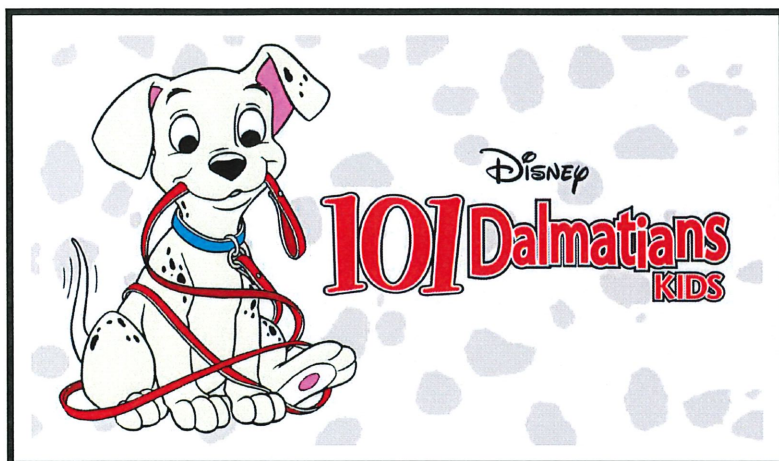

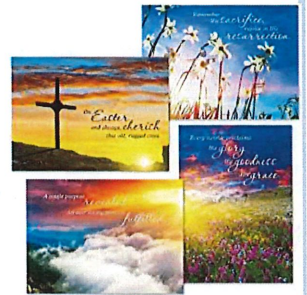



FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

By the time you read this, we will be in the Easter season. This season lasts for fifty days until the day of Pentecost. Forty days into the season our Lord ascended back into heaven. Easter will be in the rearview mirror. The Lenten and Holy Week journey was a special time. The witnesses we encountered

always pointed us to Christ. He should be at the center when we give witness as well. There were so many involved with making this happen. I would love to list them all, but in doing so I know I would miss someone. Every week there was more food than we could consume at the soup luncheons and suppers. Many wonderful cooks at Trinity. Attendance was very good throughout the series. It was special to have the upper grades in the school attend the morning Lenten services.

Jeff Junker, Dan Swanson and the rest of the sound team are a tremendous asset to Trinity. Larry Whitney has been there to do whatever throughout my time as vacancy pastor. Debi in the office and those who assist her are dedicated, work hard so that all of the resources are there when we worship. When we come together for worship, there are many things happening behind the service, people donating time and talents. The church cleaner Angela was there doing the job of clean-up through all the season and after every service in Holy Week. To everyone who contributed I want to say thank you because you made this a special time for the worshiper and for me.

Leadership with the assistance of other members are working to present to the congregation a structure that can be helpful as you move forward. The constitution committee is using our present constitution with the sample one to create a document that should work to the advantage of the congregation, retaining much of what we have. The elders, church council, and school board are working to align with the three-board model of doing business in the church. All of this work will make it possible for Trinity to begin the calling process in the coming months.

The tomb is empty, praise be to God! He is Risen! Alleluia! These are the words of an Easter people. This is the good news we share in our worship, our homes, our work, and our community. Satan has been defeated, we need not fear death, sin continues to be a part of our lives, all of these have been overcome. When you view the empty cross, remember the Lamb of God. Sunday, May 8th is an important day, as is June 19th. Both dates mark not only a celebration of moms and dads, but also, the beginning and end of the annual Baby Bottle fundraiser. This very important campaign enables The Resource Center to continue to provide Christian direction to women who may or may not be pregnant. Their ministry serves both Greeley and Windsor areas.

As of the writing of this article, The Resource Center has had the following successes since the beginning of the year:

- 522 clients have been served
- Shared the gospel 310 times
- 29 Passover babies saved
- 16 Salvations have occurred.

This ministry is even more important now that Colorado has a law that takes away all human rights from the unborn. Last year our congregation raised \$2615 of the \$142,735 total for the campaign. Let's try to surpass this amount. Please look for the baby bottles display beginning on May 8th and prayerfully consider giving to this worthwhile campaign!

As we prepare for the summer months, we do have a couple of prayer requests.

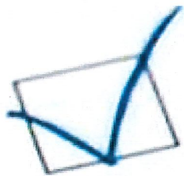
First, our middle school teacher, LeAnn Williams, will be moving back to Oklahoma this summer. We are scheduling interviews for possible candidates to take her position.

HIGHLIGHTS

from the March Quarterly Voters Meeting.

- ◆ All Boards made their quarterly reports. Working with the Transition Team, Boards are updating and editing the constitution, bylaws as well as developing policies. These changes will be presented to the congregation in upcoming months. Leadership is proposing a three-board option to the congregation.
- ◆ The proposed 2022-2023 budget was presented and discussion ensued. A motion was made to accept the budget. A call was made for a written ballot. Ballots were counted and passed 41 to 3. The approved budget will go into effect on July 1st, 2022.
- ◆ Ken Clavir was nominated and accepted the position of Lay Delegate to the Rocky Mountain Convention June 9-10, 2022.
