Staff and students need that quiet to reflect on the successes and failures of another school year to come back in the fall ready to make Trinity an even better school. Staff need the quiet for peace and healing. We seemed to go through an unprecedented amount of tragedy and heartbreak in the lives of our staff members this year. But in all those successes and failures and victories and heartbreaks, Jesus is "In All Things." It was a great theme for the 2021-22 school year. As we reflect in this quiet time, we see His hand holding us up in our weak moments, empowering us to be bold when courage was needed and feeling His love working through the congregation, staff, students and families as we cared for and served each other.



### CHILD CARE

Our summer childcare class will make sure that even if it is quiet in the building, it won't be dull! We will have one classroom with ages 3-5 from June 1 until August 12. Mrs. Ewald and Miss Jadyn will share the classroom assistant position so that we always have 2 staff people in the building.

The elementary is recruiting another teacher for fall since LeAnn Williams won't be returning. We wish her God's richest blessings as she moves back to Oklahoma, and returns to teaching in the public school setting. Our K-8 Trinity staff will be shifting roles a bit, leaving us with a 2<sup>nd</sup> grade teaching position to fill.

Sunday, May 8th is an important day, as is June 19th. Both dates mark not only a celebration of moms and dads, but also, the beginning and end of the annual Baby Bottle fundraiser. This very important campaign enables The Resource Center to continue to provide Christian direction to women who may or may not be pregnant. Their ministry serves both Greeley and Windsor areas.

As of the writing of this article, The Resource Center has had the following successes since the beginning of the year:

- 522 clients have been served
- Shared the gospel 310 times
- 29 Passover babies saved
- 16 Salvations have occurred.

This ministry is even more important now that Colorado has a law that takes away all human rights from the unborn. Last year our congregation raised \$2615 of the \$142,735 total for the campaign. 



**Note from the Editor:** Somewhere I heard the phrase: “In nature, things are either growing or dying.” I think that is true of a lot of things. It’s true in relationships with family, friends and acquaintances. It’s especially true in a relationship with God, if it isn’t growing, it’s dying. Relationships, like gardens, needs tending. The weeds of sin and doubt need to be pulled up daily before they can take root and rob the Spirit of the nutrients it needs to survive and flourish. On my walk with God, adjustments have been made over time, to produce a greater yield of fruit. Reading God’s Word waters the Spirit and makes the weed pulling more efficient. Did I water the Spirit by reading God’s Word? Have pulled all the weeds and pruned the things that keep me from having a healthy, strong relationship? I would like say I have mastered gardening. I haven’t. But with my whole heart I seek to know God more and strive to be a master gardener and that is as good as Miracle Grow. May your relationship with God continue to grow and be fruitful, always.



However, for one in four children in Weld County, summer is one of the most difficult times of the year. When school is in session, these children depend on school meals to get the nutrition they need to thrive. Once mid-May arrives, those meals are gone and being able to eat every day is a question. Weld Food Bank works to alleviate the pressures of hunger on the entire family. Through their Summer Feeding Program, they tackle hunger both during the week and on the weekend. Last summer, the Feeding Program served 97,826 combined meals and snacks.
