Because of the variety in types of donations, The Resource Center was unable to track how much was given by each church. However, the overall donations from Weld County churches were:



\$111,000 received in donations (88.8% of the goal of \$125,000).


There were 64 new donors as a result of offering the online donation method, and 22,000 people were reached in this way (Facebook).


Fellow members of Trinity,

September 12, 2020

The meeting was called to order at 8:30 a.m. by Mike Thuener. Ken opened with prayer, and devotion from Matthew 18:15-17.

Quorum was established. Present at the meeting were Mike Thuener, Bob Thorgesen, Elaine Jecminek, Dan Jecminek, Connie Mapes, Linda Klipp, & Ken Clavir.

The minutes of the August 8, 2020 council meeting were approved.

<u>Treasurer's Report</u> - Connie handed out the Profit & Loss Budget vs. Actual Report. There are no areas of concern. The Treasurer's report was approved by the council.

Board Reports

The Board of Elders and Spiritual Ministries

- I. Ken reported elders have met with the district reconcilers regarding our current situation at the church. Reconcilers have also met with the school staff.
- 2. Pastor Pierson will be conducting services at Trinity on October 4 and October 11.

The Board of Property Ministries

- 1. Dan reported there are issues with windows on the upper level of the school, in that 17 of the 22 panes have seals that are broken. It is our understanding the windows have a lifetime warranty, so we are checking with the original contractor/subcontractor.
- 2. Dan has met with a representative regarding the possibility of solar panels for the church and school. There are many issues yet to be researched.

The Board of Christian Education Ministries

- I. Linda reported that the Board has discussed the possibility of having the Fall Festival outdoors. If held, it will be during the day on October 31, a Saturday.
- 2. We are thankful for a donation to purchase Chrome Books, in the event we must return to virtual learning.
- 3. The kickoff for the school year went very well. Many thanks to Pastor Hesse, who has been at the school every day to encourage students and parents.
- 4. The board discussed Sunday School, when to reopen, and safety issues. DCE Angela Erickson will be meeting with the Elders next month to discuss this.
- 5. Cook's Night Out will be September 22 in our fellowship hall.

Preschool & K-8

"Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today and forever." Hebrews 13:8

I have been holding onto this verse the past 6 months as so much around us HAS changed. As we head towards the end of the first trimester of this school year, we are striving to maintain the things we do well in a climate that is so different with varying rules and endless cleaning.

Meeting with parents to discuss their child's progress at school is important, but parent conferences will look different. Parents have not been allowed into classrooms. We will need to use technology such as Sign-Up Genius and possibly Zoom. Where and when we meet will need to be more flexible. Our teachers are preparing for these important meetings in mid-October. Please pray that these meetings go well and that the Holy Spirit use the experience to tug at the hearts of our school families who do not have a church home.

The Butter Braids sale is a major fundraiser for our PTL. We will begin sales on October 12 with sales ending on October 30. The product arrives on November 13 so you will have them before Thanksgiving. Watch for more details in the bulletin, including a way to order online to avoid people having to go door to door to get orders. We will get some posters to the church so that you will know which flavors are available this year. We had our highest sales ever last year with \$3500 profit and we hope to exceed that in 2020.

The staff always looks forward to gathering with hundreds of other Lutheran school educators at the Breckenridge Professional Workers' Conference, but that event is a victim of Covid protocols. The elementary teachers will have professional days on site October 14 and 15; the early childhood staff will provide childcare those two days. On Friday, October 16, the school will close completely and all staff will participate in a Rocky Mountain District virtual conference. We hope to be able to connect with 1 or 2 other Lutheran schools in Northern Colorado, maybe even being able to visit another campus for the day. This event is important for our teachers – there are a variety of ways to grow professionally, but this event equips us to better minister to our students and families in addition to professional growth.

The PTL is already working on a way to do a Fall Festival in the time of Covid. It will involve having most activities outdoors, setting up to allow for social distancing and having some mask requirements. We are even working on details to still pull off the chili cook-off. We are also moving the event to daytime. Set aside 11:00-1:00 on Saturday, October 31. Chili and cinnamon rolls will be served 11:00-noon outside the school. Trunk-or-treat and games will happen noon-1:00 in the school parking lot. Watch your Sunday bulletin for details on how you can volunteer to help with activities or enter your chili in the cook-off. This will be the only opportunity for our students to show-off their costumes at school, so we are expecting a higher than usual turn out. A group of enthusiastic parents are working on this event; their next planning meeting is October 6, so that is when you will see more specifics.

We said goodbye to Miss Illyana as she headed to Navy boot camp in September. We have added Miss Marissa Lujan as our new preschool classroom assistant. The story of how she ended up with Trinity is another tale of how God uses people and circumstances to place people where they are needed to serve in the kingdom. Marissa even attended Trinity for a couple years when she was in middle school!

There is such a positive energy in the school building this year. Satan could have used the rules about no co-mingling of groups and use of space and all the cleaning to drive classes and teachers apart, but instead it has drawn us closer

together and more dedicated than ever to have Trinity be

the best school it can be. To God be the glory!

Years ago, the BOCE capped our rooms at 15 students per classroom to insure that each student could receive more one on one time with their teacher, wanting to provide a nurturing, safe place for our students to learn. Now with the coronavirus pandemic rules and regulations from the health department, we are able to socially distance and keep our students in the classrooms. The Kindergarten class is capped at the 15 students. God's hand at work.

One of our scholarship families was a victim of a hate crime recently. The father was attacked and suffered a severe concussion. He still is not able to work. That didn't stop the family from volunteering community service by painting some of the doorways upstairs. They are so very appreciative that God has provided them a safe place for their child to learn, not only the regular reading, writing and arithmetic, but also of God's love for their child and their family. We have returning students whose parents have either lost their jobs or had their hours cut in half. They need their students in school so they can work, but don't have enough money to pay full tuition. With God's grace, we have been able to keep the children in school, allowing



the parents to work. One of these parents, took advantage of his time off and brought his paint sprayer to the school and painted all of the walls in the school upstairs and stairwells. What a blessing. God's hand at work.

Our mission is to share the good news of God's love for all mankind. A love that sent God's only begotten Son into this world to die for our sins. The good news is that His Son, Jesus rose again, conquering death, so we might live eternally with Him. Jesus wants us to know that *ALL Lives*Matter and He died on the cross for them.
