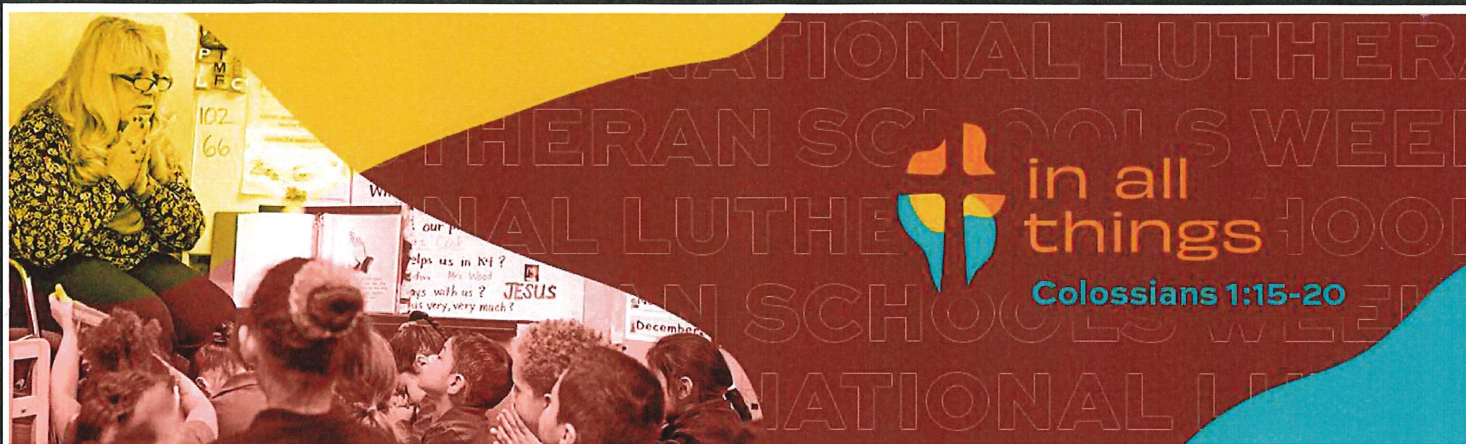

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



Happy New Year! Another year has quickly gone by. What a year it has been for Trinity. At this time last year a committee was interviewing potential candidates for an Intentional Interim Ministry. A call was placed in

January, excitement was in the air, then the end of the month, you received word the pastor had declined the call. The committee went to work once again, but in the middle of the interview process, the pastor Trinity was desiring to call, informed them that after consideration it was not good timing for his family to make a move. During the next few weeks, the committee, leadership, and others explored options, because of the time already invested into Intentional Interim. In March, discussions were held regarding my becoming vacancy, working with other resources to lead the congregation through a process like an intentional interim. In April we agreed to go that route. In May I conducted interviews with as many members as I could. I listened, I heard great stories about ministry here at Trinity. The blessings of God upon this congregation have been many through the years. I listened to God at work in lives, through events, through the school and through worship here in this place.

After I shared my report with the congregation in June, the executive Leadership contracted with Ambassadors of Reconciliation for two seminars. The first on "Spiritual Leadership" was held on October 23. On January 22 Trinity will hold the second seminar entitled "Structuring the Healthy Congregation." These seminars are not just for the leadership, they are designed to guide all members of the congregation on the importance of structure in the life of the body of Christ.

Once the seminar is complete there will be follow-up for the congregation. That will include working through needs from the seminar, vision for the future, and a plan as the congregation prepares to call a pastor. The timetable will depend on where the process leads Trinity. I will try to inform the congregation as we take these next steps. This is going to be a critical time for ministry here at Trinity. Our prayers as a congregation should be lifted before the throne of God to lead us to a healthier place, where Trinity comes together with a focus on ministry for the church, school, and community.

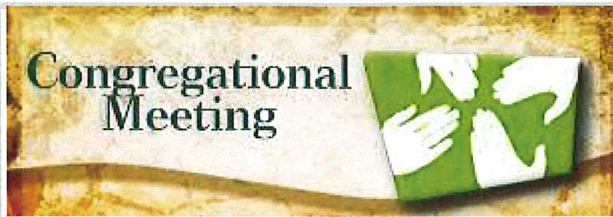

At the same time God is blessing us with new members who desire to be a part of the ministry. God has given us the greatest gift as He sent His Son to be our savior. I pray your season was a time to celebrate with family and friends.

