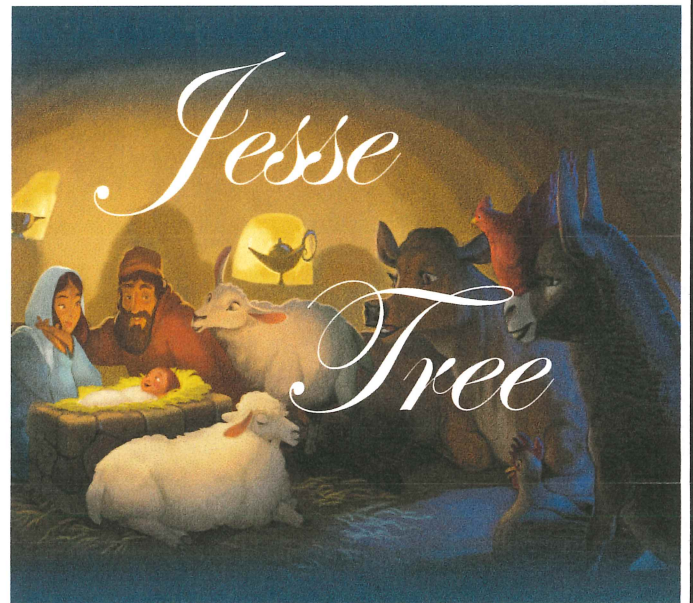
Plans are underway to prepare for (Advent) and celebrate (Christmas Eve) the birth of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ in this most unusual year!

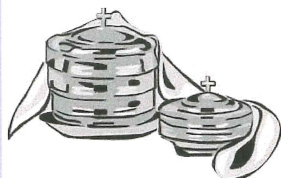

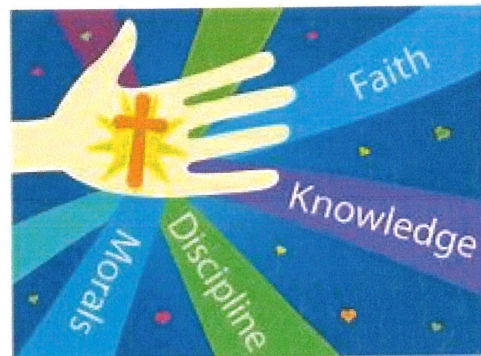

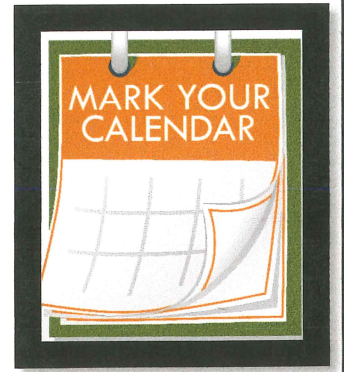

PROTOCOL FOR PROVIDING FLOWERS FOR CHURCH ON SUNDAY

Recently, we have received inquiries about how one would go about providing flowers for our Sunday worship services. Below is an outline of how to go about providing flowers.



1.) In the narthex lounge area, on the right side of door to the office (the office is where Connie Mapes has scrip cards and the copy machine is) is a Flower Chart. On the chart there are the 12 months of the year, and lines under each month with a number on the left of the line that denotes the date that the Sundays fall on.

2.) Choose a date that you would like to provide flowers for the altar, perhaps that is to celebrate a birthday or anniversary, or remember a loved one. Write (print please) your name on the line beside the date and a quick explanation for your gift, i.e. birthday, anniversary, etc. Mark your personal calendar, so you don't forget!

*If someone has already put their name on the date you wanted, please consider being flexible and choose the week before or after. Often we have had more than one person on a particular date and no one on the weeks before or after.

3.) Purchase your flower bouquet just prior to the Sunday you have chosen. Bring them to the church and place them on the shelves on either side of the cross behind the altar. The church is usually open by 7 am on Sunday mornings and your flowers should be placed no later than 7:30 am. The 2nd service has usually concluded by 11:45 am and you can pick your bouquet up and take it home after that.

IMPORTANT THINGS TO CONSIDER:

*Since the church is locked and not occupied during the week, deliveries are not recommended. If you have your flowers delivered, they will probably come to the school. There is no guarantee they will make it to the church.

*You can bring your flowers to the church on Friday, stop first at the school and ask to borrow a key to the church, place your flowers in the sanctuary, then return the borrowed key to the office in the school.

*If you want something special in the bulletin, remember the deadline is Wednesdays at 3pm.

*If you put your name on the Flower Chart after the 1st of that month, please inform Debi in the church office so that she has up-to-date information for others who inquire about availability.

School Happenings

Preschool & K-8

Trinity Family,

We're in the home stretch of a year like no other. While I will be happy for this year to be done for lots of reasons, there will also be some joyful highlights. One will be witnessing the baptism of Matthew, Leila and Liam at chapel on November 4. It was a very powerful moment and has opened the door for other families to talk to teachers, Kyle and myself about children being baptized. It has had other families thinking about finding a church home and asking about worshipping at Trinity. I told the baptism story on the Lutheran Education Facebook page and got almost 600 likes. I told the story at the beauty shop and had one of the ladies tell me how much she needed to hear a story like that right now. People are hungry for good news, and we have THE good news. We don't always get a glimpse of how the Holy Spirit is working, but I am grateful that I have these moments in the past few weeks.



Besides the spiritual blessings, we have also experienced material blessings. We wondered how Butter Braid sales would go in the time of social distancing . . . and we had record sales. This PTL project raised over \$5700! The top-selling class was supposed to earn a pizza party, but we decided that ALL CLASSES deserved a pizza party for increasing sales by 40% over last year. Our top seller was Virginia Reiter who sold 99 Butter Braids! The first project on the list with these funds is to upgrade the access/security at the main school doors.

We also experienced donations to add chrome books to the elementary classrooms so that we have one for each student AND another to purchase iPads for each of the preschool rooms AND an unexpected grant opportunity for preschool curriculum resources AND we met our scholarship goal for this school year by the first week of November. I'm in awe of how God uses His people and their resources to support our ministry at Trinity Lutheran Church and School.

The COVID restrictions have also forced us to simplify events – and it turns out that simple can be fabulous! The outdoor daytime Fall Festival was loads of fun (and a lot less work than the usual event). We weren't able to do the usual Veteran's Day program, but we had a dozen veterans join us for chapel on November 11th. We sang "The Star-Spangled Banner" and "I'm in the Lord's Army" and thanked those who served by putting their country before themselves to defend our freedom. We usually have a big potluck celebration the Friday before Thanksgiving, but it will be simple classroom observances (but Kyle still promised to smoke a turkey for the teachers to enjoy at lunch that Friday).

We will also be simplifying for Advent and Christmas with no large school program on the horizon. During these times of "social distancing," we are blessed to be able to teach of our Savior who refrains from keeping his distance and comes directly to us, "Wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger."



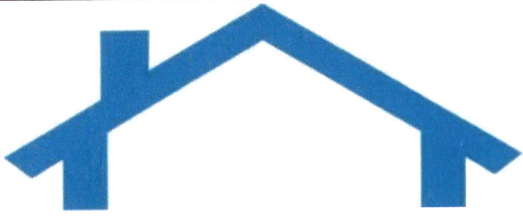
