten, Elaine Jecminek, Pam Clavir, Dan Jecminek, Kristen Meritt, and Gary Klipp.

Minutes of the 12/8/18 Council Meeting were not available, and will be approved at next council meeting. The minutes from the December 9th Voter's Meeting were recommended for approval at the next Voter's Meeting.

Treasurer Kristen Meritt reported for Treasurer Vicki Akin that we are on track with the budget.

Board Reports

The Board of Elders and Spiritual Ministries

- DCE Angela will be working on a social media strategy, as well as Journey to the Cross, an outreach and educational event which will be held on Maundy Thursday.
- On March 19, we will host Rocky Mountain District LCMS Nurturing the FAITH 2019 Gathering.
- 3. Elders met with Brenda Schmidt. They approved the continued use of the pre-filled candles and the communion ware which is showing signs of wear.
- 4. On March 31st, Reverend Roegner will give the sermon at Trinity and will have a Bible study session.
- 5. The next seminar of "Now What?" is planned for March 24. Steve Cooper will add a Moser Funeral Home representative to the list of speakers.
- 6. Pastor called attention to Lenten services beginning Ash Wednesday, March 6. Midweek Lenten Services will be held at 10:00 am and 7:00 pm.

The Board of Property Ministries

- Dan indicated the original plans from 1998-1999 narrhex expansion have been located, will be reviewed and analyzed. He is working with contractors to get an estimate for the expansion. At this time, we just need the basic construction cost.
- Currently we are considering a new disposal and equipment upgrades for the Fellowship Hall kitchen, as well as a defibrillator for the church. LWML voted
 to purchase these with the Easter Love offering.
- One of the furnaces at the school needs repair. Also, Les will review the settings on all furnaces.

The Board of Education Ministries

- 1. Pam reported all board members have their goals. Gwen had given a report on keeping staffing at the appropriate levels.
- 2. There will be no increase for K-8 tuition next year; there will be a 5% increase for preschool. Kindergarten fees will increase, the amount undetermined.
- 3. We desire expanding relationships with Colorado Shines. Workshops available for pre-K teachers.
- 4. Offerings from Sunday School/ Bible study groups have enabled us to purchase an animal package for needy families in Asia.
- The calendar for the 2019-2020 school year was approved.
- 6. For this Sunday, the opening of Lutheran Schools Week, the children will be singing at both services. We all are encouraged to meet school families and invite them to Bible studies/Sunday School. Also encourage the congregation to attend events connected to Lutheran Schools Week.
- Kristen and Angela are working out details for VBS.
- 8. The Middle School students from Trinity Lutheran School will be taking a trip to DC in April. Angela and Brian will chaperone. Students have raised the money to pay their way through fundraisers at the school. We hope to be able to offer this trip every 3 years.

The Board of Financial and Stewardship Ministries

- Kristen reported that cash flow is adequate.
- 2. The online giving platform will be with "Prolific", which is tied to the Lutheran Church Federal Credit Union. There will be a "donate now" button and a "recurring" button.

Old Business:

Everyone has their goals for the year.

New Business:

Cheri mentioned Gwen is looking for help in the pre-school classes.

Pastor reflected on events in the world today, and cited a famous quote "Evil will persist and thrive if the righteous keep quiet." In this vein, we Christians should voice our concerns. Pastor asked if we could make a list of contact information for government reps to be available for the congregation. This was approved.

There being no further business to come before the Board, the meeting adjourned at 10:05 a.m.

The meeting closed with a prayer followed by the Lord's Prayer led by Pastor Hafeman.

The next meeting of the Executive Council will be held on March 9 at 8:30 a.m.

"Lift Up the Cross"

Carrying His own cross, [Jesus] went out to the place of the Skull. John 19:17

One of the best-known photographs from World War II shows the United States Marines raising the flag on Mount Suribachi in the Pacific on February 23, 1945.



Another mount on which something of the highest significance was raised was the place of the Skull, or Mount Calvary. Lifted up there was the cross. On that cross our Lord was nailed, not for crimes He had committed but for the sins of the whole world. He was the Lamb who was sacrificed for the sins of all.

What shall we do with Christ's cross raised on Good Friday? A mere piece of wood would not last long, but it continues to be a common sight. Representations of it have appeared on countless church alters and lifted high on steeples. It appears in artwork that hangs on walls in places of worship, education and business, and in homes. Crosses are worn as jewelry or woven into clothing as well.

The cross symbolizes that out of the curse of sin has come the love of God in surrendering His own dear Son to save us. Flags are raised in every battle, but Christ's cross needed raising only once, for "we have been made holy through the sacrifice of the body of Jesus Christ once for all" (Hebrews 10:10).

The cross is a symbol of great importance to Christians. Our Savior call on us to carry our personal crosses as we follow Him. That is what we are doing as His disciples. We raise Christ's cross as we spread His gospel everywhere – on mountain-tops, in the valleys, on the plains. In the words of the well-known hymn, we encourage one another to "Lift high the cross, the love of Christ proclaim Till all the world adore His sacred name."

Ask our loving Savior to enable us to continue raising His cross wherever we live and work. Amen.


