






Dear Family of Trinity,

First, I just want to share with you how very blessed Lindy and I are to be part of this incredible family of Christ. We have served Trinity, now, for twenty years! It has been quite a journey. I stepped in to help out for the first time by preaching on the Sunday before Thanksgiving, Thanksgiving Day and the Sunday after Thanksgiving in 1999. This has always been a very special and memorable time for us.

Now, Christmas will soon be upon us; what a special time in the Church Year. I am always amazed, as I reflect upon the historical account of Jesus' birth, how God worked then and how God continues to work now among His precious people. Through the prophet, Micah (served around 700 BC), God gave a detailed prophecy of where Jesus would be born:

"But you, O Bethlehem Ephrathah, who are too little to be among the clans of Judah, from you shall come forth for me one who is to be ruler in Israel, whose coming forth is from of old, from ancient days." (Micah 5:2)

From a worldly perspective this should never have happened. Mary, being *great with child* (pregnant), would probably not be excited about traveling from Nazareth (this would seem like, by circumstance, where Jesus would be born) all the way UP to Bethlehem. Yes, "up," because there is quite an elevation gain in that journey. The distance and elevation gain on this journey would be comparable to traveling from DIA to Estes Park! The elevations, of course, would be much lower but the changes in elevation very similar. Mary didn't have a nice vehicle to ride in but was walking or perhaps riding a beast of burden. It would *seem* that this prophecy was really messed up. God must have got it wrong on this one! It would only be natural that they would stay in Nazareth for this important event and not go through the turmoil, discomfort and inconvenience of traveling this difficult journey. What's the purpose for leaving?

TAXES!!! Yes, they made this difficult journey because of taxes:

"In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration when Quirinius was governor of Syria. And all went to be registered, each to his own town. And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the town of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, to be registered with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child."

(Luke 2:1-5)

"Augustus" means "the exalted one." For all his glory, however, Caesar Augustus remained God's instrument. His call for a world-wide census unwittingly set into motion the events of Jesus' birth, thereby bringing to fulfillment the prophecy regarding His place of birth (Micah 5:2). (Lutheran Study Bible) Before the Roman Empire existed and before Augustus was ever a thought in the wind, God already had His incredible plan of salvation, and the specifics of it, firmly in place. God must have got it wrong on this one? Absolutely not! God NEVER gets it wrong. He is perfect; all powerful and all knowing. One of the things that fascinates me in this incredible account is how God brings the secular world into participating in His infinite plans. They do not even realize that God is using them for His preplanned purposes.

Yes, we rejoice in Jesus' birth, Immanuel (God with us!) and Jesus (Savior) knowing that through this incredible plan of salvation, of which we now are blessed to live in the fulfillment, have the security of everlasting life! But, today, as we reflect upon this account I want us to appreciate that God does not change. He continues to include the secular world (unbeknownst to them) in His incredible plans for His Church even though the unbelieving world continues to renounce God and His people. Talk about SECURITY!




The Newsletter Deadline for January's Newsletter has also been moved up and is **Thursday**, **December 12th**

Over the summer, participating brands have begun to change their packaging from the traditional Box Tops clip to the new Box Tops label.




