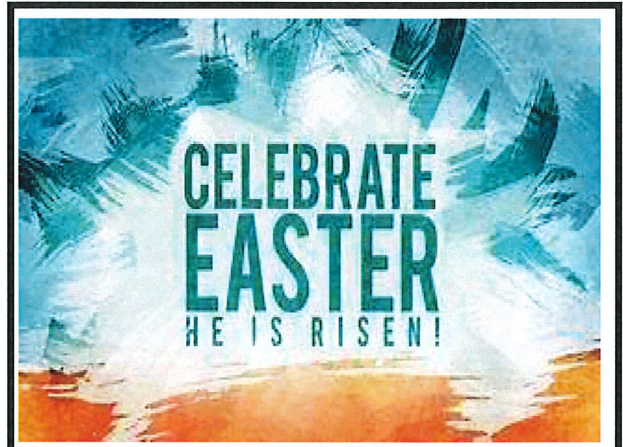

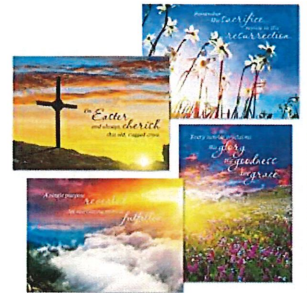

### **MITE SUNDAY, April 3rd**

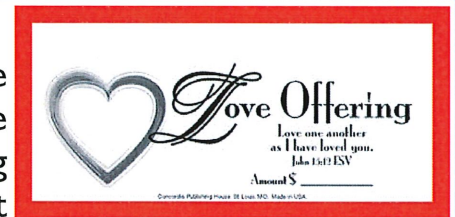
The first Sunday of each month the Mite box will be available for you to bring your Mites. (suggestion put your coins in a zip lock bag - keep your mite box).

### **EASTER LOVE OFFERING-**

Every year around this time, the Easter Love Offering Envelope shows up in our box of giving envelopes. These envelopes are designed as an additional giving envelope, a gift of "Love" during the Lent Season. It is at this time that we are reminded just how much we are loved by our Heavenly Father. Loved so much, that He sent His One and Only Son, Jesus Christ to pay the price for our sins by laying down His life on the cross. He became the ultimate sacrifice, His blood the atonement for our sins.



Each year, these envelopes are collected by the LWML ladies who choose a project to direct these offerings towards. Over the past years, the LWML has used the Easter Love Offerings to: refurbish the kitchen in the Church Fellowship Hall; to cover a large portion on the cost of reupholstering the pews in our sanctuary; provide extra money for the completion of the finishing of the second floor of the school. Last year they began a fund to replace the hardware on the front doors of the church and your generosity got them half way there.

This year the LWML is again dedicating the Easter Love Offerings to the work on the front doors of the church. Bids were gathered, quotes approved, and the down payment made. Once the parts arrive, the work will get underway. The amount needed to complete this project is \$7000.00 Please prayerfully consider giving to this worthwhile project. ## FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



*As I set down to write, we are completing the midpoint of Lent. How quickly this time of year goes. Preparing and sharing this series has been a real joy for me. God has gifted Dr. Lessing as he puts one of these series together. Yes, there is work, but the*

*thoughts and ideas are tremendous helps. It has been heart -warming to see many members from Trinity participating in these worship services. These witnesses to Christ will be the theme in all our Holy Week services too, including Palm Sunday.*

*The Gospel of John is likened to an eagle, soaring to tremendous heights as the reader approaches the cross, death, and resurrection of Christ. John in writing this Gospel wants the reader to see the signs and witnesses that confirm the faith of the believer.*

*During Holy Week the tomb will be placed in the sanctuary and will remain there through the season of Easter. This is a beautiful reminder of the empty tomb, giving us hope and the assurance of life, not just in this world, but in that which is to come. Thank you for those who designed and put this up each year.*

*We are trying to put together a choir for Holy Week and Easter. Zach Ewald has agreed to direct, we just need people to join, come to rehearsal so we can have a choir on Easter. If you are a singer, please consider being a part. Once again we are putting together a variety of music for these special services.*

*On Good Friday there will be a midday service at noon. The theme will be on John, the Gospel writer, as we approach the cross. At the Tenebrae Service we will have Holy Communion. Distribution will be continuous rather than at the rail. Opportunity will be given for the worshiper to reflect upon their sins, a part of why Christ suffered and died in our place. This will be a service of darkness, again, reminding the worshiper of the darkness of our sins. Services on Good Friday are at 12:00 p.m. and the Tenebrae is at 6:30 p.m.*

*Easter will begin with the Sunrise Service at 6:00 a.m. There will be three services that day. Following the Sunrise Service, youth will be serving breakfast downstairs. The second and third services will be at 8:30 and 10:30 a.m. Holy Communion will be available at all services during Holy Week.*

*During the Easter season we will be doing a series on Christian Stewardship. The budget will come before the congregation the end of March and the new fiscal year begins on July 1. Too often we think about Stewardship being about money. Stewardship involves all our responses to God for all He has done for us. We want to talk about the use of our time, talents, and our money. More information will be coming in the weeks ahead.*

A meeting of the Executive Council of Trinity Lutheran Church and School was held on March 12, 2022, in the narthex lounge. Notice of this meeting was given in advance to all members of the council.

