Note from the Editor: "Forgive and forget". I can't count the number of times my mom told me that when I would complain to her about some fiasco my younger sisters had perpetrated on me or my possessions. Forgiving is hard enough, but forgetting is even harder. How do I know if I have truly forgiven someone for a hurt they have caused? How do I forget? Memories can be one of the most precious gifts that God gives to us when we are separated from those that we love. How can I remember those good times and forget the bad? Don't they intertwine with each other? Recently I was hurt, devastated. Other factors compounded that pain, so I wanted to examine it and find a way to relieve it. I chewed on it, replayed it in my mind, wrestled with it to find a cure. How was I going to move forward? How was this going to be resolved. While talking to a friend, the light bulb came on, it starts with forgiveness. (I love God's timing. He sends me what I need.) I replayed the hurt one more time and this time at specific intervals, I said, I forgive you. The pain lessened, but not the memory. My friend shared an idea. I tried it, and it worked for me. I closed my eyes and imagined I had a box on the table in front of me. Across the table sat Jesus with eyes that looked into my soul. He instructed me to put the pain in the box. I did. He told me to put all my pain into the box. Then He told me to put all my fear in there as well. I was sure that the box would burst at the seams, but it didn't. There was more room, so I kept putting more in. Then He told me to close the lid up tight and give it to Him. As soon as Jesus touched it, it was gone. When I come across something I missed, I get another box and add my pain, my worries, my doubts, anything that comes between Jesus and me. What do you have that you need to put in a box and give to Jesus? May you find that your box is never too full or heavy for Jesus to handle.


