



## **All Things**

St. Paul in his I<sup>st</sup> letter to the Corinthians 9.9- 27, says, "I have become all things to all people (so that) I might save some." (9:22b) To understand what the apostle Paul meant when he wrote, "I have become all things to all people", we must keep the statement in context. Paul was explaining to the Corinthian church his motivation for submitting himself to

a hard life. He relinquished his rights to be married (9.5) and to draw a salary from the church (verses 9.6–12). Paul considered all that he had done prior to meeting the resurrected Jesus on the Damascus Road to now be rubbish or, as some would say, "road apples".

Being brought to really know Jesus and understand GOD's plan of salvation had changed everything for Paul. Paul would write that preaching the Gospel was a necessity laid upon him. "Woe to me if I do not preach the Gospel." (9.16) As a pastor I often feel the same way. If I don't tell you about Jesus' love for you, I, too, feel as though I will explode. And my wife knows that will not be a pretty picture. I do pray that, at times, God's Word would so impact you that you are moved to share that Word.

Paul goes on to write that being all things to all people meant that, at times, he became a Jew to win Jews and, at times, to the Gentiles he became like a Gentile. To the weak, he became weak so that he might win over the weak. Paul met people where they were, whatever their faith was or lack of it, so that he might, by the power of God's Word and The Holy Spirit, bring them to believe in and rejoice in all that Jesus has done for us. As restrictions are beginning to be lifted and we begin to go out more, I pray we all will ask God to give us opportunities to share the Love and Joy that has been given to us by Jesus.



<u>Treasurer's Report</u> - Vicki handed out the Profit & Loss Budget vs. Actual Report. Many school registration fees have already been received. All bills are paid. The Treasurer's report was approved by the council.

#### The Board of Elders and Spiritual Ministries

- 1. Ken reported elders have determined that the traditional services will continue for the 8:00 and 10:30 services through August.
- 2. Elders are researching if we should continue with the KFKA 7:00 a.m. broadcast.

### The Board of Property Ministries

- 1. Dan reported that the elevator at the school is installed. There are a couple minor issues to resolve.
- 2. The trustees are addressing additional water leaks in the sprinkler system.
- 3. Dan and Vicki have met with representatives from Brotherhood Mutual, the church's insurance provider. Brotherhood proposed several good options in order to keep a reasonable premium.

#### The Board of Christian Education Ministries

- 1. Linda reported that Kyle has held Zoom meetings with parents regarding precautions taken regarding Covid.
- 2. The enrollment has increased from 32 last year to 48 currently. Kindergarten is at maximum.
- 3. Scholarship kickoff will be Sunday, September 6.
- 4. The first day of school will be August 19.
- 5. A school staff dedication and BBQ will be held Sunday, August 23, as well as an open house.
- 6. All classrooms are ready to being in-school learning.
- 7. Pickers Paradise, headed by Laura Reiter, was very successful. This event raised \$1,200 to benefit the school.
- 8. Spirit shirts can be purchased online at GoJo's.
