### **June 10, 2021**

A meeting of the Executive Council of Trinity Lutheran Church and School was held on July 10, 2021, in the narthex lounge. Present were Mike Thuener, Bob Thorgesen, Brenda Schmidt, Vicki Akin, Ken Clavir, Jason Reiter, and Pam Clavir. A quorum was established. Notice of this meeting was given in advance to all members of the council.

The meeting was called to order at 8:40 am by Mike Thuener. Jason opened with prayer. Minutes of the June council meeting were distributed via email. The minutes were approved as written.

#### **Treasurer's Report**

Vicki Akin presented the July 2020 through June 2021 Profit and Loss Budget vs. Actual financial report with discussion following.

#### **The Board of Elders and Spiritual Ministries: Ken Clavir**

- Proposing to Executive Board that Trinity contract with AOR to present the two seminars – see New Business.

#### **New Business:**

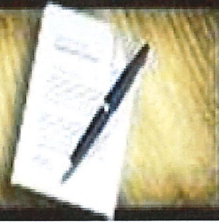

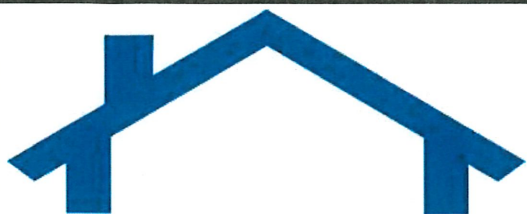
### **Luke Kunze SMP orientation:**

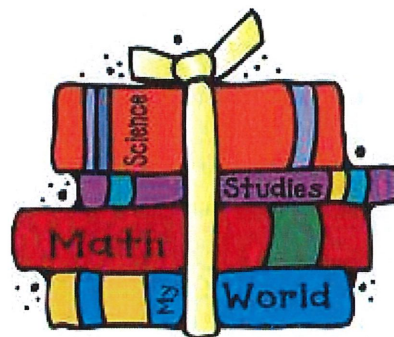

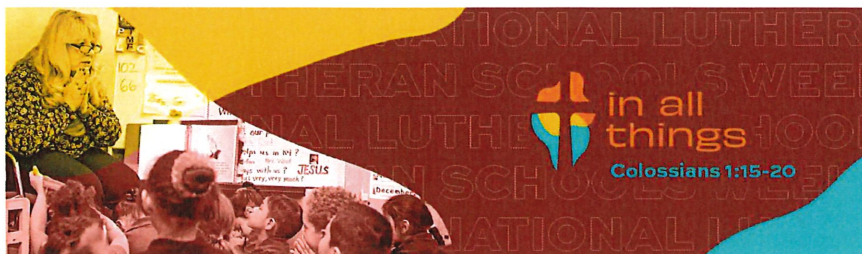

#### **Wednesday, September 1: Confirmation Begins!**

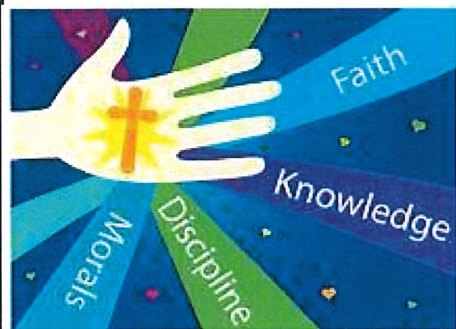

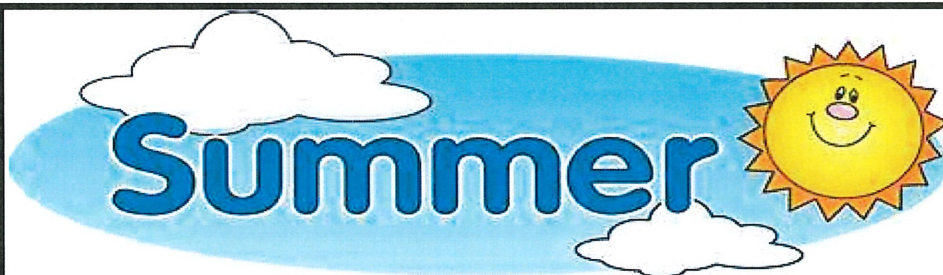

**Note from the Editor:** As I work each day, I often have instrumental music playing in the background. I love to listen to familiar traditional hymns that I can hum along to in my head. Instrumentals give me the freedom to add my own words. Today I have had the tune to "What a Friend We Have in Jesus" going through my mind and I keep coming back to the refrain: take it