




### **A Wordless Prayer**

When Jesus saw him lying there and knew that he had already been there a long time, he said to him, "Do you want to be healed?" John 5:6



Are elaborate, well-spoken prayers more likely to be answered? Not necessarily. Sincere prayer may consist of many words, a few words, or none at all.

Jesus visited a well-known pool near one of Jerusalem's gates. The place was called Bethesda, literally a house of mercy. From time to time an angel would touch the water, and the first to plunge in afterward would be cured of his/her affliction. So people with various handicaps such as paralysis or blindness would lie there, waiting to be healed.

Jesus approached a man who had lain beside the pool for 38 years and asked if he wanted to get well. The patient could have said, "Of course I do! Why else do you think I'm here?" But he answered Jesus, who was unknown to him, with respect: "Sir... I have no one to help me into the pool when the water is stirred. While I am trying to get in, someone else goes down ahead of me" (John 5:7). The man had not spoken

words of prayer, but Jesus knew the man's desire. He said, "Get up, take up your bed, and walk" (John 5:8). Immediately the man got up and walked.

Sincere prayer may consist of many words, a few words, or none at all. "Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness. For we do not know what to pray for as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with groaning's too deep for words. And he who searches hearts knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God" (Romans 8:26-27).

Our Lord knows what is in our hearts when in faith we come to Him with words or without.

The meeting was called to order at 8:35 a.m. by Cheri Carsten. Pastor Hafeman opened by citing passages from Luke 15 and a prayer.

Quorum was established. Present at the meeting were Pastor Hafeman, Cheri Carsten, Elaine Jecminek, Dan Jecminek, Kristen Meritt, Linda Klipp, & Gary Klipp

Minutes of the August 10 Executive Council meeting were approved, with a correction to indicate "BOCE is looking into the option of ACH for tuition payment".

<u>Treasurer</u> Kristen indicated matters are going smoothly and cash flow is adequate. The treasurer's report was approved.

#### **Board Reports**

#### The Board of Elders and Spiritual Ministries

- 1. Gary advised that Pastor Hafeman will be gone October 5 October 23; coverage for pastor has been determined.
- 2. Hank Thuener will coordinate defibrillator training for all who are interested.
- 3. Pastor, Elders and DCE Angela Erickson met on September 4 with confirmation students and their parents to explain their expectations of students.

#### **The Board of Property Ministries**

- 1. Dan reported that asphalt repairs will be done at the school.
- 2. Much advancement has been made regarding compliance issues of the upper level of the school. Several individuals have volunteered and accomplished removal of large quantities of metal items, unneeded items, debris, etc. Dan has met with contractors to get bids for additional work required to be done. Another meeting with the Fire Marshall and City of Greeley Building Inspector is scheduled for September 23.

#### The Board of Education Ministries

- 1. Linda advised the BOCE has met with teachers to learn of any concerns.
- 2. Enrollment is: 45 in preschool (2 on wait list), 12 in daycare, and 34 in K-6.
- 3. The teachers' conference will be held during October in Breckenridge.
- 4. Pastor and Lindy hosted a table recently at school. Five school families are interested in adult information classes.

#### The Board of Financial and Stewardship Ministries

## **School Happenings**

#### Preschool & K-8

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As we planned for this new school year, we looked for additional ways to re-enforce the spiritual learning that takes place in our classrooms at Trinity. Many of our students do not have a family church home, so Trinity is providing much of their spiritual nurture. For the families who are active in a Christian congregation, what we do supports the spiritual life of their family.

Some of the things we added were simple. We include "Luther's Morning Prayer" with the morning announcements over the intercom, so the whole school has time together in prayer as we start each school day (most individual classes were doing this prayer on their own as part of their morning routine). So that children learn more hymns, we are including a "hymn of the month" to what we sing in chapel, choosing something from LSB. Our September hymn was "Holy, Holy,"

At our September open house for school families, Pastor and Lindy greeted each family as they arrived. Pastor was able to recruit several families interested in learning more about Lutheran doctrine and the Christian faith; he has a class beginning in late September. Pastor and Mr. Larry are also teaching some of the upper-grade religion this school year, so our students become more acquainted with our church staff. One of these students has joined the confirmation class.

We have also been able to start conversations with a few families about baptism. We rejoice with third-grader Ayden Cook and his family as Ayden was baptized during chapel on September 18.



"Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances, for this is God's will for you in Christ Jesus." (I Thess. 5:16-18). This is our theme and focus this year. These words are not just for our daily classroom worship time, religion class, chapel or preschool "Jesus Time." The Spirit opens doors during recess and lunch and drop-off time and throughout the day. Parent teacher conferences are October 7 & 8 and these meetings often provide openings to address spiritual issues. The staff gathers for time in the Word and prayer each morning to equip ourselves for the day, but

we ask that you keep us to your prayers as we minister to these children and their families. The staff will also have time to focus on our ministry at the Rocky Mountain District Professional Workers' Conference in Breckenridge the second week of October. This year's theme is "Uncharted: Ministry off the Map." The elementary teachers plus Mrs. Mary and Miss Marshall will be privileged to attend.

WATCH YOUR BULLETIN: The annual Fall Festival is scheduled for October 26. The event is hosted by the PTL; as this newsletter went to print, details were still being finalized. Know that there will for sure be games for children of all ages and a chili cook-off. Know that there will also be lots of volunteers needed to put together the event. BUTTER BRAIDS ARE COMING: Sales will begin October 14. All orders must be submitted by November 1. Your tasty treats will arrive before Thanksgiving. Last year's very successful sale paid for the new sand-play area on the preschool playground.




