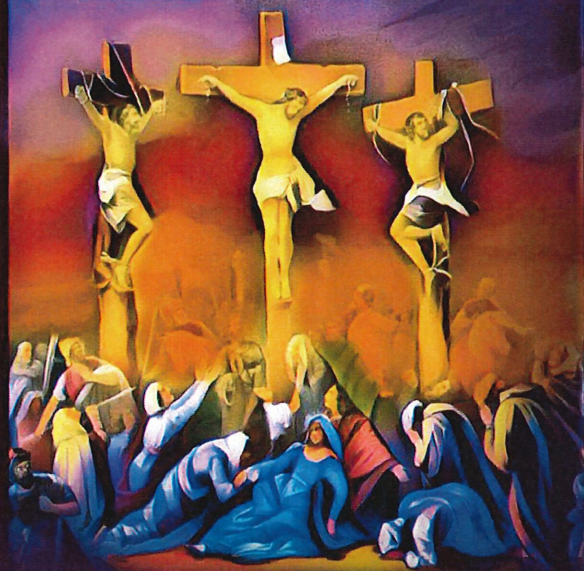

WITNESSES TO CHRIST: PEOPLE FROM HIS PASSION

John tells us why he wrote his Gospel: “Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in His name” (John 20:30–31). Life! When we believe that Jesus is the Christ, God gives us life—abundant life, forgiven life, and eternal life.

Historically, the Fourth Gospel is likened to an eagle—an image that suggests John soars to heights of glory and grandeur. That's because the evangelist paints a stunning portrait of Jesus, who is the bread of life, the resurrection and the life, and the way, the truth, and the life. Life in Jesus. That's God's gift to you!

This Lent, our life in Christ will be strengthened as we hear the witness of those in John's Gospel who journeyed to the cross. Along the way, we'll meet villains, such as Barabbas and Pontius Pilate, as well as sinners, such as Peter (who denied Jesus *three* times), Mary Magdalene (who was possessed by *seven* demons), and Judas Iscariot (who betrayed Jesus for *thirty* pieces of silver).

The first Sunday of each month the Mite box will be available for you to bring your Mites. (suggestion put your coins in a zip lock bag - keep your mite box).


EASTER LOVE OFFERING-

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

What a whirlwind since Christmas, doesn't seem possible that two months have gone by. When I was planning after Christmas, I thought this is great we have extra weeks in Epiphany. As I write this, we are preparing to make the journey through the forty days of Lent, then Holy Week and the Easter season. Advent, Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, Holy Week, and Easter are at the center of the Gospel message. Ken Streeb will play at the 10:00 a.m.

At this writing the Executive Board, elders and staff will be meeting to outline the next few months as Trinity prepares what is needed for calling a pastor. During the coming months members are encouraged to be a part of the preparations. The more members involved the stronger Trinity will be.

Notice of this meeting was given in advance to all members of the council.

President Mike Thuener called the meeting to order at 8:35 am. Ken Clavir opened with prayer. Minutes of the January council meeting were not yet completed and will be approved by members via email following this meeting.

Treasurer's Report: Cheri Carsten, Interim treasurer, provided the current financial report to members via email prior to this meeting. The report was accepted as presented.

The Board of Elders and Spiritual Ministries: Ken Clavir

- Welcomed newly appointed elder Larry Whitney. Still have open elder positions to fill.
- DCE Angela Ericksen reported on her ongoing professional continuing education.
- Have prepared budget to submit to treasurer.
- Approved upcoming Lent and Easter services (dates and times) with input from Pastor.
- Approved time off for Pastor Schnegelberger with guest speakers in place.
- Bible Studies will resume with Larry Whitney and Lance Polzin on February 20, 2022. Pastor Schnegelberger's study will resume February 27, 2022.
- Planning Elder's retreat to review and rewrite the Elders Policy manual.

