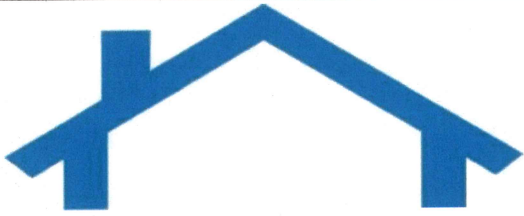

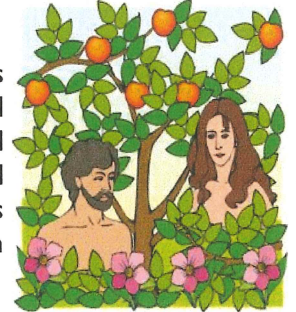
## From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

A number of people have asked me in recent times if I believe we are living in the last days. I will let you be the judge on this based on 2 Timothy 3:

But mark this: There will be terrible times in the last days. People will be lovers of themselves, lovers of money, boastful, proud, abusive, disobedient to their parents, ungrateful, unholy, without love, unforgiving, slanderous, without self-control, brutal, not lovers of the good, treacherous, rash, conceited, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God— having a form of godliness but denying its power. Have nothing to do with such people.

Biblically, when the end times are addressed, really refers to the era from when Christ came as that little babe in Bethlehem until He returns on the Last Day. What God does emphasize, and what we clearly observe from history, is that the world has been continually on a downward trend from the time Adam and Eve fell into sin. Unlike the premise of evolution that this world began in chaos and is heading towards perfection, God clearly reveals to us that His creation was perfect and, after sin, is headed towards total chaos and destruction. Quite a contrast in teachings! I am going with God and what He has revealed to us.



Throughout history, we have seen evidence of what God reveals to Timothy, and to all who will listen, from the text stated above. Since the fall, mankind has embraced all of these characteristics. Sadly, dare I say for each of us, we have also given in to these rebellious acts against God and one another. Praise God for His love and, through His freely given love, forgiveness. I believe we are currently living in terrible times due to the moral decay of our society. Whether God directed or allowed the CORONA 19 virus to occur, it is my hope that it leads to a revival in the United States leading each of us to evaluate our lives and be humbled to turn fully back to God and trust in Him alone.

In recent times I have really been focused on God's revelations about self-control. This is listed as one of the Spiritual Gifts in Galatians 5 and here, in 2 Timothy, we are informed that the lack of self-control is a sign of the last days. We, as citizens of the USA, have been very blessed to live in a nation that has had its roots in Christianity. Empowered to live lives of self-control we are able to self-govern. Our constitution is really based on the foundation of self-control. When this characteristic fades or is lost it not only threatens our faith but also our democracy. What can only follow is a police-state type of control when the majority of the people are out of control. It seems we are headed in this direction which is really concerning.

At the same time, what an opportune time for the Church to reveal herself with all of her Spiritual Gifts, given by God, in the midst of the culture in which we currently live. God lists the gifts of the Spirit in Galatians 5:



But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control. Against such things there is no law. Those who belong to Christ Jesus have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires. Since we live by the Spirit, let us keep in step with the Spirit.

We, through walking in step with the Spirit, stand out clearly in a very dark and corrupted world. God empowers each of us His precious children to have great influence on those around us by simply living the faith. The hope is that conversation will develop among our friends, neighbors, co-workers, etc., to the point that they are curious about our perspectives on life and the way that we approach it; especially in times like these. This is where our focus needs to be. Only God needs to know the day and the hour when Christ will return. What's important is that we use every hour of life that He gives us to represent Him in a fallen world.

Are we living in the last days? Absolutely! We have been ever since that little child, Jesus, was born in Bethlehem around 2,000 years ago. Each day is one day closer to Jesus' return. May we use each day that He provides to us to draw the attention of others to Him.

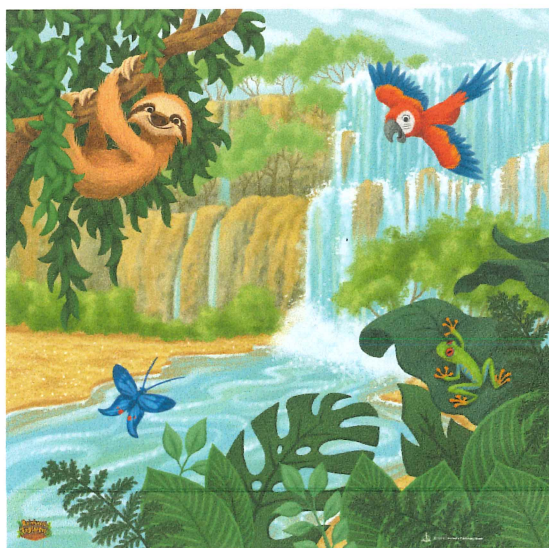

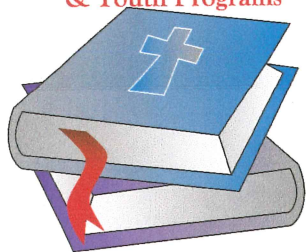
# Jesus is The Way!