to the Lord in prayer. Prayer has been on my mind lately. In my relationship with God, it has been it's own journey of growth. As a child my prayers were memorized and repeated nightly. As a teen they were fewer and farther between, but more desperate prayers because I didn't study for a test or lost track of time and had a curfew to meet. As an embattled young wife I fell into the magical genie syndrome of asking for things that I thought would fix a broken marriage. (Lord, if we just had more money we wouldn't fight and everything would be okay.) There were many more growing pains along the way. A life of prayer is challenging. The Apostle Paul tells us to pray without ceasing, but sometimes, I just don't know what to pray for, there are so many things that need prayers. My epiphany came in the opening stanza of the hymn above, What a Friend I have in Jesus. Jesus is my friend, my best friend. He is the friend that I call when I am in pain and I need a good cry. He is the friend I can't wait to tell I had a great day. He is the friend that I trust with the lives of my loved ones. He is the friend who holds me in His loving arms and tells me, "I got this, everything will be as it should be." Prayer is an intimate conversation with my creator, my savior, my spiritual healer, my best friend. May you find your own meaning to the words, What a friend we have in Jesus, and may you find peace and understanding in taking everything to God in prayer. *"do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."* Philippians 4:6-7

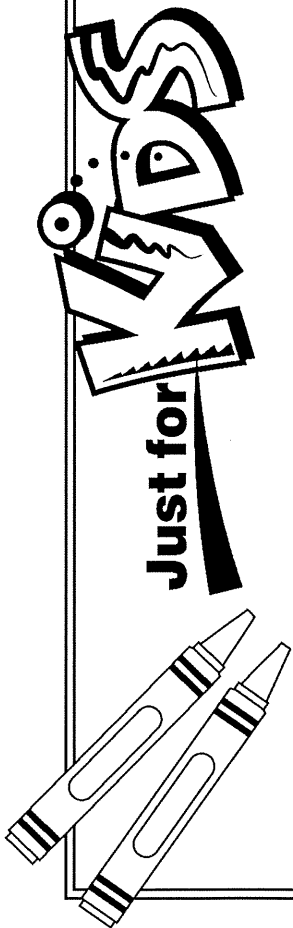

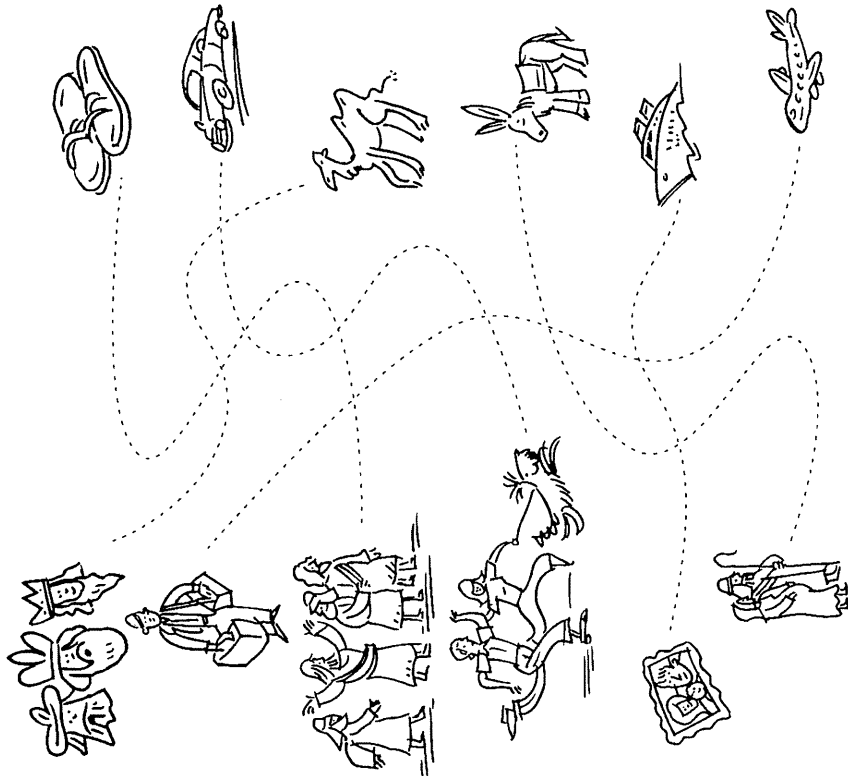
