

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



Greetings in the name of our Risen Lord. Yesterday in worship we sang these words during Holy Communion from a hymn,

"I Am the Bread of Life."

"Yes, Lord, I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, Who has come into the world." Refrain And I will raise you up, and I will raise you up, And I will raise you up on the last day."

At the heart of every congregation's ministry should be this belief. Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God. This was God's love for a fallen world. Christians believe that on the last day, it is Christ who will raise us up to our eternal future with our loving God. While this is at the heart of ministry together, we share a heart condition. We may look quite good on the outside, but internally sin is at work.

Last August Trinity experienced a mild heart attack. Things had been under the surface, we could list them, but like any of us who have experienced a heart attack know, you need to rebuild your strength and become healthier through that process. It takes time and hard work. God led the congregation through a process to bring a pastor into your midst to shepherd you through becoming a healthier congregation. In April God led me to accept the challenge of working with you. My goal is to use the tools God provides to lead you to calling a new shepherd, becoming a stronger body through the process. The reason I accepted this challenge is because I see tremendous potential for Trinity to become a stronger congregation focusing on ministry that God calls you to do together in the Greeley area.

I recently heard someone say, "I wish we would get at moving Trinity to calling a pastor". Truth is, we have begun the process. The first step was interviewing members, willing to share their thoughts. My goal was 30-40 families or members. We had over 50 sign-up and meet with me during May.

Recovering from any serious illness takes time. Together we need a goal, a plan for God to lead you to being a healthier congregation. On June 27 between the two services that morning I will share what I learned from those interviews, outlining a plan for moving forward. I would like to invite all members to listen, to share and to become involved in that process. It is easy to believe that there is something bad when you experience what happened. Truth is, Trinity is stronger than many may think, there is tremendous potential and strong leadership. Yes, it will take work, planning, and sharing. Remember our God is greater than all of us combined, He has a future for you, allow God to lead.

Communicating will be key. I like sharing a monthly thought in the monthly newsletter. This is one way to improve communications. We need to be talking to one another with our concerns, ideas, and goals. Parking lot discussions are common, but real change comes when we talk to, with, one another in meaningful discussions.

I am committed to share the knowledge I have, to learn with you through what we do. I am not an expert, I have training, but I have not done what we will be doing together. You will need to be forgiving when I make mistakes just as I will be forgiving when you make mistakes. That is the ministry of reconciliation. In talking with others, I have a vision for what we can accomplish. We all need a vision. Proverbs reminds us that people without a vision perish. The goal God has laid before us is to deal with the past, live today and plan for a future. This is my goal and prayer as we work together.

5-Part Sermon Series begins June 27

Beginning on Sunday, June 27 Pastor Schnegelberger will focus on five realities that affect congregations as they desire to become healthy. At the heart of these



five realities is the Word of God. As each are part of our life in a congregation, we need a focus on what God has to say about each one.

Here is a breakdown of the five-part series:

June 27 "Resistance to Change" The Gospel does not change but the world in which we live is a changing world in need of hearing the Good News.

July 4 One service at 8:00 a.m. This day will be centered around our National holiday of Independence and is not part of the series.

July 11 "Refining Purpose and Mission" What is the purpose of Trinity Lutheran Church and School. Together a congregation needs to have a vision and mission for where they are going.

July 18 "Exercising Christian Stewardship" Support for doing ministry is at a decline across Christian denominations. At the heart of our purpose and mission is funding what we want to do together.

July 25 "Controversial social issues produce conflict and tensions" There are a number of social issues that demand Christians attention. They can be painful because of a variety of beliefs among the membership. These issues can create strain between relationships of God's people.

August I "Diversity in American society blurs the differences of religious principals"
The idea of denominationalism is under attack. Doctrinal concern for most Americans is on a decline. The church has a challenge to be clear where we are.

As we begin our work together, these challenges will have to be addressed and worked on as a congregation. God's Word challenges each of these realities. Some of these challenges will challenge Trinity's life. Come and consider how God speaks to these.





It started me thinking about all that has happened this last year when the 2020 Pandemic changed the world as we know it. My mind wandered to Trinity. So many things were shut down last year, but through it all God was there and His Holy Spirit was at work in Trinity, bringing new life.