For some time now, it has been part of the Elders 5-year plan to have a full-time Director of Christian Education and I am ecstatic that they have offered that position to me. I look forward to working here at Trinity to expand our children and family ministries, as well as helping provide more programs like Bible studies and retreats for those of all ages. I would like to bring back a midweek program like WOW (Worship on Wednesdays). I will continue to be an admin for our social media accounts (Facebook and Instagram) and I am excited about the possibilities for using these technologies to help communicate with members and to reach our community.

You might wonder, "What does a DCE do?" This can look different at every LCMS church where the position is held. Here at our church, I help oversee programs for children, youth and families. From discipleship to service projects to fellowship, I want to look at ways for our congregation to grow in faith and grow together, serving here in different ways and also going out and be the hands and feet of God in our community. While day-to-day work may vary depending on the time of year, from assisting our Sunday School superintendent and teachers, to facilitating Vacation Bible School, to planning and leading Confirmation classes and Bible studies, I am grateful to partner with you in our church and grow alongside you.

An important aspect of my position here is not only creating activities and programs, but the intentional and careful planning behind anything we do here at Trinity under the youth, children's, and family umbrellas. **Note from the Editor:** I was thinking about the Israelites this morning as I drove into work. How did they manage the big changes that came when God through Moses told them “pack up all your stuff, we are getting out of (Egypt) here!” Initially, I think they were excited to be freed from their slavery, but this change brought with it a lot of uncertainty. We know that they struggled, but was their struggle with the changes or with trusting God. Perhaps they had grown used to their lives, even finding comfort in their routine, making them resistant to the changes. Like the Israelites, my days are steeped in routine. I get up, get dressed, go to work, come home, eat supper, and go to bed. I lead a pretty structured life. Admittedly, I seem to do better with structure. I do specific things each day of the week from tasks at work to what I watch on TV in the evening. With the arrival of the COVID pandemic, my routine no longer fit. My new routine was uncertain and at times uncomfortable and full of questions. Am I considered essential or non-essential? Should I wear a mask or gloves? It seemed like things were changing almost minute by minute as a sense of panic and disbelief spread across our country. Overnight stores and restaurants closed and grocery store shelves became bare. I never in my wildest dreams thought I would have to be concerned about having enough toilet paper! Amid all these changes, there is only one thing I can do, trust in God. He is in charge and His plan is infallible. He loves me so much that He sent His One and Only Son to die on the cross to pay for my sins, as He did for you. May you find that with trust in God, you can make changes, whether they are comfortable or not. Jesus tells us “... *do not be anxious about your life, what you will eat or what you will drink, nor about your body, what you will put on. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothing? Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not of more value than they?*” Matthew 6:25-26

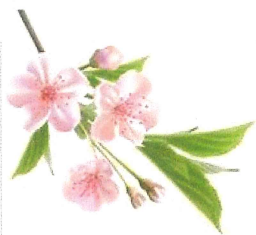

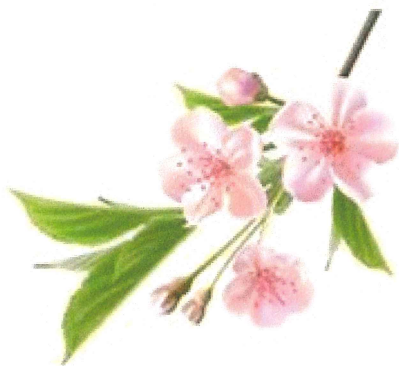

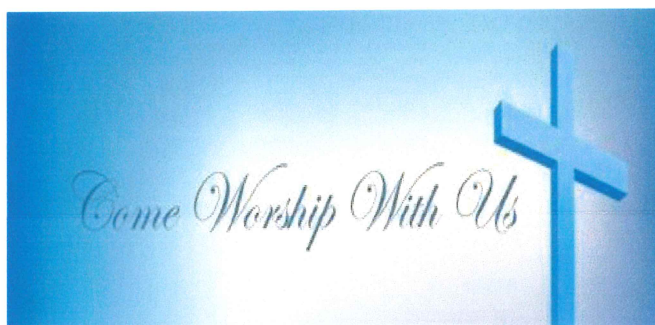