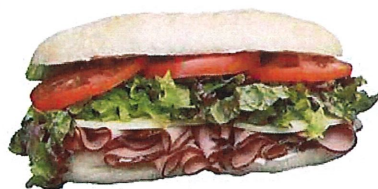

EXECUTIVE COUNCIL MEETING
December 11, 2021

A meeting of the Executive Council of Trinity Lutheran Church and School was held on December 11, 2021, in the narthex lounge. Present were Mike Thuener, Bob Thorgesen, Brenda Schmidt, Pam Clavir, Jason Reiter, Kristen Meritt, Cheri Carsten, and Hank Thuener. A quorum was established. Notice of this meeting was given in advance to all members of the council.

President Mike Thuener called the meeting to order at 8:30 am. Bob Thorgesen opened with prayer. Minutes of the November council meeting were previously approved.

Treasurer's Report: Cheri Carsten, Interim treasurer, presented the current financial report. The report was accepted as presented.

The Board of Elders and Spiritual Ministries: No report.

The Board of Property Ministries: Jason Reiter

Accomplished: The garden has been scraped and prepared for winter; The church was decorated for Christmas on December 27th.

Planned: Taking bids to fill cracks in our parking lots. Seeking two bids before selection of company.

Heating units are being addressed in the second floor of school – not working correctly in quilters room.

Concerns/Decisions: Jason has been trained to manage the school building air handling controller to adjust as needed for school staff.

Board of Christian Education Ministries: Pam Clavir

Have not met since last meeting. Supporting school staff as they adhere to Covid-19 guidance from CDPHE.

The Board of Financial and Stewardship Ministries: Kristen Meritt

Accomplished: Completed Purchase Order draft form for Executive Council approval. Completed draft copy of roles/responsibilities for the Transition team.

Planned: Begin budgeting process for 2021-22 Fiscal year; Complete 1099's and W-2's for 2021

Concerns/Decisions: Have researched options for individuals to make financial donations to our SMP Vicar through our church as a tax deduction. All options are not fully legal and/or require our SMP to report donation as income. Options were presented for discussion.

Old Business:

- SMP donation options: Bob Thorgesen moved that donation options to our SMP Vicar not be offered through the church, rather individuals will be encouraged to give directly or use an online donation link developed by our SMP vicar. Motion seconded by Pam Clavir. Discussion followed. Voted via voice vote. Motion passed by majority (6-1).
- Purchase Order was approved for use as presented with direction given to Finance Board to add a written procedure.
- Transition Team update given by Cheri Carsten. Staff and board members to provide feedback by Friday December 17, 2021, with a goal of having document completed before the January 22, 2022, Ambassadors of Reconciliation seminar.

New Business:

- Connie Mapes and Kristen Meritt will be resigning from the Board of Financial and Stewardship Ministries effective December 31, 2021. They have served in this role for 7 years. Thank-you! Both positions will be added to the slate of vacant officers for elections.
- Rick and Connie Mapes are stepping down from the Script program. Thank-you, too, for your many years of service! The Finance Board will develop a transition plan and present at the January council meeting.
- Regular Voter's Meeting is scheduled for Sunday December 12, 2021, at 11:45 am. Nomination Committee has submitted the slate of nominees.
- The board went into Executive session 10:15. Out of executive session at 10:25 am.

There being no further business to bring before the board, the meeting was adjourned at 10:28 am. Mike Thuener closed with prayer. Next regular Council meeting January 8, 2022, at 8:30 a.m.

2022 OFFERING ENVELOPES –are here! Numbers have changed, **so please do not use** the 2022 envelopes until Sunday, January 3rd or your contributions may not be credited correctly to **YOUR** account.



Did you know: if you **do not** mark your giving envelope, all monies go into the “General Fund”. If you write an amount in on the line for either Missions or Building Fund, those monies are accumulated and at the end of each calendar month, distributed accordingly.

Did you know: those who mark their envelopes with amounts for Missions allow Trinity to send nearly \$10K per year to the Rocky Mountain District for the missions selected.

Did you know: that when you write an amount in the Building Fund space on your giving envelope, that those monies are deposited in our LCEF Building Fund each month. An average month can total more than \$1000.00. This money will be used for unexpected emergencies if they arise, but mostly it will go towards the balloon payment that will be due on the mortgage at the end of twenty years on our loan.

To recap:

- *Current Expenses: goes to paying our bills, water, electric , insurance, gas, salaries, etc.
- *Missions: goes directly to Rocky Mountain District for District named missions
- *Building Fund: is deposited in the LCEF Building Fund for emergencies.

We give because God first gave to us! Everything we have, everything we are, are gifts from God.

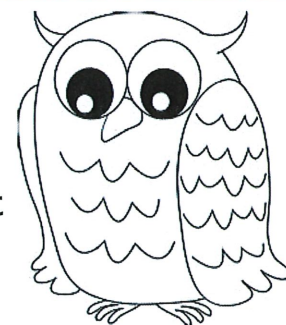
