

Trinity Lutheran Church Executive Council Minutes July 11, 2020

The meeting was called to order at 8:30 a.m. by Bob Thorgesen, who opened with a prayer.

Quorum was established. Present at the meeting were Bob Thorgesen, Elaine Jecminek, Dan Jecminek, Vicki Akin, Pam Clavir and Ken Clavir.

The minutes of the June 13, 2020 council meeting were approved.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> - Vicki handed out the Profit & Loss Budget vs. Actual Report. Expenses are as budgeted.

Board Reports

The Board of Elders and Spiritual Ministries

- I. Ken reported that the elders have met with Angela Erickson to finalize her contract as the full time Director of Christian Education.
- 2. Angela had a very successful Vacation Bible School program, having given out 44 packets for children, and the program was run virtually.
- 3. Angela will be conducting a "red letter challenge" which will be for the entire congregation to focus on Biblical topics.
- 4. Angela will conduct confirmation classes; kickoff will be on August 19, meeting with the parents.

The Board of Property Ministries

- I. Dan reported that two busses are parked in the corner of the church lot, as a local business person is in need of the space for a short time. In return, he has offered bus transportation to the school for field trips.
- 2. A large leak in the sprinkler system has been located and repaired. Refurbishing of the entire sprinkler system has been ongoing.
- 3. The new janitorial contract has been completed.
- 4. The elevator at the school is scheduled for installation beginning July 27.
- 5. Painting of the school second floor is approximately 20% completed.
- 6. Tables and chairs are set up in the Fellowship Hall. This will be the standard setup. If groups need use of the Fellowship Hall and move the tables/chairs, they should be returned to their original position.

The Board of Christian Education Ministries

- I. Pam reported that all of the school staff and the principal are working on how classes will look when school reopens this fall.
- 2. Members of the board are rewriting the handbook with Covid 19 restrictions.
- 3. Cheri and Kyle have put together a marketing plan.
- 4. The BBQ to kick off the new school year will be on Sunday, August 23.
- 5. The board has hired Brenda Jaynes to teach 3rd/4th grades. She has considerable experience teaching in Lutheran Schools, and has previously taught at Trinity.
- 6. Pickers Paradise will be held on August 1. Spaces are nearly all booked.

The beginning of every school year seems to have a new look, new changes if you will. Well, this coming school year does not disappoint in that area.

For starters, our new school year theme is "Sent to Serve." The theme verse comes from Matthew 20:28, which says, "The Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many." What a very fitting theme for the interesting times that we are in. This is why we are here, and echoes our mission statement, "Sharing Christ, Serving People." This school year, we will regularly be reminded

I'm very excited for the Director of Christian Education position to expand! I look forward to spending the next weeks in intentional vision and mission contemplation as we move forward in Education doing God's work here. My typical weekly day off will be Mondays.

As with many other ministries and events, we had to think outside of the box for this year's Vacation Bible School. Our concept for 2020 was a "backyard", "take-home" project for families to pick up a kit and partner with another family to see this through. Our intention was to still provide a VBS experience for our families, while enabling them to reach out into their own neighborhoods for evangelism purposes. Crafts, snacks, handouts, and DVDs were given out, with videos posted online for each lesson to explain all of the different aspects of the typical VBS day. We had over 40 VBS kits given out – to God be the glory! We're looking forward to a closing celebration on Sunday, August 2, with bike riding and popsicles in the parking lot.

Summer Sunday School also looked a bit different. We have been sending home packets for families to complete at home for the summer called "God's Great Right Here" that is a camping-themed (visually) where kids get "badges" in the form of stickers for completing devotional videos, Bible readings, family projects, etc. We will be back in session in person following Labor Day weekend in September. We are currently working on health policy and procedure for students and teachers to ensure the safety of our members.

Confirmation classes resume with parent meeting on Wednesday, Confirmation Class August 12 at 6:30 p.m.; regular classes will begin on August 19 at **4:00** p.m. (for first year students only for the first few weeks as an intro). Second year students will begin to join us in September.

