This year they have designated 90% of the monies received through the Easter Love Offering to go towards the finishing of the second floor of the school. 10% always goes to an outside mission and this year that mission is *Shepherd's Canyon Retreat* which offers week-long counseling retreats for men and women in full-time ministry who are in the midst of various stages of burnout, stress, depression, and conflicts of all kinds. Dear Family of Trinity,

We are now on this journey together through the Season of Lent. This is a special time of the year for us to be extra serious and focused upon those areas of temptation in our lives that we battle the most. We are, after all, saint and sinner. God, by means of His grace, has called you and me by name, individually, to be His children. As such, we have a battle that rages on within us. Paul describes this battle most vividly in Romans 7:21-23:

"So I find this law at work: When I want to do good, evil is right there with me. For in my inner being I delight in God's law; but I see another law at work in the members of my body, waging war against the law of my mind and making me a prisoner of the law of sin at work within my members."

Do you experience this in your life? Do you ever get frustrated in the battle? Do you ever question if you really are God's precious child in light of this ongoing battle of temptation in your life? How often do you give in to these temptations? By the way, I am asking myself these same questions. Praise God for allowing the Apostle Paul to honestly share with us his own personal battle so that we can realize that we are not unique or alone in this struggle with sin. In fact, the battle between our two natures is clear testimony that we ARE a child of God. It takes two to tangle . . . right? So, this intense struggle with sin is clear testimony of the fact that we have two natures within us; saint and sinner. This then, as painful as the battle can be, is a comforting assurance that each of us is indeed one of God's precious children.

What we were unable to do, overcome every temptation, Jesus has accomplished for us and all people of all time. Lindy and I had the opportunity to be in the Garden of Gethsemane. This was a very beautiful place and a moving place due to the history of this particular grove of olive trees. This is the place where Jesus just hours before being crucified prayed to His Father these words from Matthew 26:

"My Father, if it is possible may this cup be taken from me. Yet not as I will, but as you will."

The cup that Jesus speaks of in His prayer is the cup of God's wrath, anger and punishment for all of our sins and the sins of all people that have been committed in the history of life on this earth. Who could endure this? Only One; our precious Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. The anguish was so intense that according to Luke's Gospel (remember he is the medical doctor who gives more physical detail) Jesus was sweating blood during this prayer time. Jesus knew every detail of the suffering that He was about to experience. He, despite the temptations to avoid this suffering, remained perfectly faithful to His Father's will and to His love for the world. He submitted to His Father's will. He suffered and died on the cross fulfilling God's incredible plan of salvation. He rose again the Victor! Forgiveness has been totally accomplished through Jesus paying the full punishment demanded by the Law. He offers His forgiveness to you and me personally for every time that we have given in to the severe temptations that we continue to battle in our lives.

The Apostle Paul not only admits his personal struggle with sin but also reveals to us the solution in the midst of the intense battle (Romans 7:24-25):

"What a wretched man I am! Who will rescue me from this body of death? Thanks be to God – through Jesus Christ our Lord."

Satan's desire for us in our struggle with temptation and sin is to lead us down the road of despair. His plan is for us to trust in ourselves and to eventually give up on ourselves and God; remember Judas? While the Season of Lent is a more somber season of the church year it certainly is not a depressing one. It is in this season that we see God's love revealed to us in the most spectacular way. Peter, after denying his Lord three times, was broken in his sin and would certainly agree with Paul, "What a wretched man I am," but he, unlike Judas, did not give up on nor deny the Lord's love for him.

What an encouragement for you and me, fellow saints and sinners!





Note from the Editor: A few weeks ago, in those moments between sleep and waking, I heard a voice ask, "What if the currency of the world was joy instead of gold or silver?" Suddenly, I was wide awake, and thinking. Over the next days and weeks, I kept thinking about that question and shared it with several people. Whether family, friends or co-workers, exhilarating conversations sprang up, every time I shared the thought of joy being the world's currency. Several times, it was a tool that brightened someone's day. I was moved to write a "Note from the Editor" sharing some of the ideas. It started out simply, but each 'what if' idea became bigger and more over the top, like 'what if you could by something like a car or house with the joy of owning that car or house. The article was done, but was it? The question kept popping back into my thoughts and I got the feeling I had missed something. The word currency had moved much of the conversations to the material world and what you could buy with it. I thought about what joy looked like to me. I closed my eyes and thought. I saw a small child stomping in a puddle of water or jumping in a pile of leaves, the simple joyfulness of a child. I was reminded of Jesus telling his disciples that unless they became like little children, they would not enter the kingdom of heaven. Perhaps joy is to simply experience all that God has made. Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden surely new the joy of all of God's creations, and the joy of knowing God. I was getting closer, but it still was not quite right. I looked to the Bible. What does God's Word say about joy? The word "joy" is used to describe a feeling that is extremely elevated. It's not the same as happiness which is based on happenings or on how your day or life is going. Joy is the word the Bible uses when God's Promise of a Savior is fulfilled. It's an emotion that comes through anticipation or expectation of something great or wonderful. It's something monumental. We hear the popular phrase, "Find your joy" and certainly long awaited celebrations like a wedding, a graduation or the birth of a child can be joyful, but not at the level that the Bible describes. Luke tells us that when Mary visited Elizabeth, the baby in Elizabeth's womb leaps with joy as Mary approaches. When Jesus was born, the angels told the shepherds that they were bringing good news of great joy, that would be for all the people, Christ the Lord was born. What a night of joy that was. After much searching in the Bible, I have come to the conclusion that joy is a gift from God, something He places in our hearts when we know His love and the sacrifice of His Son as payment for our sins, the realization that we have a place for eternity with Him in heaven. With that joy in our hearts, we rejoice, we live life joyfully, it's a gift that continues to give. What if Joy were the currency? May you search your heart and find you are you are rich with joy and in sharing that joy your wealth of joy increases. "May the God of hope fill you with joy and peace as you trust in him, so that you may overflow with hope by the power of the holy Spirit." Romans 15:13