Vice President Bob Thorgesen called the meeting to order at 8:45 am. Pastor Schnegelberger opened with prayer. Minutes of the February council meeting were previously approved via email.

**Treasurer's Report:** Cheri Carsten, Interim treasurer, provided the current financial report via email prior to this meeting. Pam Clavir moved that they be accepted as presented. Seconded by Linda Klipp. Discussion. Approved by voice vote.

**The Board of Elders and Spiritual Ministries:** Ken Clavir

- DCE Angela Ericksen reported that "Flamingos" will soon be here for a youth fund raiser. Arrangements are being made for the National Youth Gathering this summer. Fund raising is going well. Christy Kunze has stepped down from being the Sunday School Superintendent. Amanda Thuener has accepted the position.
- Easter Service Times are scheduled for 6:00 am, 8:30 am, and 10:30 am.
- Approved paid advertisements for Holy Week and Easter services.
- A sub-committee has been established to review the Elder's policy manual for the Three Board Model.

**The Board of Property Ministries:** Jason Reiter (sent to meeting via email).

- Les worked with Xcel Energy to do a study on what we can do to reduce our energy costs.
- TC's Lighting has donated new LED light bulbs for the entire school gymnasium after Kevin Knief reached out to them for pricing.
- Workdays will be scheduled on the 1<sup>st</sup> Saturday of the Month (weather permitting) April through Fall.
- Asked Debi to reach out to Weld County Elections to see if they will increase their donations when they use our facilities.
- Reviewed the finalized budget.

- Revamped structure of meetings based on the Ambassadors of Reconciliation guides resulting in more prayer time and efficient meetings.
- 2022-2023 School Calendar has been approved.
- Early Registration for EC-8<sup>th</sup> grade is complete.
- Grants have been received for K-8 and ECC to be used for specific Covid related costs.
- Council asked that the expectations around spending these grants be presented at the March 27<sup>th</sup> Voter's Assembly meeting.

- Working on weekly offering report and annual giving chart.

3. 2022-2023 Budget presented by Treasurer Cheri Carsten. Full budget sent to council for review 2 weeks prior to meeting. "Presentation Budget" for Voter's Assembly meeting March 27, 2022, reviewed. Brenda Schmidt moved that both budgets formats be accepted and approved as presented. Motion seconded by Linda Klipp. Discussion. Motion carried by voice vote.

There being no further business to bring before the board, the meeting was adjourned at 9:45 am. The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer. Next regular Council meeting April 9, 2022, at 8:30 a.m.

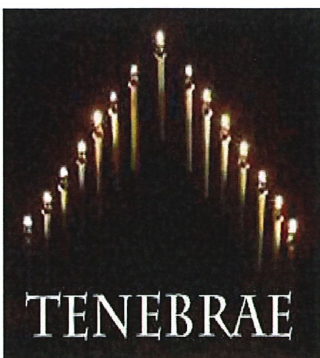
***Holy (MAUNDY) Thursday      April 14***

***Good Friday      April 15***

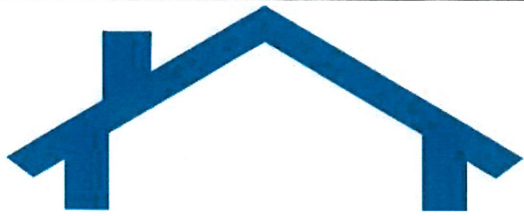

**6:30 p.m.** *Holy Communion is celebrated.* Our journey to follow Christ through witnesses to Christ here arrives at the cross. Tonight, we view Christ on the cross through the author’s eyes—John, the Apostle and Evangelist, the beloved disciple, the son of Zebedee and the brother of James. By John’s witness, we view Jesus beaten and bloodied. We hear His words of forgiveness and fulfillment. We see Jesus shed His blood for the life of the world. As we sing and pray and sit in silence this evening, we ponder Christ’s love for us. We marvel at the gifts of forgiveness and salvation He has given us, for we have been clothed by the blood of Christ.