As the fall calendar is explored and created, I look to schedule activities and events for our Club 345 (3rd-5th grade students), junior high and senior high youth, as well and families and adults. A church calendar

isn't just a place for programs and activities, but a venue in which our ministries are carried out in Worship, Evangelism, Discipleship, Service, and Fellowship. Please join me in prayer as we always try to create opportunities for these for all ages!



Dear Sisters & Brothers in Christ,

Lindy and I had quite an interesting journey through the midsection of the U.S.A. in our recent travels. We really wanted to get a sense of how others are dealing with COVID 19. There are some interesting perspectives. It was wonderful being in South Dakota and visiting Mt. Rushmore. What a special place. Our most wonderful experiences were the people that we were blessed to meet in our camping experiences; people from Wisconsin, Oklahoma, Iowa, Nebraska and locals from South Dakota just to mention a few. We met a lovely Christian family who wore their faith on their sleeves. A couple mornings after having met them, the

father and son stopped at our site, in the rain, and asked to have a prayer with us! This is truly God's Church at work. Yes, we were gathering, which is not only legal but encouraged in South Dakota.

This trip was so refreshing to be around people who desired to be physically together. Streaming and zooming are great technologies and they definitely have their purposes but God intends for His people to be physically together. Ever since we entered into this social distancing mode I have not ceased to think about this passage in God's Word (Hebrews 10:23-25):

"Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful.

And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near."

Why those here referred to neglected public worship, is not specified. It may have been for a variety of reasons such as the fear of persecution, apathy, seeing a lack of purpose, or perhaps dissatisfaction with the Church or leaders and members of it. Worship, the physical assembling together, is a very part of God's design for His Church. Religion is social; and our graces are to be strengthened and invigorated by waiting together on the Lord. We need one another for support and encouragement. Nowhere in Scripture does God direct us Christians to be lone rangers in the faith. There truly is strength in numbers through physically fellowshipping together.

It is a known fact that anything practiced for 21 days or more becomes a new routine that is hard to break. I will always remember March 15th, 2020. This was the last Sunday that we, the members of Trinity, worshiped together under normal circumstances. We are now into four months of our "new normal." Many among the clergy are now discussing if we will ever get back to the "old normal." In most congregations, offerings have dropped way off which hinders local ministry and mission work here and throughout the world. People begin to drift away and lose interest in the local body of Christ; no longer receiving the Lord's Supper and public absolution which are both, by God's design, so spiritually empowering!

How did we get to this place in Christianity in America in just four months? Fear. This whole event has been built upon and empowered by fear. Is COVID 19 something to be concerned about? Absolutely. Is it something that should prevent us from abiding by God's will? No. The early Church, during the time of this writing in Hebrews, was a severely persecuted Church. It was extremely dangerous to be a public confessing Christian; by the way, much more dangerous than COVID 19. Obviously, there was concern then that fear was distancing Christians from physical public worship together despite the dangers of doing so. Praise God for the courage of the early Church and their willingness to even die for the faith. In Hebrews 11 (I like to refer to this chapter as the Hall of Faith), God encourages us by directing us to look at the history of those faithful who have gone before us and the suffering they endured:

Some faced jeers and flogging, and even chains and imprisonment. They were put to death by stoning; they were sawed in two; they were killed by the sword. They went about in sheepskins and goatskins, destitute, persecuted and mistreated— the world was not worthy of them. They wandered in deserts and mountains, living in caves and in holes in the ground. These were all commended for their faith . . ." (Hebrews 11:36-39a).

In the midst of our current times, may we listen to God and not man; "Let us hold fast the confession of our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful. The Day is drawing near; we are one day closer, today, to our Lord's return. May our focus be upon God's faithfulness and Christ's certain return. By the way, this is not intended to guilt anyone into returning to worship. My intent is that we all consider the cost of giving into fear as opposed to standing up to fear by trusting the One Who is faithful and exposes fear.
