

In June at the National Convention new Mission Grants will be voted on. We continue to ask for your help with the Rocky Mountain District Mission Grants (2020-2022). 


Each year, these envelopes are collected by the LWML ladies who choose a project to direct these offerings towards. Over the past years, the LWML has used the Easter Love Offerings to: refurbish the kitchen in the Church Fellowship Hall; to cover a large portion on the cost of reupholstering the pews in our sanctuary; provide extra money for the completion of the finishing of the second floor of the school. This year the LWML is dedicating the Easter Love Offerings towards the eventual replacement of the front doors of the church. They anticipate that this may take more than one year

to collect enough funds. Please prayerfully consider giving to this worthwhile project. Place your contribution in the "Easter Love Offering" envelope and drop it in the offering plate on Sunday morning, anytime between now and Easter Sunday.

### Dear Trinity Lutheran Family,

In the middle of the season of Lent, I want to take a moment to share with all of you a few thoughts. In serving you for almost four months, I have shared little with you regarding ministry at Trinity. When I met with the executive council this past Saturday, I realized God's people needed to be reminded of a couple of key issues that assist doing ministry together.



Having just preached about the two idols for most churches, (Numbers and money) there is a need to inform God's people how we are doing. A year ago, when we began the pandemic journey, the response of God's people to the financial concerns of the church were tremendous. Interestingly, many churches were experiencing great giving. As the pandemic has worn us down, Trinity has seen a decline of good stewardship. Since the beginning of the new year support for ministry has been behind the needs of ministries. One of my favorite reminders is what St. Paul tells the church at Corinth:

#### The Cheerful Giver

<sup>6</sup> The point is this: whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully. <sup>7</sup> Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. <sup>8</sup> And God is able to make all grace abound to you, so that having all sufficiency in all things at all times, you may abound in every good work. (2 Corinthians 9:6–8 (ESV)

Together we can make a difference. Some of you are experiencing hard times due to job uncertainty or even loss of job. Paul tells the Corinthians that God loves a cheerful giver. It is about giving to the Lord with a heart full of love for what God has given to us. There can be a variety of reasons saints fall behind in supporting ministry. During the next months I want to listen to the concerns of God's people. When pastor left and then decided to retire, it created all kinds of feelings. These feelings need to be discussed openly looking for ways to do ministry together in positive ways. My point is, it is easy to find reasons to hold back, however, God never held back when He saw our sins or knew our failures. No, God gave His only Son, because God knew we would falter and fall. He loved us so much!



With Easter before us, it is an ideal time for God's people to respond to His love. With offering plates not being passed, it is easy to forget the responsibility we have together. I simply ask each of you look at what you do to support ministry here. If God moves you, please respond as cheerful givers, supporting ministry. It is amazing and beautiful when we come together rejoicing at the foot of the cross.

I have asked Connie Mapes if I could share her history of the Scrip program here at Trinity. (You will find it on the next page.) We go about our normal activities, without realizing some of the great things that can happen when we support ministries happening right here. I realize that many of you are asked to do this in various things you belong to.

Consider what has happened over the past 28 years because of this ministry, often unseen, a great resource to make working together a positive thing for the church.



The Scrip program at Trinity Lutheran Church and School has been an active fundraiser for the church and school for about 35 years. Rick and Connie Mapes have been running the program for about 28 years, taking over from Bob and Lois Bliss who started

the program. All scrip cards are ordered through one company - Great Lakes Scrip. We have an online program available and also can special order cards to be used for larger projects such as kitchen remodels and appliances or carpet. We also try to anticipate the need for cards for Cooks Night Out events so Trinity can receive the benefit from the cards and the restaurant contributions. We'll have some available for the upcoming Texas Roadhouse event later this month.

Prior to COVID, the scrip program consistently earned about \$12,000 per year. In 2020, the earnings were around \$5,700. Exact earnings are listed on the end-of-year report filed in the church finance office. For 2021, the earnings through February are \$1,399.95 which includes checks from 2020 Safeway card reloads of \$252.00 and 2020 fourth quarter earnings from King Soopers card designations of \$814.45.

