# FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

When this newsletter reaches the membership, school will be back in session, confirmation will be beginning for another year, Sunday School will be kicking off, a men's retreat is in the works and plans for worship in the fall will be moving forward. Hard

to be thinking about Reformation, All Saints Day, Advent and Christmas, yet, none of this just happens. There is a need for discussions, planning, and ideas to be shared. There are considerations for the church and school, so they compliment one another as we do ministry. Over the past six months the leadership has been working together for structure that assists us to do ministry. A great deal of meetings, discussions, rewriting, have taken place. Following the January workshop on being a healthy congregation, energy was generated, and people saw value in refining the structure in place here at Trinity. This is a congregational process, while committees were formed and they have worked in certain areas, the congregation needs to better understand where all of this is going.

The theme for the new school year is "Making Disciples." The theme verse is the great commission of the church. This ought to be the theme of everything we do. This theme is not just for the school, but for ministry together as the people of God. Word and sacrament ministry guides us to touch lives with the message of the Gospel, recognizing the importance of confession and forgiveness in all that we do. Every individual born into this world has been given life through the creator. Yet, our sinful nature struggles with the reality of God's grace for His fallen creation. In every conflict of life, there are issues of the heart. It can be easy to point to evil in the world, it is difficult to address in a God pleasing way because of our self-centered nature. Thus, the cross of Christ ought to be at the center of our ministry together. What Christ accomplished on the cross, addresses all the issues of life because Christ took sin, death, and the power of the Devil, defeating them so that we might have life in His name.

Yes, two years have gone by, for some of you there is impatience, why so long to call a new pastor? The process offered may seem unreasonable. Truth is, this time has been an opportunity to consider where you have been, where you are and think about where you want to go under the direction of God working through the Holy Spirit. Leadership has been working hard, even though it may seem like little is happening. Issues have been addressed, discussions and concerns are being worked on. While leadership has been taking the lead, the next step involves the entire membership. A healthy congregation discusses together what are our expectations as we call a shepherd to lead us. It is important that the entire congregation has a say. As individual members you have expectations, some of those are very important, but so does every other member. When all members are asked to be a part, you will find those expectations that rise to the top for all of you. You will be able to evaluate that some of your expectations are realistic, others may be unrealistic. Every congregation wants the perfect pastor, yet, in calling you call men, who are not perfect, they have a variety of gifts, and they serve the same God, but each one will come with flaws. That is why ministry together is important. Rejoice in the strengths of the man you call and encourage and support him in areas where his gifts are not as strong. Remember it is the same Lord, the same Spirit, the same God who works through all in the congregation to touch lives with the message of the Gospel, the forgiveness that covers all of you, and the grace God richly pours out. Ministry is imperfect people sharing the Good News of Christ with imperfect people, St Paul in 2 Corinthians 5:14-15 (ESV) says: "14 For the love of Christ controls us, because we have concluded this: that one has died for all, therefore all have died; 15 and he died for all, that those who live might no longer live for themselves but for him who for their sake died and was raised." Later he states: "17 Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come. <sup>18</sup> All this is from God, who through Christ reconciled us to himself and gave us the ministry of reconciliation; 19 that is, in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting to us the message of reconciliation." St. Paul then concludes this section with: " 20 Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, God making his appeal through us. We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. <sup>21</sup> For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God." As you begin moving forward to call a shepherd consider the importance of all of God's people, so that with one voice, you may call a man of God to be your pastor, praying for him, supporting him, and walking with him making disciples, sharing the ministry of reconciliation.

# School Happenings



Trinity Brothers and Sisters,

I'm writing this the day before the 2022-23 school year begins. Usually, our newsletter talks about school happenings, but I feel there is more that I **don't** know than I **do** know right now. We will have at least one new-to-Trinity student in each classroom. Since I teach the littlest ones, almost all of my class is new. Over my decades of teaching I've learned that no matter how prepared you are, the dynamics of that group of children may cause you to toss those plans out the window.

At our prayer retreat yesterday, Kyle talked about how we don't know what this year will be. In August 2019, we would never have thought that the school would shut down in March for a pandemic. When we were stocking up on masks and gloves and cleaning supplies to start up again in August 2020, we didn't foresee that the thing we needed to buy in bulk was baptismal cards! We witnessed 11 members of the school community come to the font during that school year. Last fall, we would never have foreseen that over the course of 15 months three fourths of the staff would experience the death of a loved one. What will 2022-23 bring . . .

But in these experiences, there are things we COULD count on. I loved last year's theme of "In All Things". In life and death, mourning and celebration, prosperity and struggles our God never forsakes us and uses all circumstances to work for our good and to draw us closer to Him. He also used these experiences to strengthen our staff as a group.

I love this year's theme, too, as it gets to the heart of who we are and why Trinity is here. We are making disciples for life. We do this by proclaiming God's Word at every opportunity. We are sowing the seed recklessly and abundantly like the farmer in the parable. Not all seed will take root – the Holy Spirit sees to that part of the work – and often it takes a while for the seed to grow and we don't get to witness it. One of the things Lutheran schools do well is to share God's Word throughout the school day and provide witnesses to live out the faith in our classroom staff.

"For life" is important in a couple ways. We want the faith that develops in the lives of these children and their families to continue to grow throughout their lifetime. That growing faith may lead some of our students to consider a career as a pastor or teacher in a Lutheran congregation and school – and we need a new generation of those. I also look at the "for life" from the angle of many of our families do not know Jesus and are not living the abundant life He promised to His followers NOW. We share God's Word to have them experience that abundant life on this earth and forever in heaven.

Again, we ask for your prayers and thank you for your support and encouragement.
