






## Fall into God's Word with these MONTHLY BIBLE STUDIES

And the jailer called for lights and rushed in, and trembling with fear he fell down before Paul and Silas. Then he brought them out and said, "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?" And they said, "Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved, you and your household." Acts 16:29-31

Is the Bible a reference book? No and yes.

No, the Bible does not answer many questions: How old is the world? Can angels dance on the point of a needle? When will Jesus return in glory?


And, yes, the Bible answers important and pertinent questions. Did God make the world? Is Jesus both true man and true God? Can people get to heaven by being good and doing good?

When the jailer in Philippi asked about the way of salvation, Paul and Silas answered, "Believe in the Lord Jesus, and you will be saved." This is the most important answer all of Holy Scripture gives. God gave us His Word to testify Jesus Christ, the Savior, to make us "wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus" (2 Timothy 3:15). Jesus came into the world to give His life as a ransom for sinners. All who believe in Him have forgiveness and the promise of life eternal.

In brief, the Bible has answers that pertain to our salvation. It touches on other subjects – history, languages, human behavior, science – but these are not its main purpose, of course. Yet when it speaks, it always speaks the truth. God gave us His Word, both Law and Gospel, to show us the need for the Savior and to lead us to Him.

#### Trinity Lutheran Church Executive Council Minutes August 10, 2019

The meeting was called to order at 8:40 a.m. by Mike Thuener. Pastor Hafeman opened by citing passages from Colossians 3:12 and a prayer.

Quorum was established. Present at the meeting were Pastor Hafeman, Mike Thuener, Cheri Carsten, Elaine Jecminek, Dan Jecminek, Vicki Akin, & Kyle Erickson.

Minutes of the July 13, 2019 Executive Council meeting were approved.

<u>Treasurer-</u> Vicki handed out the fiscal year to date Profit & Loss Budget vs. Actual information. This treasurer's report was approved.

#### **Board Reports**

#### The Board of Elders and Spiritual Ministries

- 1. Discussions of a possible combined service have revealed this will not be possible, as an organist is not available.
- 2. Responsibilities of the Director of Christian Education were reviewed.
- 3. Confirmation program was reviewed, the program starts September 11.
- 4. Pastor will be teaching a Christian education class two days per week at the school.

#### **The Board of Property Ministries**

1. Dan reported he has met with the fire inspector. We have learned we are not in compliance with fire codes in the upper level of the school. Within 30 days, we will need to remove stored items from that area and submit a plan of action to the Fire Marshall to show our good faith efforts to restore the area to compliance. These actions were approved by the council.

#### The Board of Education Ministries

- 1. The BOCE approved the option for parents to pay tuition over a 12 month period if they sign up for ACH. This will begin with the 2020-2021 school year.
- 2. September 8 is the Sunday School kickoff. A pot luck is being planned.
- 3. The pre school has 40, as well as a waiting list. The school has 33 enrolled.
- 4. Cooks Night Out kickoff will be on September 16, hosted by the BOCE in the Fellowship Hall.
- 5. The scholarship fundraising campaign kickoff will begin on September 1, and run through November 17. There will be presentations by school staff before each service during that period, and by Kyle between services on Nov 17.

#### The Board of Financial and Stewardship Ministries

1. Cash flow is adequate for now.

The new website is up and running. Please give feedback to Cheri or Mike.


#### **New Business:**