For January and February 2021:

Beginning Account Balance-January \$34,441.33 Plus Deposits \$ 9,952.79 \$ 9,769.24 Less Scrip Purchases Ending Account Balance-February \$34,624.88

As you can see, the scrip account grows slowly, with only about 10-15 people actively using the program currently. Imagine how this account could grow if we had 100 active participants! The scrip account needs to maintain a balance of around \$12,000, with \$6,000 required by the bank so we don't incur monthly fees and \$6,000 available for ongoing scrip orders. The remaining funds of \$22,624.88 are available.

In the past several years, the scrip program has provided \$35,000 to the building fund to finish the second floor of the school, \$10,000 to pay staff salaries, \$14,284 to purchase playground equipment, \$5,500 for parking lot repairs, \$2,793 for preschool equipment, \$213 for two portable cribs for the church nursery, and \$2,738 for room dividers, to name a few. Historically, the program has contributed over \$60,000 for salaries/general expenses and contributed \$55,000 toward resurfacing and resealing the church and school parking lots among other contributions.

If there are any questions about the scrip program or the account, please let me know. I'm in the church office between services almost every Sunday.

### THANK YOU AND **LATEST UPDATE**

I wanted to share a quick update as well on where we are at in this process. Our application packet is complete and has been sent to the District. Transcripts from college are sent, fee is paid, and the Church's portion for the Vicarage application was also completed and sent. Christy and I had our Interview with President Schlechte and he has sent his letter of recommendation to the Seminary. The seminary has given me a login to the system and I am registered for the 3 Prerequisite tests that I need to complete by April 30th. One on Old Testament, one on the New Testament and one on Christian Theology...and so the studying has begun! This fall during the week of Sept 6th, I will go to the Seminary for the orientation and the following week the coursework and program begins here at Trinity.

We are so thankful for the clarity God has given Christy and I, and now so thankful for that clarity as well from the church! We ask for prayers of wisdom and guidance in this time of planning and preparing. Thank you all again so much and thank you for the prayers!

### March 28



Holy Communion is celebrated




For this worship we will gather in the Upper Room. Our Lord celebrated His final Passover with His disciples. During this gathering Jesus would wash their feet, speak of betrayal, institute Lord's Supper. In remembrance, our Lord invited us to participate together at His table, Holy Communion will be part of this gathering. At the end of the service, the traditional stripping of the Chancel will take place remembering Psalm 22. Once finished the worshiper is asked to leave in silence, remembering what our Lord accomplished for each one of us. The morning and evening service will be the same.

### Good Friday April 2

12:00 p.m. and 6:30 p.m.

12:00 p.m. Please note the change for worship. Some members do not like to come out in the evening, we will offer a noon service, which is an old tradition. This service is somber, reflecting on the events of that morning. This service will be readings, short message, mostly a time to reflect. Worshipers are asked to leave in silence, considering what our Lord suffered for each one of us. There will little or no music.





6:30 p.m. This service will only be held at 6:30 p.m. This service will involve several speakers, special music, and will end in darkness, reflecting the darkness of our sin, which Christ endured on our behalf. The service begins in light. As we reflect on Christ being laid in the tomb, the sanctuary is darkened, ending in darkness. The worshiper is asked to leave in silence, remembering what this day means for you. With daylight savings, by the end of the service, we will be approaching darkness. We invite you all to consider worshiping together at the foot of the cross. A Tenebrae service is a part of Trinity's celebration during Holy Week.

This service will take us to the Garden Tomb, where the women will find the stone rolled away. This service will be different than the other two services this day. Holy Communion is being celebrated in all services this day. Following the service the youth of the congregation will be serving a breakfast, you are encouraged to share with fellow members and to support our young people as they prepare for a servant event this summer.

These two services will be the same. They will contain more of the liturgy, offering the worshiper to come to the Lord's Table. # **School Happenings**



Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

March went by in a blur! Our spring break was not very spring-ish because it began with a snow storm! My three spring breaks at Trinity have been the bomb cyclone, the start of the pandemic and a blizzard. Don't be surprised if Miss Marshall asks for the third week of March as vacation in 2022.

The school has been doing their own "March Madness" tournament this spring, choosing the best early childhood story book for 2021. The staff narrowed a list of over 70 books down to the top 32. There is then a daily competition between two books. The teachers read the books to the younger groups and the older grades read them themselves. The votes are tallied at the end of each day. 