The Board of Property Ministries: Jason Reiter

- Completed project of filling parking lot cracks using Scrip card income.
- Preparing budget to submit to treasurer.
- Reviewing pricing on LED lights for school gym.
- Working with Principal Ericksen to have school parents mow our property to fulfill their volunteer hours.
- Beginning study of energy use with Excel Energy to assure greatest savings.

- Projected increase in enrollment preschool thru 8th grade.
- Early Childhood director Ms. Marshall has secured two grants: \$5000.00 grant through Colorado Shines to purchase new cots and cubbies. \$82,000.00 from COVID funds to be spent in specific ways through 2023.
- Washington DC trip has been postponed due to Covid concerns.
- Developing 5-year plan for school music program.

The Board of Financial and Stewardship Ministries:

- Welcomed Debbie Thuener as newly appointed member of the Finance Board.

Old Business

1. Scrip program transition plan being developed.
2. Brenda Schmidt and Linda Klipp will plan a special recognition of Rick and Connie Mapes for their dedication to this program.

New Business:

1. Voter's Assembly Meeting scheduled for Sunday, March 27, 2022, at 11:45 am. Agenda: Presentation and approval of Budget, Board Reports, Pastor's Report, and Transition Update.
2. Motion by Jason Reiter and second by Ken Clavir to allow Hopes Lives Counseling/Angela Riemer to occasionally use church office space in accordance with the Church Facility Use Policy. Discussion followed. Motion carried by voice vote.
3. Church/School Key Policy: The Executive Council recognizes the need for more specific guidance on who and when to distribute keys. Jason Reiter and Mike Thuener will develop a policy and bring back to the March council meeting.

There being no further business to bring before the board, the meeting was adjourned at 10:18 am. Pastor Schnegelberger closed with prayer.

School Happenings

Preschool & K-8

Trinity Family,

We had a rocky start to 2022. After the Christmas break we had a wide range of ailments that took both students and teachers out temporarily. We seem to be getting back into the rhythm of things and have been blessed with five new preschool students in the last six weeks. We are almost back to our pre-COVID enrollment (40 students) with 37 current preschool students. Praise the Lord!

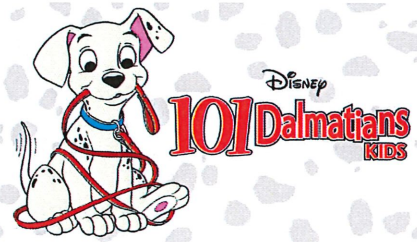
March begins with the end of the second trimester and parent teacher conferences. A good time for teachers to share with parents the progress their child has made this school year and what they still need to complete in order to move on to the next grade. We have five eighth grade students that we expect to graduate this May!



Spring break is March 14 through the 19th. There will not be any classes for the preschool or K-8. However, we will still provide childcare for our working parents. Our demographics have changed in recent years and we now have approximately 60% of our preschool students staying for before and after care. Pray that it is an uneventful spring break this year; the past three have been bomb cyclone, covid shut-down and blizzard. While we will still have childcare in the building during spring break, we need some days of relaxation and time to recharge batteries, as we get ready for the home stretch to finish off another school year.

Watch your bulletin and future newsletters for details of spring events, including an eighth-grade graduation service and a spring musical. We also pray for good weather as we plan for a field day and bike day.

We have started the re-enrollment process, but we also need to seek more students from the community. The spring months are a prime time for recruitment. We should have room in many of our elementary classes and we always need to restock the three-year-old preschool class. Keep referring friends and families to Trinity.



Trinity qualified to receive funds through the state Childcare Stabilization & Workforce Sustainability Grant to use for preschool and childcare (you may have seen this program on the news last month). We will receive funds for the next 9 months to spend for 3 purposes: financial assistance to families, materials/upgrades to improve classroom health & safety and funds for staff training/incentives. We are truly blessed that we have had minimal staff turnover during the time of Covid; many other childcare programs are struggling. The other funds will also allow us to do some long-awaited upgrades. Through all the headaches covid caused, it also brought us some opportunities that weren't even on the horizon. It's another story of how God can work in all things to bring blessings to His people and the ministry in this place.
